Welcome to this edition of Mission's News and Views. One Scripture that kept coming up in several of the writers' articles was 1 Corinthians 15:58:

"Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord."

This verse is given at the end of the great "resurrection" chapter, where Paul presents a powerful case for the resurrection of Christ. He begins the chapter by declaring the gospel—that Christ died for our sins, was buried, and rose again on the third day according to the Scriptures. He goes on to tell us that more than five hundred brethren saw Jesus. We don't know who these men were, but Paul then names some well-known witnesses and even testifies that he saw the risen Christ himself.

Some in Corinth claimed there was no resurrection. Paul strongly refutes this, reminding us that if Christ is not risen, our preaching is in vain, our faith is empty, and we are still in our sins. If Christ is not risen, then those who have died in Him are lost, and we are the most miserable people in the world.

But Paul doesn't leave us there. He shifts focus and writes about the Lord's return, when He will rule and reign with all authority and power. As the passage draws to a close, Paul gives us a glimpse of the glorified bodies that God will give us.

We serve a risen Savior! He is alive—and that makes all the difference. Because Jesus lives, we will live also! If He can conquer death, what can He not do? He can save anyone who comes to Him by faith. He gives His presence in the midst of trouble, His direction when we are overwhelmed, His provision when we are in need, and His peace in the middle of chaos. He empowers us to accomplish the work He has left for us to do.

Our Lord is coming again—and thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ! Because of this, we plant our feet, steadfast and unmoveable, and we give ourselves entirely to the work of the Lord—for His honor and glory!

Finally, He leaves us with the promise that our labor is not in vain in the Lord. Paul uses the word labour, which refers to intense work united with trouble and toil. It implies pain, weariness, and hardship. Let me encourage you: keep on keeping on for the glory of God. He sees it all, He will help us endure, and He will reward our faithfulness.

In this edition, you'll hear from some of our Lord's faithful servants—newly ABA-Recommended Missionaries. I hope you enjoy reading about their fields of labor and the work God has called them to. I pray that you will commit to supporting them through your words of encouragement and faithful prayers.

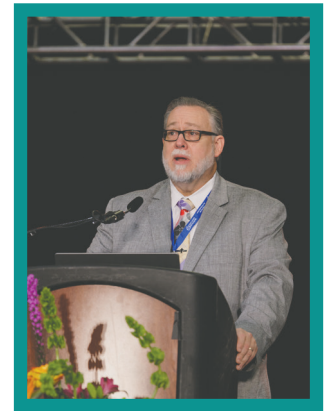

Allow us to introduce ourselves. We are Jerry and Kim Chandler, Missionaries to Brasov, Romania, sent out by Langdon St. Baptist Church in Somerset, Kentucky. Romania is a beautiful country in Eastern Europe. It has a population of 19 million people. Romania is rich in culture and history! Romania's primary religion is Romanian Orthodox, which is a works-based religion. God has called us there to preach the true gospel of salvation, which is by Grace through Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. We want to establish Indigenous Romanian Baptist Churches.



Kim and I have been married for over 48 years. I was saved when I was 11 and baptized by Union Hill Landmark Missionary Baptist Church, near Bradford, Arkansas. I announced my call to preach the gospel in 1974 and have been in the ministry for over 51 years. Kim was born and raised in Alabama. Kim and I were married in 1977, and we have been blessed to serve the Lord together as husband and wife until this very day. We have four daughters and their families, which include eight beautiful grandchildren!

