"Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, " 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." – (Matthew 22:36-40)

Earlier this year the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin passed a resolution at its annual assembly. After careful consideration by the members of the assembly, which included both clergy and lay persons, it was decided to issue a statement warning of the dangers of Christian Nationalism. It is likely that you have heard a great deal about Christian Nationalism of late, and perhaps you still have questions in your mind about what it is and how it can truly be harmful in our nation. That's a reasonable reaction, because as a first response it would be easy to say I love my country and I love God and loving both perhaps the solution to many of our problems, real or perceived, is to return to our faith.

"Christian Nationalism, is not Christian nor is it patriotic" Resolution 4 – "Christian Nationalism" – amended version, South-Central Synod of Wisconsin.

First, a little background. The framers of the Constitution incorporated a clause that has come to be known as the Establishment Clause. This clause prohibits the government from creating a state religion to consolidate power. The existence of this clause protects the freedom of religion for all people within the United States. This freedom is a core principle of our country. This freedom was established because the framers had experienced the tyranny associated with a state sanctioned religion. The Church of England was created in response to pressure from the Catholic Church against Henry VIII, and it was the Church of England that gave authority to the English monarchy. This combination paved the way for prejudice and oppression throughout the English empire.

The ideology of Christian Nationalism stands in stark contrast with our understanding of God's saving grace for all of creation through Christ's sacrificial act on the cross.

To be clear, as Lutherans we understand that we are guided by our faith as we engage the world. This faith calls us to love our neighbor as ourselves. We are to see the stranger as the one that God loves and to embrace them as Jesus would. We are to care for creation with an eye towards the future, conserving resources and protecting the environment. We are to feed and shelter those in need out of compassion and respect for the gospel. We are called to turn the other cheek and find common ground with those that we differ with. Finally, we understand the power of the gospel to be something that transcends the power of earthly kingdoms. We are instruments of that peace in the world.

It is acceptable, and commendable for us go forth into the world as Christ would. But we are called to do that with respect for all creation, and all the people of the world. Our relationship with Christ is deeply personal and we live with the gift of God's grace. Let us continue to preach the Gospel into the world through our actions and love of neighbor. It is possible to do that and to love our country at the same time.

May the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.





Spring Prairie Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes August 8, 2025

Opening Items:

Members Present: Pastor Rick Bursh, Trish Kienitz, Dan Biddick, Julie Johnson, Bob Henze, Laura Pingel, and Gina Lee were present. Josh Achterberg and Kayden Meyer were not present

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:03 pm by Trish.

Approval of minutes: 1st - Julie; 2nd Laura; all approved

Devotion: Provided by Dan shared how his journey in faith was guided by many hands and was blessed by this throughout his life through the Holy Spirit. Sharing the thought that by the use of all of our hands will help the Holy Spirit guide others on their faith journey

Financial Review: August synod payment of \$500 approved - 1st Bob; 2nd Julie; all approved. Annual report to show Council decided to move interest income of \$1,900 to general fund. Motion was made to address retaining wall repair by Bob, Dan gave the 2nd motion, all approved. We have designated memorials from Elaine Walls, Mary Sharpee, Bob Kronberg and Alice Zwiefel. Per Deb's report we received Paul and Elaine Gullickson memorial from their Estate. Motions were made for the Sound System, paying off the Loan and the Quilters Club, Bob made the 1st and Laura provided the second, all approved. The loan was paid off in full as designated.

Pastor's Report: Pastor has had 6 funerals from July 17th to August 11th. United Church of Christ in Morrisonville has dinner church on Thursday evenings at 5:30 pm. Pastor will be attending the Deans meeting the week of August 25th There has been some discussion of combining Vacation Bible School with other area churches next year. September 29th 6:30 to 8:00 pm all church council meeting. Regarding Jenny's fee for funeral services, we need to add 4 to 6 hours along with increasing the base fee by \$150.00 per funeral along with \$100 in Administration Fees, we will then charge \$150 for a member funeral and \$300 for a non-member funeral. Sunday morning musicians, Ivy will continue to record what is needed for Sunday during the week.

Council Committee Reports:

Music/Worship: A calendar has been created from August, 2025 to May, 2026 to outline Coffeehouse dates along with additional monthly events so that we can be better prepared as we go through our Church calendar year as a part of the 2025 Forward Planning items. We have Coffeehouse dates for September, October, November, December, February, March and April. We will extend an invitation to our sister churches to join in each of the Coffeehouse events. There is a possibility that Bill Dickman may assist with Music on some Sundays. We are also looking at Backpack blessings on September 10th.

Outreach/Faith in Action: Dan reported our next Membership Celebration will be on Sunday, September 21. He will be looking for 4 people to share what their faith community here at Spring Prairie means to them, possibly looking for one of our younger members to speak at the service. We will be having a potluck on that day as well and providing handouts to all visitors who attend Dan is working on a preliminary draft for a prayer chain and daily meditation concept. This could

be provided on our website that would be a way of providing a closer outreach to our Members during their time of need. Further, he is looking at setting up communion for our members that can't make it to church.

Property: Bob purchased humidifiers and a microwave for downstairs and the kitchen. An outlet is needed on the west wall downstairs for the freezer. We are in the process of getting the outside spigots replaced by Arlington Hardware. A motion was made to repair the Parsonage shower by Julie, Gina made the 2nd and all approved.

Stewardship/Participation: Laura is putting together a welcome packet for any visitors who attend Sunday Service. Schedule a Movie and Popcorn night, get parishioners involved, the first event will be held in October. We have the Norwegian cookies event in December and are looking at reaching out to our sister churches to see if they might want to participate.

Christian Education/Youth: Kayden was not in attendance at this meeting, updates will follow in the September minutes.

Technology/Communication: Jim Hermanson will be reviewing the Sound System on August 16th. The sound system will be digital, which will allow streaming capabilities. We will be 6 to 8 weeks out to get the system installed after full review. The approval will have to come through a church meeting as the cost is between \$32,000 and \$43,000. The elevator phone is in the process of getting a quote involving upfront and service fees.

Fellowship: Julie shared that Vacation Bible School went very well, we had lots of help, especially from our youth leaders. All the kids enjoy all the events. We are looking into a craft fair for church.

New Business: We are still in the process of getting quotes on the Bell repair.

Old Business: There is no old business.

Next Council Meeting: Our next meeting is scheduled for September 16, 2025, at 6:00 pm. Kayden Meyer will provide the devotion.

Adjournment: The meeting adjourned with a motion by Dan Biddick; seconded by Julie Johnson at 8:08 pm; approved by all and ended with the Lord's Prayer.
