

JESUS, OTHERS, YOU!

Third Sunday of Advent - Gaudete Sunday

Matthew 11:2-11

December 14, 2025

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." These words begin today's Mass for Gaudete Sunday, our joyful pause in the midst of Advent's hopeful waiting. With the rose candle lit and rose vestments worn, the Church shifts from repentance to rejoicing as we draw near to Christmas—the celebration of God entering our world in humility. *And so, we rejoice!*

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist—imprisoned and facing uncertainty—sends his disciples to Jesus with the question: "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" Jesus responds by pointing to the signs of the Kingdom breaking through: the blind see, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor receive good news. In other words: Look at the works. Look at the joy breaking into the world. Look at what God is doing. Joy is evident in God's transforming work.

John's mission was to point to Christ, and our lives must do the same. True joy follows the order: Jesus, Others, You— $J_\bullet O_\bullet Y_\bullet$

Jesus First:

Discipleship begins with humility. John is praised as the greatest "among those born of women" because he always directed others to Christ. Putting Jesus first gives purpose and direction.

Others Second:

Jesus' works in the Gospel remind us that joy grows when we care for the poor, lonely, sick, and forgotten. Advent calls us to generosity and compassion.

You Last:

When we surrender pride and place ourselves last out of love, joy deepens. Advent invites us to let go and let Christ renew our hearts.

This week, let us rejoice even amid December's challenges. Let us seek reconciliation, offer generosity, and give the greatest gift—Jesus Christ Himself.

Reflection Question: Where is Jesus inviting me to rediscover JOY—by putting Him first, serving Others generously, and offering myself in humility?

Parish Financial Results for July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025

The Finance Council for the St. Catherine parish consists of five parishioners who regularly review financial results along with our pastor, providing him with their financial advice. The members of the Finance Council are Chris Geis, Janet Kass, Sam Knepper, Jowen Perius, and Mel Ventura. This report from the Finance Council covers the actual financial results of our church and school for the fiscal year ended on June 30, 2025.

Income Statement for the 2024-2025 Fiscal Year

In past years, we've reported separately on church and school financial operations. This year was the first fiscal year with no school operations, so all revenues and expenses are shown on a single income statement. The unoccupied school buildings contributed about \$80,000 to parish expenses -- primarily insurance, maintenance, and utilities.

We budgeted church revenues to be about the same as they were in the prior fiscal year. Actual offertory collections and other regular income came in quite close to budget. However, special gifts to the church were \$100,000 lower than budget. Our parish did not sponsor a carnival last year. That resulted in another \$100,000 less in revenues than budget.

Expenses were about equal to budget, with one major exception. We had budgeted to start roof repairs last year, but that didn't happen. That is why Repairs and Maintenance is \$541,000 less than budget.

Net Ordinary Income was a loss of \$14,011. We recognized as "other" income and then used \$118,783 of restricted funds that had been collected in prior fiscal years. As a result, Net Income for 2024-2025 was a positive \$104,772.

Parish Debt

In prior years, the Diocese of Honolulu loaned our school money, to keep it operating. As of June 30, 2024, our parish still owed \$189,538 to the Diocese. We are paying this off with revenue we receive from leasing one of our buildings to Kamehameha Schools for use as a preschool. All the lease payments the church receives from Kamehameha for the next four years will be used to pay down this loan. Hence, none of that money will be available to fund the church's own expenses.

Liturgy of the Day:

On Gaudete Sunday, we rejoice, for we know that the Lord is near. With eyes of faith, we can sense his presence even as we prepare for the celebration of his coming to us as a newborn infant. With eyes of faith, we can see his coming as well as the prophet Isaiah or the New Testament prophet John the Baptist, who each prepared his people for God's transformative presence. With eyes of faith, let us glory in Jesus' presence right here, right now: in God's word, in the Eucharist, and in those around us.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

The powerful imagery in Isaiah's poetry overwhelms us with joy on this Gaudete Sunday. Deserts bloom with abundant flowers! Parched land exults in joyful song! The blind will see, the deaf will hear and those who cannot walk will leap like a stag! In this season of watchful preparation for the Lord's coming into our lives, may we recognize his transformative presence in our world as we long for the coming of the kingdom, when all this and more will be fulfilled.

Reflection:

Prayer is the key to a fruitful spirit. In prayer, we open ourselves to the insights and inspiration of the Spirit. Everyday we are bombarded with messages (not just from marketing ads but from people and events in our lives) and it can be confusing and overwhelming. Taking a little time to step aside and reflect. It can help to calm the chaos within us and allow us to sift the wheat from the chaff so that we can hold on to what is good. *Rejoice always, never cease praying, Render constant thanks. -1 Thessalonians 5:16*