Mission work has always been very dear to our hearts. Early in my ministry, I had the blessing of helping establish two stateside churches. I also have pastored churches both in Arkansas and Kentucky. In 2001, God called us to be Missionaries to the Country of Romania and were sent out by West Somerset BC in Somerset, KY, and then later by Faith Baptist Church in Cabot, Arkansas. We moved onto the field in Brasov, Romania, in July of 2002 and took over the Mission Work that Brother John Sanders had been working with for 10 years. During those years, I taught in the Bible Institute in Brasov, where we trained pastors and Christian workers. We also worked with American Missionaries, Doug Wiersema, Robert Blume, Jim Black, and Steve Rutherford, building a Romanian Youth Camp. All the while, Kim led a Humanitarian Ministry that helped Needy Families with food, clothing, and medical needs and worked alongside Hospice to aid terminally ill patients and their families. After returning to the States, for the last 12 years I have served as Senior Pastor in two different churches, one being Langdon St. Baptist Church in Somerset, Kentucky, and Pleasant Hill Missionary Baptist Church in Lynn, Arkansas. While Pastoring Langdon St. BC in Somerset, Kentucky, the Church sent out Kolt and Amy Mackrill as Missionaries to the Brasov area of Romania. Kolt is our son-in-law, and Amy is our youngest daughter. They have labored faithfully as Missionaries in Romania for nearly 10 years. During that time, they have started a new work in the Village of Zarnesti and have worked to help an existing church in the Village of Feldioara. Early in 2025, Kolt accepted a call to pastor Pleasant Hill MBC in Lynn, AR. He and His family moved back to the States at the end of May 2025.



In 2024, God placed a strong burden on our hearts once again for Romania. After Romania entered the European Union, many people were able to leave Romania to find work with higher wages in other European countries. As a result, a country that once had a population of 23 million now has a population of 19 million. Along with many that have left, there are Romanian Pastors who once pastored Romanian Baptist Churches that we had established. By the time this article is published, we will be living and working in Romania once again. We are taking over the work started by Brother Kolt Mackrill in Zarnesti and will lead the church in Feldioara, which has been without a Pastor for many years. We plan to reestablish the Romania Bible Institute, where we can train new Pastors and Christian Workers, and we will continue the Humanitarian Ministry. We truly desire your prayers that God will use us to cast the vision that the churches will see the fields that are white unto harvest and that God will call more laborers into this plentiful harvest!

BRINGING THE HOPE OF THE GOSPEL TO UTAH VALLEY

Utah is a land of breathtaking beauty. Its snowcapped mountains, red-rock deserts, and wide valleys draw visitors from around the world. Yet behind the beauty lies a deep spiritual darkness.

My wife, Lourdes, our two-year-old daughter Emilia, and I are preparing to move to Utah as church-planting missionaries. We are being sent out of Landmark Missionary Baptist Church in Bedford, Indiana—the church where I grew up. God has placed a clear burden on our hearts: to plant a self-supporting, reproducing New Testament church in the heart of Utah Valley.

A Place of Great Need

Utah is one of the most religious states in the country, but it is also the least evangelical. The metro area of Provo–Orem has been identified as the least evangelical metro area in the United States, with some communities less than one percent evangelical. At the same time, Utah is the youngest and fastest-growing state, yet it ranks among the most depressed.



Despite their outward success, many people are searching for real hope. They know there is a God. Many even strive to reach His standard. But they try to do it on their own—and like all of us apart from Christ, they fall short. Their efforts leave them empty and hopeless because they lack the true Gospel.

The Apostle Paul wrote, “For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast” (Ephesians 2:8–9). The people of Utah need this truth—that salvation cannot be earned, only received through Christ.



This is why we are going: to preach the hope of Christ crucified and risen again, the only message that can bring new life, healing, and transformation. As Paul asked in Romans 10:14, “How shall they believe

in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher?”

A Unique Opportunity

In addition to its unique religious climate, Utah Valley is home to a large Hispanic population—about one in five speak Spanish in their homes. With my wife Lourdes being an immigrant from Peru, we know well the challenges immigrants face and pray God will use us to minister to families walking through that transition.



We are also praying that God will open the doors for our friends from Peru—Joel and Claudia Cosme, and their daughter María Gracia—to join us in Utah. Joel has lived and worked there before, and knows first hand the Gospel need. His fluency in both English and Spanish would be a great blessing in reaching many. We believe God may use this partnership to open new doors for ministry among both English-speaking and Spanish-speaking families.

