My dear friends in Christ,

Groucho Marx famously said once, "I will belong to no club that would have me as a member." Certainly, it's facetious, but it also represents an awareness of self and humility in a world that often wants us to be perfect. The expectation is that each of us is capable of being more than we truly are. But in our heart, we recognize this disconnect and it can leave us in a state of conflict. We're not worthy, we are not good enough, people don't truly know who we are, we don't belong. It's something that has probably plagued each one of us at times. In contrast to this there is the church.

When we are baptized, we are baptized into a community of believers and what we share with those believers is not our perfection but Christ's perfection. God does not accept us because of what we might be, God accepts us just as we are. God understands the things that make us imperfect and through God's grace we are cleansed of all iniquity. God's church doesn't know any four walls, it isn't dependent upon the grandeur of the building. God's church isn't about programming or community service. God's church extends beyond these four walls into all of creation and encompasses every individual made in God's image.

This September we will come together to celebrate our belonging within God's church. We will welcome back our siblings who may have ventured out into the world but never lost contact with us through the Holy Spirit. It will be an opportunity to share our stories, to remember our friendships, and to envision what we can do together as we head into the future.

Recently, we've discussed what it means to be a "member" of Spring Prairie. I don't know about you, but to me the word member suggests a division. It suggests that there is an inner and an outer group. It ignites my insecurity about junior high when social groups really begin to separate and define us. While it is necessary to define members of the church for purposes of the constitution, it seems to create unnecessary divisions; all are welcome here and always will be.

Our constitution was written with the foresight to add a bylaw that is somewhat unique. It reads, [Members who have not] "attended worship or supported the work of the church financially for a period of two years or more, shall be considered inactive." Did you see the connective word, "or"? What makes this unique is that many congregations require both: that connective word would be "and". What that means is that we recognize that some of our siblings will not be with us physically, but we will still be connected through the Holy Spirit. It is also an acknowledgement that there may be times in our lives when supporting the church through financial means isn't practical or possible. The lack of either one of these is not cause for separation.

God's church welcomes you as a member, and you will always be a member. This was assured when you were baptized and sealed with the sign of the cross forever. Spring Prairie welcomes you as a member. If your journey takes you someplace different, we pray that you will find a faith community to thrive within and be nurtured by. Regardless, we will always be connected through our common past and remain members together in God's church.

May the peace that passes all understanding guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.


Celebrating Our SPLC Community

July 8th, 2025

Opening Items:

Members Present: Pastor Rick Bursh, Trish Kienitz, Josh Achterberg, Dan Biddick, Julie Johnson, Gina Lee, Kayden Meyer and Laura Pingel were present, Bob Henze was not present

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:10 pm.

Devotion: Provided by Julie on guiding our thoughts and communications by remaining open and receptive.

Approval of minutes: 1st - Dan; 2nd Kayden; all approved

Financial Review: July synod payment of \$500 approved - 1st Dan; 2nd Josh; all approved. Motion to move interest income of \$2,100 to operating budget made by Julie; 2nd by Laura; all approved. Due to some questions for the Treasurer, the July financial approval was delayed until August.

Pastor's Report: We are having cake for Ivy on July 13, in honor of her service through our music program. Regarding Jenny's fee for funeral services, we need to add 4 to 6 hours along with increasing the base fee by \$150.00 per funeral, we will vote on this at the August meeting.

Council Committee Reports:

Music/Worship: Coffeehouse is being scheduled for the months of October, November, December, February and March. We will extend an invitation to our sister churches to join in each of the Coffeehouse events. There is a possibility that Bill Dickman may assist with Music on some Sundays.

Outreach/Faith in Action: Dan reported our next Membership Celebration will be on Sunday, September 21. Dan is working on a preliminary draft for a prayer chain and daily meditation concept. This could be provided on our website that would be a way of providing a closer outreach to our members during their time of need.

Property: Bob was not present at this meeting as such the Parsonage shower discussion was put on hold. Stewardship/Participation: Getting a quote on getting the bells repaired. Schedule a Movie and Popcorn night, get parishioners involved. Outreach in different ways to bring new parishioners to Spring Prairie Lutheran Church. Visitor parting gift with a flyer to share with them. Getting youth to assist with lighting candles on Sundays.

Christian Education/Youth: Kayden shared VBS will be two nights, Tuesday, August 5th and Wednesday, August 6th, more details to follow. Julie Johnson will be assisting Kayden; they will be needing volunteers to set up and clean up each day.

Technology/Communication: Josh is continuing to work on the sound system. At present we have analog and need to upgrade to digital. The approval will have to come through a church meeting as the cost is between \$32,000 and \$43,000. The elevator phone is in the process of getting a quote involving upfront and service fees.

Fellowship: Julie shared she will be creating a streamline ordering process allowing her to buy in bulk for items needed to support fellowship and other events. After contacting Costco, it will be the most efficient way for Julie to use her personal card and submit for reimbursement from the church as needed.

New Business:

Creating a leadership program through committees to engage fellow parishioners in training, structure systems to inspire through direction with more to follow. Council spent the rest of the meeting discussing the ELCA strategic five commitments, starting the alignment of our 2026 strategy with these objectives, reviewing progress so far in 2025, and discussing next steps. Committee Leads will provide more action items (where needed) for 2026 at our September meeting for continued 2026 forward planning.

Old Business: There is no old business.

Next Council Meeting: Our next meeting is scheduled for August 12, 2025, at 6:00 pm. Dan Biddick will provide the devotion.

Adjournment: The meeting adjourned with a motion by Josh Achterberg; seconded by Laura Pingel at 8:42pm; approved by all and ended with the Lord's Prayer.
