Year A—11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Matthew 9:36-10:8

St. Matthew points a picture of Jesus which reveals His compassion. He writes that at the sight of the crowds; the heart of Jesus was moved with pity. Jesus was so moved because the people “were lying prostrate from exhaustion, like sheep without a shepherd.” This is a human heart which is filled with divine love.

Jesus did not die for us as if we were an anonymous flock of sheep. He knows each one of us intimately. He called us by name at our Baptism just as surely as he called the twelve by name to be His apostles.

Today as missionaries sharing in Christ’s mission, we are called to bring healing and wholeness to people we encounter. Although we cannot raise the dead, we can help revive those whose spirits have been crushed by disappointment, loneliness, grief or despair. Many people are physically alive but feel dead within; having lost hope, purpose or the desire to move forward. Through our encouragement, compassion and presence, we can help them rediscover a zest for life.

When Jesus tells His disciples to “cleanse the lepers”, He is inviting them to restore people not only physically but also socially and spiritually. Today, there are many who experience a similar exclusion; the poor, the elderly who are forgotten, those struggling with addiction, prisoners or anyone who feels unwanted and rejected. To cleanse the lepers today means to reach out to our own brethren to restore their dignity, and to help them know that they are loved by God and valued by the community.

In this way, we continue Christ’s mission, we become instruments of healing where there is hurt, hope where there is despair, and acceptance where there is rejection. The miracles Jesus performed are meant to inspire us to perform the everyday miracles of love, compassion, forgiveness. As the gospel clearly says, “without cost you have received; without cost you are to give”. Just as apostles did, let us also continue to do the same thing and give back our entire lives to the mission of Christ.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day:

After celebrating the fifty-day season of Easter, culminating with Jesus' ascension to heaven and the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles, we are emboldened to become disciples ourselves, proclaiming Jesus' message of the nearness of the kingdom of heaven through our words and actions. Let Jesus' final words in today's Gospel propel us on our mission: "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give." Without cost we have received the salvation Jesus won for us; without cost we are to share this gift.

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

The Israelites have been God's chosen people from the time of Abraham and Sarah, "dearer to me than all other people," as the Lord tells Moses in the first reading. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that he was sent to return "the lost sheep of the house of Israel" to the fold. We are part of that fold now, "the sheep of his flock," as we sing in the psalm. Listening to God's word today, let us reflect on the privilege we have in being part of the flock we call the Church, rescued from the world of sin by our Good Shepherd.

Reflection:

We like to keep count of things – who owes us, points we have earned, etc. We even do this with our faith – how well have we followed the "rules" and maybe even how many indulgences have we earned. The truth is that such "accounting" is fruitless and even a distraction from what is truly important. We cannot "earn" salvation – this is a gift Jesus has given to us and we did not even ask for it! In light of this, why are we keep count of what is owed to us and what we have earned? *Know that the Lord is God; He made us, his we are.*