How You Can Partner With Us

We believe God has called us to Utah, but we do not want to go alone. We invite you to join us in this mission—through praying, giving, and even coming to serve alongside us. You can pray specifically for:

- The hearts of the people in Utah Valley, that God would prepare them to hear the Gospel.
- The assembling of a faithful team to labor together in the work.
- Our family as we travel on deputation, sharing the vision, raising support, and building gospel-centered partnerships.

Utah is a land of beauty, but its greatest need is the Hope of the Gospel. Please pray with us that God would raise up a church there that shines as a beacon of hope in the valley, all for His glory!



Nino Baffa, a servant and Evangelist of Jesus Christ. Greetings from our ministry based in Cleveland, Ohio. I desire that this letter finds you well and bears much fruit. I am a part of Heritage Church Planting, which is sent out of Heritage Baptist Church of Willoughby in Willoughby, OH, which is sent out of Cleveland Baptist Church of Ohio. Our God given goal is to plant 15 churches in total! Five east, five south, and five west of Cleveland.



We have planted our first in Willoughby, Ohio, and we are in the process of planting our second in Mentor, Ohio. This work has been such a beautiful thing to experience.

Currently, *1 Corinthians 15:58* is really hitting home for me –
“Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord.”



Brethren, I can say that the Lord’s work is truly being done in and around our oyster. We have witnessed many, many confessions of faith over the two, almost three years we’ve been laboring, seen the lives of individuals and families change for the better, and have seen the community positively respond to us engaging in our work of the great commission. We’re in the lighting business, amen? Sharing the light of that glorious Gospel! My heart is truly touched to be a part of a born-again, blood-bought, love-filled, King James, soul-winning, Eternal Security preaching church.



I will speak for myself personally and say that the second-best thing that has ever happened to me was that a Baptist church found me. Yes, I wrote that right, reader – the Willoughby church plant found me. I’m not sure that I have ever quite written or said those words just like that. God be praised!

As the born-again child of God, I fully acknowledge that church planting is biblical and that it’s for your average everyday Christian to be a part of in some way, shape, or form. Not only are we to be a part of a church, but we are also a part of multiplying them. Can we not apply “Be fruitful and multiply” when it comes to church planting? I think so! In the same breath, as rewarding as the work is, it is very challenging and comes with many learning lessons. We experience the challenge of starting something new, new people that can be doctrinally all over the place, the wolves that come in with ulterior motives, and so on. I bring this up as it’s real, and it’s important to be real as Christians and ministers. People need authenticity these days – they need to authentically meet Jesus through His people. Are you doing that, reader? Are you authentically introducing and sharing Jesus with people in how you live your day-to-day life? Come on, I had to challenge you at some point!



I am personally working on follow-ups. God is responding by giving me grace and growing me in this way, and I’m looking forward to seeing the fruit. Please keep our ministry in your prayers.





My name is Noel Alba Magallanes, and I thank God for the chance to share my story with you. I am serving as a missionary pastor here in Capiz, Philippines, and it's with great joy that I tell you about God's work in this place.

When I first surrendered my life to Christ, I knew that He was calling me to give my life in service to Him. Over time, that call became clearer. God put in my heart the mission to share His Word, especially with those who have not yet heard the Gospel. Through much prayer, God's guidance, and the encouragement of fellow believers, He led me here to Capiz. I know that I'm here not by accident, but because He opened the way and gave me the privilege of serving in this ministry. Each day, I see more and more that this is truly His work, and I'm grateful for the honor of laboring in the Lord's vineyard.

As the Lord has called me to labor here, it's also important to know the place where He has planted this ministry. Understanding the community and the land helps us see not only the challenges the people face but also the many opportunities for the Gospel to take root and flourish.

Roxas, Capiz, Philippines, carries a rich cultural identity shaped by its history, traditions, and natural resources. The province is recognized for its heritage structures, seafood cuisine, and distinct fishing practices.



Capiz's economy is largely agricultural, with rice, corn, coconut, sugarcane, and bananas as major crops. Another main source of income is fishery, with Capiz known as the "Seafood Capital of the Philippines." Capiz has one of the richest fishing grounds in the country, providing a livelihood to people. It's also known for its abundant marine life, making it a major exporter of prawns and milkfish. A serious challenge in Capiz is the frequent typhoons, which often damage rice fields and fishponds and greatly affect the livelihood of farmers and fishermen.

