Advent Flavor: Humility



2nd Sunday of Advent - Year A Matthew 3:1-12

As many of you know, I've been traveling quite a bit this past month. And in my crisscrossing through airports, one thing kept catching my attention—**holiday coffee flavors.** Everywhere I turned it was gingerbread cold brews, sugar-cookie lattes, peppermint mochas, toasted chestnut cappuccinos... you name it.

Now, I'm a simple guy. I brew my own coffee at home every day, and I rarely buy a cup outside. But on one of those early airport mornings, I needed a little jolt. So, I walked up to the counter, stared at this menu of holiday flavors, and the barista looked absolutely thrilled... until I ordered a **small, black coffee**. No peppermint. No gingerbread. No sugar -cookie foam. Just... coffee.

It made me think: Advent has its own "flavors" we sometimes layer on—wreaths, candles, cozy music, lights, spiritual warm fuzzies. And they're good. They help us enter the season. But at its core, Advent gives us something far more essential than festive sweetness.

Advent gives us the pure, bold, unflavored "brew" of humility and today, Matthew places in front of us the strongest, most uncompromising flavor of humility the Church has: John the Baptist. In Year A, Matthew introduces John not simply as a prophet but as the long-awaited voice crying out in the wilderness—the one Isaiah spoke about centuries earlier. And John comes not to entertain, comfort, or offer seasonal inspiration.

He comes to shake us. He comes to strip away illusion. He comes to prepare the way of the Lord.

Matthew highlights several elements that show John's unique humility:

- **1.** His location the wilderness. John doesn't set up shop in the city square. He goes to the desert, a place symbolizing dependence on God, purification, and truth. Humility begins by stepping away from the noise that keeps us distracted.
- **2.** His appearance camel's hair and leather belt. This echoes the prophet Elijah. John isn't trying to impress; he is trying to point. Humility always points away from self toward God.
- **3.** His message "Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is at hand!" Matthew's John is urgent. Clear. Direct. He's not selling a seasonal special; he's announcing the arrival of a King. Repentance—acknowledging our sins and changing our lives—is the doorway to receiving Christ. Without this humility, Advent becomes sentimental but not transformational.

Humility: The First Step Toward the Manger

One of the most humbling experiences in human life is admitting we are sinners. John calls out the Pharisees and Sadducees not because he dislikes them, but because they want the appearance of religion without the interior conversion.

Matthew's message is sobering: You cannot receive the Savior if you're unwilling to admit you need saving.

John knows exactly who he is—and who he is not. "One mightier than I is coming after me... He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." John humbles himself so we can recognize the greatness of Christ. John lowers himself so Christ can be lifted high. John steps aside so Christ can step in. This is the flavor of humility Advent offers us today. We often hear the phrase: "Jesus is the reason for the season." True. But Matthew wants to push us deeper.

Why was He born?

Not simply to be a gentle teacher. Not simply to give us holiday joy. Not simply to inspire good deeds.



Jesus came to save us from our sins. He entered our world in humility so that He could lift us out of our fallen state and draw us into the Kingdom. The wood of the manger points to the wood of the Cross. Bethlehem cannot be separated from Calvary.

And the only way to prepare for the coming of such a Savior is the way John tells us: **Repent. Change your heart. Clear a path. Make room.**

Your Advent Cup of Coffee

If Advent had a flavor this week, it would not be gingerbread or peppermint or sugar-cookie anything. It would be: **Humility. Bold. Unfiltered. Straight to the heart.** No cream. No sugar. No holiday sprinkles. Just the truth: **We need God. We need mercy. We need conversion.**

If you truly want to feel the warmth, peace, joy, and closeness of Christ this Advent... Start where John tells us: **Repent.** Let the Lord humble our hearts. Let Him clear out what doesn't belong. Let Him prepare a manger within us so He may be born anew.

Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus, come! Give us hearts humble enough to receive You.

Liturgy of the Day:

"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" So proclaimed John the Baptist as he prepared the world for the coming of the Messiah. We may not be preparing for Jesus Christ's arrival in the flesh or plunging into the Jordan River, but John's words apply just as much today as they did then. We must recognize and repent of our sins to order to be prepared for the Lord's arrival in our lives in any way. And the kingdom of heaven is still at hand, glimpsed when we are reconciled with God and our neighbor. May we hear John's words as if they were directed to us here and now.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

Each Sunday of Advent this year, the first reading is taken from the book of the prophet Isaiah, and the Gospel is from Matthew. Mathew's Gospel consistently portrays Jesus and his mission as a fulfillment of the promise God made to the Chosen People. Therefore, Matthew strives to connect the dots between Isaiah, the paramount prophet of the Hebrew scriptures and Jesus Christ. Today we hear Isaiah and John the Baptist describe in terms poetic and practical the coming of God's chosen one. May their words strengthen our anticipation of and preparation for the Lord's coming.

Reflection:

There are so many people in our lives, from those who are close to us to the strangers we pass on the street. We have our beliefs and ideas of what is good and acceptable, and it is easy to judge by our standards- after all we are Godfearing people, and we know what is right. Do you ever consider that each person you meet is a gift? They all have something to teach you — from your child to the bum on the street. If we can stop judging others for a moment, perhaps we can discover the gift they can bring to our hearts.

RECONCILIATION in the Catholic Church, also known as confession or penance, is a sacrament of healing through which a baptized person receives forgiveness for sins committed after baptism. It involves three elements: confession of sins to a priest, who acts as God's representative, absolution by the priest and the performance of a penance assigned by the priest. Through this sacrament, an individual is reconciled with God and the Church.

In the Philippines, we have the <u>tradition of praying the nine days of novena</u> to the Blessed Virgin Mary before celebrating the Feast of the Nativity. Each day of the novena is celebrated with a mass at dawn, which is at 5 a.m. This is the time of the day when the chickens and roosters are waking the people up through their different sounds. It is the peaceful moment that follows which allows the people to contemplate in silence the Gospel for the day.

Recently, it has become a more popular belief that this novena is the time to ask any petition from God; all are assured that God will answer their needs. More and more people embrace this devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

This is also a time when parishioners relate more closely to each other. After the dawn mass, members of our parish FCC take turns serving breakfast to those who attend.

All these traditions are efforts by the Catholic Church to bring people closer to God. After 500 years of Christianity in the Philippines, they can now say: "We are gifted to give!" They are so grateful to God to have been given this faith and are able to spread it throughout the whole world. Filipinos give strong witness that they are doing their part to proclaim the Good News, spreading God's Mercy on Earth!

Our parish Filipino Catholic Club invites all parishioners to share in this beautiful tradition and partake of a complimentary breakfast immediately in Coyle Hall after Mass on each day of the novena.
