Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord January 11, 2026

The date was September 12, 1987. I was just about two weeks old when my parents brought me to St. Raphael's Church in Koloa, to be baptized by Fr. Felix Vandebroek. Like many of you, the day of my baptism is not even a memory. In fact, it wasn't until I left for seminary that I even learned the date.

Still, the day of our baptism, whether we were two weeks old or eighty-two years old is the most important day of our lives. It is the day we were cleansed of sin, incorporated into the life of Jesus Christ, raised to the dignity of being beloved sons and daughters of God, and made members of His one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

Today we close the Christmas season and enter Ordinary Time by focusing on the first sacrament of our faith Baptism, as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Baptism has its roots in the ritual cleansing practices of our Jewish ancestors. **These purifications symbolized repentance and spiritual renewal and helped prepare people to enter into worship.** When John the Baptist came preaching repentance — “Prepare the way of the Lord!” — he called people to acknowledge their sins and turn their hearts toward the coming Messiah. In the baptism of Jesus, this ritual cleansing is transformed. It becomes the definitive beginning of the Christian life and our journey of discipleship.

So we ask the question: **Did Jesus need to be baptized?** He is the sinless Son of God, so the answer is no. But the Church Fathers teach that Jesus chose to be baptized in order to identify Himself with us, with sinners who long for mercy and conversion.

Jesus' baptism also marks the beginning of His mission as the suffering servant. It foreshadows His death on the Cross and His rising for the salvation of all. He enters the waters not because He needs cleansing — but to sanctify the waters for us. Out of love, He stands with sinners so that we who are baptized into Him might share in His life and rise with Him to eternal life.

This is the mystery of the Incarnation and the meaning of Christmas: **God becomes one of us, so that we who are baptized into Him may become like Him.** Today we are reminded that in baptism we receive both **our identity** and **our mission** as beloved sons and daughters of God. We now share in the very life and mission of Christ.

One concrete reminder of this dignity happens every time we enter the church and bless ourselves with holy water. Whenever we make the sign of the cross, we should recall:

- 1. I am a child of God.**
- 2. I have been redeemed by the Cross of Christ.**
- 3. I belong to God's Church — His family.**

This is who we are.

But then comes the next question: **How do we live this identity?** When Jesus comes up from the water, the Father's voice is heard: “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.” **Our mission is to live in such a way, in thought, word, and action that our Heavenly Father may say of us: “You are my beloved son...you are my beloved daughter...in whom I am well pleased.”**

Because we are baptized in Christ, we are called to holiness. To not to desecrate our bodies or souls with impurity, injustice, intolerance, jealousy, or hatred, but to grow in virtue, charity, and integrity of life. Through prayer, Scripture, and the sacraments, we deepen our intimacy with Christ.

Finally, baptism calls us to share in Christ's mission, to help build up God's Kingdom on earth with compassion, justice, mercy, and love. We are sent to be light for the world, because Christ, who stood in the waters of the Jordan, has made us holy, claimed us as His own, and named us His beloved.

May we never forget who we are and whose we are.

Reflection Question:

When I bless myself with holy water and recall my baptism, do I truly live each day as God's beloved son or daughter — and what might God be inviting me to renew in my life so that He may be "well pleased" in me?

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, thank You for the gift of my baptism and for calling me Your beloved. Renew in me the grace of the Holy Spirit, that I may live with faith, compassion, and courage as a disciple of Your Son. Help me to reflect Your love in my thoughts, words, and actions each day. Amen.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day:

On this final day of the Christmas season, we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. We hear in dramatic fashion of Jesus rising from the waters of the River Jordan, the heavens opening before Him, the Holy spirit descending like a dove, and a voice from the heavens proclaiming, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." Though not as visibly, we too have risen from the waters of baptism and received the Holy Spirit. As beloved children of God, we pray that God is also well pleased with us.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

Isaiah's words may be echoing in your heads now, as we have heard them nearly every Sunday throughout Advent and Christmas. Isaiah foresaw the Messiah, God's chosen one, who, filled with God's spirit, would open the eyes of the blind, rescue those imprisoned in darkness, and establish justice on the earth. Peter attests that Jesus was anointed with the Holy Spirit and power, and Matthew tells of how the Holy Spirit appeared as a dove descending from the heavens when Jesus was baptized. Filled with the Holy Spirit in baptism, let us allow the words of scripture to move us with their power.

Reflection:

Just because someone doesn't belong to our Church does not mean they are not a good person. Whether they are Muslims, Jews or even atheists, they are still God's children and their actions are more important than what group they may belong to. Do you sometimes pass judgment on others because of their religion, race or nationality? Have you even considered they are also loved by God? How might this insight affect your attitudes and behavior? God shows no partiality. *The man of any nation who fears God And acts uprightly is acceptable to Him.* - *Acts 10: 34-35*

SECOND COLLECTION- Jan 10 and 11

The Diocese of Honolulu has revamped its annual appeal, renaming it the **Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal: Sharing God's Gifts (CMAA)**. This replaces the former "Ohana in Christ" campaign and aims to clarify that the funds directly support various ministries across the diocese's 65 parishes, serving over 124,000 Catholics and the wider communities.

Several specific ministries have been recently formed or expanded and supported by **CMAA**:

HOPE for Mental Health Community: Launched in 2019 at the Resurrection of the Lord parish, this ministry provides support and resources for those affected by mental illness.

Catholic Recovery Ministry: Formed at St. Theresa Catholic Church, this ministry integrates Catholic spirituality with the 12-step program for individuals struggling with alcoholism.

Young Catholic Professionals (YCP): A new program supporting young Catholic professionals in the workplace, an offshoot of the EPIC Ministry.

The Huakai Project: A new initiative for young adult Catholics focused on fostering relationships and inspiring through small groups.

Hawaii Apostleship of the Sea Ministry: Launched in the late 2024 out of Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa, this ministry provides pastoral care and support for seafarers.
