"Pray Always Without Becoming Weary"

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C) Luke 18:1–8

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells His disciples a parable "about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary." These words go straight to the heart of Christian discipleship. Prayer is not simply something we do when we need something from God—it is the very foundation of our relationship with Him. The more time we spend with God in prayer, the more we begin to understand His ways, His will, and His deep love for us.

We pray because we are believers. Prayer is our acknowledgment that we are not self-sufficient. It is our recognition of our limitations and our dependence on God's grace. As Christians, we pray as disciples of the Lord—imitating Jesus, who prayed constantly to the Father. Every time we pray, we are offering an act of worship. When we gather as a community in prayer, we are united in Christ's love, lifting our hearts together before God.

Prayer also springs from our human vulnerability. In our weakness, prayer gives us strength; in our fear, prayer gives us courage; in our sinfulness, prayer opens us to forgiveness. It is the anchor that keeps our hearts rooted in hope.

Among the many forms of prayer, the Church gives us the great treasures of the Holy Mass and Eucharistic Adoration. Yet after these, one of the most powerful and time-honored prayers is the Rosary, especially in this month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary.

The Rosary, as we know it today, developed through centuries of devotion. Tradition holds that the Blessed Mother appeared to St. Dominic in the 13th century, giving him the Rosary as a weapon of faith against evil. Throughout history, this prayer has been a source of miraculous victories and deep spiritual renewal.

One of the most notable moments came in 1571 at the Battle of Lepanto, when Christian forces of the Holy League faced the powerful Ottoman fleet. Against overwhelming odds, the Christian navy achieved victory—a triumph attributed to the faithful throughout Europe praying the Rosary for Our Lady's intercession. This event was so significant that Pope Pius V established the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, later known as Our Lady of the Rosary, in thanksgiving for God's protection through Mary's prayers.

Centuries later, at Fatima, Portugal in 1917, Our Lady again appeared to three shepherd children and urged the world to "pray the Rosary every day for peace." Her message remains as urgent today as it was then: the world is in need of prayer, and the peace of Christ begins in the heart that prays.

So, as we continue through this month of the Rosary, may we renew our commitment to prayer—at home, in the parish, and in our daily lives—so that our faith may be strengthened and our hearts always turned toward God. Please consider joining our Filipino Catholic Club in praying the rosary every afternoon at St. Catherine's Church.

Liturgy of the Day:

Many athletes can tell you how important stamina is to their success. In the closing minutes of a game, it can often come down to who still has the energy to do their best. Often our faith requires stamina as well. Beaten down by tragedies and disappointments, is our faith strong enough to enable us to persist in loving God and loving neighbor, to pursue justice and peace, to continue to build the kingdom? May hope, which we celebrate this Jubilee Year, sustain our stamina to the end of our days.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

The first reading transports us back to Moses time, to a battle in which Moses' stamina was gravely tested. In the second reading, Paul encourages Timothy to be persistent in spreading the Good News. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches his disciples the importance of praying persistently, to keep their faith continually petitioning God for justice. May we take to heart the words we sing in the psalm today: "Our help is from the Lord."

Reflection:

It is ironic that, often, it is the "unbeliever" who is the example of compassion and charity while many "Christians" seek vengeance and condemn those who have not "been saved" or who behave in ways they deem inappropriate. As disciples, we are called to imitate Jesus and respond to others as he would. While it is easier to find the faults in others, our challenge is to discover the good in others and treat everyone with respect and compassion.
