NOVEMBER 30TH – FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Advent is a season of preparation for Christmas in the Catholic Church, observed during the four weeks leading up to December 24th. It is a time of prayer and reflection, focusing on the "comings" of Christ: his birth at Christmas, his presence in the Church, and his eventual second coming. Key practices include lighting an Advent wreath, wearing purple vestments to signify both penitence and royalty, and observing specific readings and liturgical themes of hope, peace, joy, and love.

What Advent is about

- •Hope and anticipation: The season is a time to reflect on the hope for the Savior's coming, both to celebrate his birth and to prepare for his second coming.
- •The "comings" of Christ: It acknowledges Jesus's past arrival at Christmas, his ongoing presence in the Church, and his future return.
- •Spiritual preparation: Catholics focus on prayer, reflection, and a spirit of penitence, similar to Lent, to prepare their hearts for Christmas.
- •The colors of Advent have symbolic meanings: purple represents penance, preparation, and royalty; pink (or rose) signifies joy, and is used on the third Sunday (Gaudete Sunday); and white re-presents purity, hope, and the celebration of Christ. In some traditions, a blue candle is used for hope, and a green or gold candle can symbolize faith or love, respectively.

Feast of St. Catherine of Alexandria

November 25 - St. Catherine of Alexandria Parish, Kapa'a

Over these past weeks on pilgrimage through Portugal and Italy, one grace kept surprising me: St. Catherine of Alexandria kept finding me. Twice — entirely by chance — I wandered into shrines and chapels dedicated to our parish's patroness. And in each encounter, I felt the Lord reminding me that the saints walk with us far more closely than we recognize.

One of the most moving moments came inside the Sistine Chapel. As I stood beneath Michelangelo's breathtaking Last Judgment, surrounded by the stories of salvation and the drama of eternity, my eyes were drawn to a powerful figure — a woman of fierce strength, gripping the broken wheel of her martyrdom as if ready to defend every soul entrusted to her.

It was St. Catherine of Alexandria.

Michelangelo depicts her not as delicate or timid, but as robust, muscular, and intensely alive — a warrior of faith. Her posture is one

of battle: not violence, but a courageous fight for the salvation of souls. Seeing her painted in such strength stirred something deep. In that moment I realized: This is the woman who watches over our parish -This is the saint who intercedes for Kapa'a, for Kīlauea, for Hanalei. - This is the patroness who fights for us.

A Heritage Rooted in Mission

Our parish story is woven with the same resilience and missionary zeal that defined Catherine's life.

In 1864, a small church dedicated to St. Maxime was built near the Hanalei Pier, serving as the heart of Catholic life for the North and East Shores. When the population shifted toward the plantation community of Kīlauea, Catholic families carried their faith with them. Even after St. Maxime's was demolished in the 1930s, Mass and catechism continued in homes across Hanalei, Wainiha, and Hā'ena — proof that the Church lives wherever the faithful gather.

These mission churches, along with our parish of St. Catherine of Alexandria, are built on generations of perseverance, sacrifice, and prayer. Their history echoes the courage of our patroness — a woman who stood before emperors, defended her faith, and gave her life for Christ.

A Saint for Our Time

St. Catherine of Alexandria remains a powerful witness for today's world:

- *Her intellect reminds us that faith seeks understanding.*
- Her courage teaches us to stand firm even when the Gospel is inconvenient.
- *Her martyrdom shows us that love for Christ is worth everything.*

But Michelangelo's image also reveals another truth: Holiness makes us strong

— strong for others, strong for mission, strong for love.

As I prayed before that fresco, I realized Catherine isn't only a saint of the past.

She is a companion for our parish right now as we:

- repair roofs and strengthen our sacred spaces
- rebuild parish ministries
- reconnect our mission churches
- renew our call to evangelize
- grow in unity across East and North Shore communities

Her strength is the strength we need.

A Parish Being Renewed This feast day comes at a time of rebirth for our parish 'ohana. Like the early Christians I prayed with in Rome — in catacombs, basilicas, and shrines — we too are discerning how to live the Gospel boldly today, that God is not complicated. He simply wants to be with us, to renew us, and to send us forth.

Join Us for the Feast Day Tuesday, November 25, 2025. Solemn Mass of St. Catherine of Alexandria at 6PM, Potluck Dinner and fellowship to follow in Coyle Hall. I warmly invite every parishioner, family, visitor, kūpuna, and keiki to gather as one body in Christ. Let this be a moment of unity, gratitude, and renewed mission. As we honor our patroness, may her strength embolden us, her wisdom guide us, and her love for Christ ignite our hearts. St. Catherine of Alexandria, pray for us.







Liturgy of the Day:

The kingship of Jesus Christ has been affirmed going back to when Jesus was called the Messiah, but the actual feast was only added to the liturgical calendar one hundred years ago, in 1925. In the wake of World War I, history's first truly global war, Pope Pius XI created the feast as the antithesis of the divisive nationalism that led men to take up arms against their brothers, as well as an antidote to the growing secularism that denied the world's unity under God. One hundred years later and nearly two thousand years after Jesus began his public ministry, we still recognize his kindship over all the earth.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

Our first reading today takes us back to when the elders of the twelve tribes of Israel anointed David king. In the second reading, we hear an early church prayer, extolling Jesus in words like the ones we recite today in the creed. The Gospel offers two very different ways in which the condemned with Jesus viewed the inscription on his cross. In harmony with the good thief, may we sing out in today's responsorial psalm, "let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."

Reflection:

For generations, people have often believed that the good prosper and when bad things happen to someone it is because they are being punished for their sins. Yet the very life of Jesus contradicts this notion. Who was more kind, compassionate, or just? Things that happen in our lives are not judgments against or for us. They are simply the realities we must deal with. If we seek God's help, we will have the graces we nee to use all things, the positive and the negative, for good.

Be transformed by the renewal of your mind, That you may prove what is the will of God, What is good and acceptable and perfect. -Romans 12:2

Our Lord told St. Gertrude the Great that the following prayer would release 1000 souls from purgatory each time it is said.

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the most precious blood of thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family - Amen (Approval and Recommendation by Cardinal Pahiarca, Lisbon, Portugal, March 4, 1936)
