

A Gift of Love

Fourth Sunday of Advent

December 21, 2025 Isaiah 7:10–14 Romans 1:1–7 Matthew 1:18–24

As we enter the final days of Advent, many of us are feeling the pressure and busyness that often come with preparing for Christmas. Today's readings invite us to pause, take a breath, and reflect on gifts—not only the ones we exchange this week, but the deeper gifts that truly matter.

When we think of Christmas gifts, it's easy to think first of material things: something new, something useful, maybe a gadget, a bag, or something for the house. *And let's be honest—cash is always nice!* (Especially when you're trying to fix a few roofs around here.) There is usually something we want or something that would make life a little easier.

But as we grow older, we begin to realize that it's not so much the gift itself that matters, but who the gift comes from, and the time and love that come with it. More than anything, many of us long for spiritual gifts—peace, patience, stronger faith, healing, or simply the gift of being present to one another. At the heart of every gift is love, because every human person desires to love and to be loved.

In the first reading, the Prophet Isaiah invites King Ahaz to receive a sign from God. Ahaz refuses, choosing fear and self-reliance over trust. Yet God does not withdraw His love. Instead, He offers the greatest sign imaginable: "The virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel." God is with us—always.

St. Paul reminds us that this Emmanuel brings not only love, but peace—peace that comes from being restored to right relationship with God. Through the Incarnation, God enters our world in a deeply personal way. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, we are offered forgiveness, hope, and eternal life—gifts no one else can give.

In the Gospel, St. Joseph shows us how to respond. A righteous and compassionate man, Joseph receives God's message with humility and faith, and he responds with action. He accepts Mary into his home and gives his life in love and service to Mary and Jesus. Joseph reminds us that love is not proven by words, but by faithful, self-giving action.

As we prepare to celebrate Christmas, we are invited to receive the greatest gift—Jesus Christ—and to respond by offering God our lives in return. The most meaningful gifts we can give have no price tag: the gift of time, the gift of presence, and the gift of love.

This Christmas, I thank God especially for the gift of being home—for family, for parish, and for celebrating the birth of Christ together. May this final week of Advent open our hearts to receive God's love more deeply and to share that love generously with one another.

Reflection Question

What does it mean for you to receive the gift of Emmanuel—God with us—in your home, your family, and your parish this Christmas?

Parish Financial Results for July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025

The Finance Council for the St. Catherine parish consists of five parishioners who regularly review financial results along with our pastor, providing him with their financial advice. The members of the Finance Council are Chris Geis, Janet Kass, Sam Knepper, Jowen Perius, and Mel Ventura. This report from the Finance Council covers the actual financial results of our church and school for the fiscal year ended on June 30, 2025.

Income Statement for the 2024-2025 Fiscal Year

In past years, we've reported separately on church and school financial operations. This year was the first fiscal year with no school operations, so all revenues and expenses are shown on a single income statement. The unoccupied school buildings contributed about \$80,000 to parish expenses -- primarily insurance, maintenance, and utilities.

We budgeted church revenues to be about the same as they were in the prior fiscal year. Actual offertory collections and other regular income came in quite close to budget. However, special gifts to the church were \$100,000 lower than budget. Our parish did not sponsor a carnival last year. That resulted in another \$100,000 less in revenues than budget.

Expenses were about equal to budget, with one major exception. We had budgeted to start roof repairs last year, but that didn't happen. That is why Repairs and Maintenance is \$541,000 less than budget.

Net Ordinary Income was a loss of \$14,011. We recognized as "other" income and then used \$118,783 of restricted funds that had been collected in prior fiscal years. As a result, Net Income for 2024-2025 was a positive \$104,772.

Parish Debt

In prior years, the Diocese of Honolulu loaned our school money, to keep it operating. As of June 30, 2024, our parish still owed \$189,538 to the Diocese. We are paying this off with revenue we receive from leasing one of our buildings to Kamehameha Schools for use as a preschool. All the lease payments the church receives from Kamehameha for the next four years will be used to pay down this loan. Hence, none of that money will be available to fund the church's own expenses.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day:

As we approach the festive day on which we may receive gifts and guests into our homes, we take a moment to recall that during this season of Advent we are called to prepare to receive Jesus into our hearts. Yes, we receive him in a most special way at Christmas, the day we celebrate the world receiving him in the flesh, but we also have the opportunity to receive him each and every day. Let us humbly ask God to prepare our hearts to receive him in the Eucharist here today.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

Twice today we hear the words Isaiah proclaimed hundreds of years before Christ's birth: "the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel." This Hebrew name means "God is with us," and when Joseph, a devout and righteous man, is visited by an angel in his dream, he recalls Isaiah's prophecy. We know that God is also with us as we gather here to listen to God's word, and so at this time we allow ourselves to be immersed in God's presence as we actively listen to today's readings.

Reflection:

The Scriptures often speak of signs from God and it is easy to think such things are just tales from a bygone era. But God continues to send us signs everyday. The problem is that we have forgotten how to spot them. We are so busy with our own thoughts and plans we don't even think about God's plan. From the golden rays of the morning sun promising a new day to the gentle colors of the sunset blessing the day and calling us to rest, there are signs for those who see. Look for the signs and pray for the grace to see and understand them.


