My Dear Friends in Christ,

I think sometimes people may wonder why I love Jesus. After all, what Jesus has to say isn't particularly profound. When asked what the greatest commandment was - the mandate we all need to follow - he stated simply, "love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and mind" and, "love your neighbor as yourself." That's powerful but not particularly unique. You can be Christian, Jew, Muslim, Hindu, Shinto, Buddhist, spiritual, or even atheist and agree to love your neighbor as yourself. Why then Jesus?

Recently, I spent an afternoon working at a couple of local food pantries. One was in Pardeeville, and the other in Rio. During the day volunteers gathered to hand out food to those in need. At one location there was a line of about 50 cars, each representing a family in need. Families of five or six, which means that we helped around 300 people. We didn't know their circumstances; that wasn't a condition for helping them. We didn't judge; we were there to serve. Food insecurity strikes at the very core of our human needs, and seeking help can often be dehumanizing. We were there to help them out of compassion.

As for the volunteers, it's hard to assess their motives. I'm sure that each had their reasons for being there, but it wasn't discussed. Maybe for some it was just the need for camaraderie, a chance to be with others and work and laugh a little bit. Others may have felt a need to help, maybe they really didn't even know where that came from. I would like to think that someone in that group was using this as an opportunity to pay back a kindness that they had received in their life.

Humans are incredibly proud beings. We like to tell ourselves that our accomplishments come through our hard work or talents. That narrative can quickly become our mantra. Our culture encourages it; we love the story of the person who picks themselves up by their bootstraps. It is the myth of rugged individualism. But if we are truthful, we realize that somewhere along our path someone lent us a helping hand. Maybe that was a parent, or a teacher, a friend, or even a stranger who gave us the thing that we needed most at that moment, and it made all the difference. Perhaps it was someone who believed in us when we didn't believe in ourselves and had just the right words.

And so, back to that question of why I love Jesus. Jesus is that someone. That someone that knows me, and sees within me the potential for what I can be. Someone that is always there to help me be the best that I can be. What I have discovered is in those moments in my life where I felt the most challenged it was Christ's presence that helped me pull through. And I have come to realize that I couldn't have done it by myself.

for us in our suffering, I am humbled to know that I am seen by God. This is another opportunity to pass on the love that I have received and allow Christ to work through me to help others on their journey.

Many blessings this Christmas Season, may you come to know the presence of God in your life.

- Each Prayer Partner is to acknowledge receipt of the prayer request by replying, "Got it."
- Each Prayer Partner prays once or more times a day:Our Father, Who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name, Thy kingdom come and thy will be done in the life of \_\_\_\_\_ and his/her need of
- Dan will follow up with the original caller in ten days and report to "Prayer Partners."

**ONE RULE:** "Prayer Partners" are not to gossip about callers or calls. Information provided is strictly confidential. One can request to become a "Prayer Partner" at any time. Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:04 pm.

**Approval of minutes:** 1st – Bob Henze; 2nd Josh Achterberg; all approved

**Devotion:** Provided by Gina Lee from Psalm 61 shares that we have Holy refuge with God, we can be confident that God hears our prayers and responds in love always.

**Financial Review:** Dave Mickelson reported that we are tracking close to last year. A motion for a synod payment of \$2,000 and \$100 to World Hunger in October was made by Josh Achterberg and Bob Henze provided the second, all approved. Motion to renew the \$57,000 Parking Lot CD and \$30,000 Memorial Fund CD was made by Bob Henze and the second was provided by Josh Achterberg, all approved.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor had three funerals in September, one in October and will have one in November and is still doing funerals for United in Christ and Our Saviors. There is a Synod meeting on October 15<sup>th</sup> and a Conference meeting at Spring Prairie on October 16<sup>th</sup>. A call on October 15<sup>th</sup> to discuss the Bells being completed this year with the company from Ohio if sufficient funds are available. A conversation with Bill Dickman on his interest in assisting with the music worship here at Spring Prairie. December Coffeehouse will be a compilation of all five church choirs to celebrate the caroling season, this will include readings.

### **Council Committee Reports:**

**Music/Worship:** Coffeehouse has been scheduled for the months of October, November, December and February. We will extend an invitation to our sister churches to join in each of the Coffeehouse events. We need to inspire more members to participate in Sunday services which will be supported by the Confirmation students throughout the school year.

**Outreach/Faith in Action:** Dan submitted a Prayer Chain proposal for the Councils review. We all decided this would be a wonderful addition to Spring Prairie and approved of his outline. Dan will be having a meeting on Sunday, November 9<sup>th</sup> for members interested in participating in the Spring Prairie Prayer Chain Group.

**Property:** Bob is working with Doug Bindl to repair the outside faucets and work on the shower at the Parsonage. He will be having an electrician to address the power in the Kitchen along with looking at a better lighting solution for the front of the church when we have evening events. Bob is looking into getting a tree trimming estimate and plan as there are trees down at the parsonage and the church has some trees that need to be addressed.

**Stewardship/Participation:** Laura will be hosting the Boo Bash on October 25<sup>th</sup> which will have games movies, along with fun treats for all who attend. Kayden will be helping along with Cole and the confirmation kids to make this event filled with fun and fellowship.

<u>Christian Education/Youth:</u> Kayden is proposing that we do another Pancake breakfast with the service being held downstairs. He also is considering we do this when we have our Annual meeting at Spring Prairie.

<u>Technology/Communication:</u> Josh received a good quote on the elevator phone, and it was installed on October 16<sup>th</sup> by Best Defense out of Waunakee, it is called a Cellevator phone, Best Defense monitors the cell line 24/7. Bright Speed will be cancelled. The Sound System has been ordered and we are waiting on the schedule to install it. Action Plumbing was contacted regarding the possibility of air conditioning for the church. They are holding off on their portion of the bid as based on our electric panel, an electrician will need to come and see what would be needed to complete the installation of this type of a system. We may have a quote by the next council meeting.

<u>Fellowship:</u> Julie was not in attendance but shared through an email that for October Coffeehouse we will be having a Chili Cookoff competition, with a prize awarded at intermission. Julie is looking at also having a bread fellowship, where everyone brings their favorite bread to share with the rest of the members during fellowship after church.

**New Business:** We are looking into updating the tables in the upstairs meeting area. Trish Kienitz will provide ideas\options at the November meeting.

Old Business: There is no old business

**Next Council Meeting:** Our next meeting is scheduled for November 11, 2025, at 6:00 pm. Bob Henze will provide the devotion.
