

CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF AMERICA COLLECTION SEPT- 6 & 7



Liturgy of the Day:

This weekend we recognize and honor all those who work. There is a dignity in work no matter how humble the task or job may seem or whether it is paid or not, and all who work or who are looking for work are celebrated on Labor Day. As we gather today around the table of the Lord, we hear Jesus teach guests also gathered around a banquet table of the importance of humility. May we approach both our work and the eucharistic table with humility, recognizing God's grace in making us worthy of both.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

The virtue of humility is extolled throughout today's readings. Sirach teaches, "Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God" (Sirachs 3:18). The psalmist writes that God makes a home for the poor, orphans, widows, prisoners, and the forsaken. Though not directly mentioning humility, the author of Hebrews alludes to the signs of the old and new covenants, which leave us humbled. Finally, Jesus teaches the Pharisees that God exalts those who humble themselves. May God's word inspire us to embrace humility.

Reflection:

Have you ever given something or helped someone in their time of need and then later complained that they did not seem to appreciate what you had done for them? Such a feeling is a sign that what you did was really for yourself and you really don't deserve any thanks. When we give, it should not be in order to receive a reward of any kind – not even gratitude. We are only doing what we should as good disciples. In fact, the more quietly and anonymously we can help others the better. We should never feel indebted to us. How freely do you give others?

Conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts. -Sirach 3:17
