Behold the Lamb of God

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

January 18, 2026

“Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.” These powerful words of John the Baptist in today’s Gospel proclaim the true identity of Jesus. They are words familiar to our ears, words we hear at every Mass just before Holy Communion. As we begin the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Church invites us to pause and reflect more deeply on what this title truly means.

The first phrase to consider is **“takes away.”** In the original Greek of the Gospel, this expression means more than simply removing something, it means to take upon oneself, to carry or bear. Jesus, the Son of God, freely takes upon Himself the mission of the Father: *to forgive the sins of the world by offering His life on the Cross*. In this way, John the Baptist’s testimony echoes the image of the Suffering Servant from the prophet Isaiah, the one who has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows. The Word made flesh enters fully into the depths of human sin and suffering in order to redeem us.

The second image John gives us is that of the Lamb. A lamb is not known for strength or power. It is gentle, vulnerable, and defenseless. Yet it is precisely this innocent Lamb who takes upon Himself the enormous weight of the world’s sin. The evil of sin is not conquered by force, but by sacrificial love. Jesus, the Lamb of God, offers Himself freely for our salvation.

Each time we gather for Mass, this mystery is made present. Before we receive Holy Communion, the priest elevates the consecrated Host and proclaims, “Behold the Lamb of God.” In that moment, we are reminded that the Mass is not merely a celebration or a sacred meal—it is the sacrifice of Christ made present for us. We are standing at the foot of the Cross, drawing strength and grace from the One who gave His life for our salvation.

If we are baptized into Christ, then we are called to live in His image. To follow the Lamb of God means choosing innocence over malice, love over force, humility over pride, and service over prestige. As we journey through Ordinary Time, may we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world—and allow His sacrificial love to shape how we live each day.

Reflection Question:

What does it mean for me to follow Jesus not in power, but in sacrificial love?

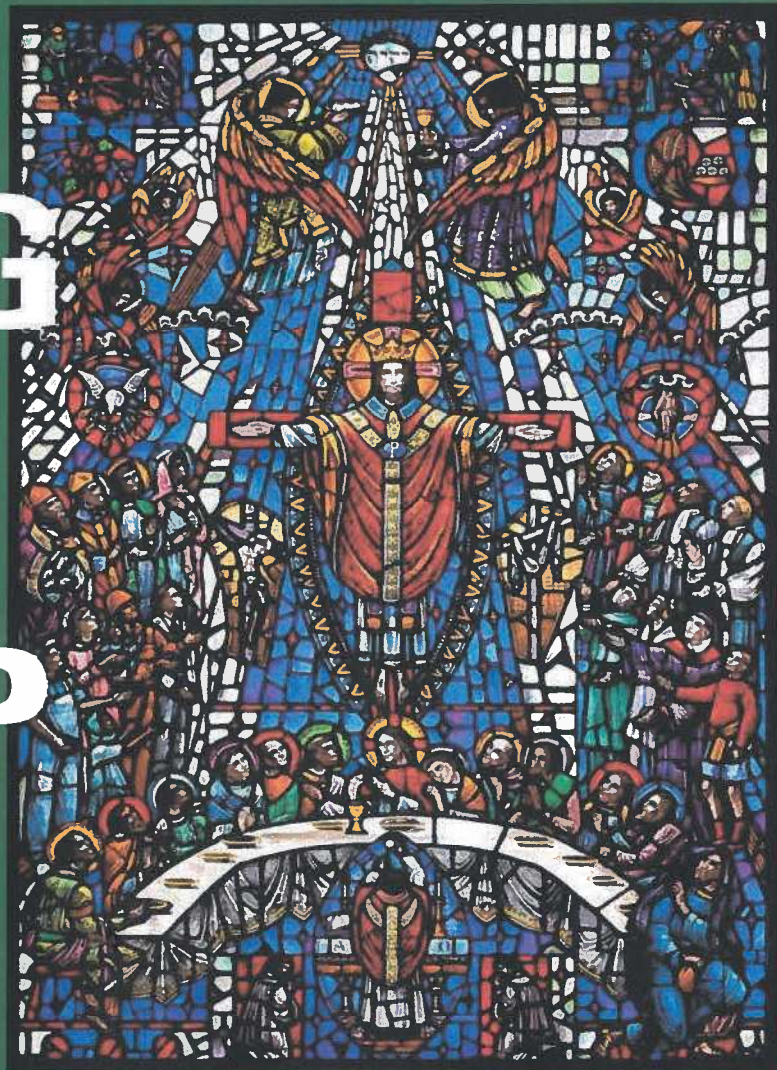

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day:

Ever since Christmas, we have heard how Jesus was revealed over time to the wider world. He was made manifest to the nearby shepherds on the night of his birth. The magi followed the star from distant lands to the east. Last week we heard that the Holy Spirit descended like a dove, revealing Jesus at his baptism. Today, we hear John the Baptist see Jesus and testify, "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." We say the same words at each Eucharist. May they resonate with us today and always.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

Today, we are reminded to listen for Jesus' call to follow him. Isaiah realized God's call of service, referring to himself as God's servant, commissioned to proclaim God's salvation to the ends of the earth. Paul recognized that God willed him to be an apostle and today we hear him tell the members of the church in Corinth that God calls them to be holy. John the Baptist points to Jesus as the Lamb of God and Son of God, the one to follow instead of him. May we listen for his call so that we may respond, "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

Reflection:

Do you consider yourself to be a Christian? Just what does it mean to you? Are you a Christian because you were baptized and raised in the faith? Are you a Christian because you go to church every Sunday and donate to charitable causes? Just what does being a Christian require of you? At the core of our faith is the truth that God loves us unconditionally. If we accept that love, then how can we treat each other with anything less than love? We are all God's apostles sent on a mission to help others realize that they are also God's beloved children. What are you doing to help spread awareness of God's love for all of us? *To do your will, O my God, is my delight, And your law is within my heart. -psalm 40:8*