My ministry here is built upon the foundation of the Baptist mission. From the beginning, I started in the ministry with limited financial resources, but I've witnessed how God truly provides for His servants and the needs of His work. A substantial part of my work involves conducting Bible Studies within homes and communities, aiming to firmly ground individuals in the Word of God. I also dedicate time to visitation, reaching the sick, visiting families in upland areas, connecting personally with households, sharing God's Word, and conducting prayer vigils for grieving families. We also hold cottage prayer meetings with mission members. Furthermore, we also have a children's ministry, where Bible stories, songs, and activities are taught to help the children learn about Jesus and to grow in the Lord faithfully. The mission also provides a feeding program for them every Sunday, and it's a great blessing to see that these children are always excited and growing in the Lord. We're overjoyed at the church with those



who consistently attend. Along with this, we also hold outreach activities for children in other barangays. We're praying that we can also lead their parents to the Lord and join us in serving Him. Please pray for these lovely children and their families.

Another touch of God's blessings in our mission is the gradual construction of our church mission building. By God's grace, we can see the improvement day by day, made possible by God's provision and through the effort and cooperation of the brethren.

We're also blessed and grateful for the prayers and financial support of my sponsoring church, Corinth Missionary Baptist Church of Timpson, TX and the American Baptist Association (ABA). They provide the support that helps the ministry, advances the work of the mission, and carries it forward in ways that glorify the Lord. Indeed, God works through His people as instruments for missions. We continually lift them up in our prayers, asking the Lord to pour out abundant blessings upon them, to strengthen their ministries, and to grant them greater opportunities to touch lives for His glory. Truly, it is a great blessing and encouragement for us to be standing side by side with them in the Lord's work, united in faith and service, all for God's glory.



In this ministry, the Gospel is transforming lives, and many have followed the Lord in baptism. Truly, it is by His amazing grace that the mission continues to expand.

However, we also recognize the challenges that come with the work. Resources are often limited, and the needs remain many, especially for the ongoing construction of our church building. Yet, we're praying, and our trust remains in the Lord, who will never fail to provide.

Looking ahead, my plans include further strengthening our existing Bible studies, expanding our visitation ministry to reach more families, bringing more souls to Christ through soul-winning, introducing more children to Christ, and conducting more outreach activities in other barangays. We also pray to baptize more souls and multiply more seeds for the Gospel so that the work of the Lord may continue to grow and bear lasting fruit. Also, we remain fully dedicated to completing the construction of our mission church building and many more.

With humble gratitude and prayers, I continue to focus on the work the Lord has entrusted to me. Through faith and obedience, we will see His Kingdom grow, and God may be glorified in all things.

Thank you for your love and support for the mission. We wholeheartedly appreciate and value your partnership in the Lord's work, and I humbly rejoice in God's grace that allows us to serve Him side by side. Truly, the work continues not by our strength alone but by His power and provision.

We press on with joy, knowing that this mission is the Lord's, and we are simply vessels in His service. To God be all the glory!



Hello! My name is Jared Harris, and we are Redeemed Mission Builders. My wife Samantha and I have seven children and praise the Lord that all profess salvation through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. We have also been serving as youth leaders at our church for the last several years. It has been just over a year since we were sent out as full-time mission builders from Valley Landmark Missionary Baptist Church in Spokane Valley, WA.

Over the last few years, my wife and I have been praying for God's direction in our lives. We believed we were being called to the building ministry. I have worked in the construction field my whole life, but I was never satisfied. I always felt there was something more. I was soon to find out why. I had spent many years trying to avoid God's voice and do life under my own power. Five years ago, God showed me that I was not going down the path He had for me, and that hit me like a sack of bricks. On a Tuesday night, I asked God to use me however He needed and that my answer would always be yes when he called. I remember that because on Wednesday, I came home and told my wife we were going to church. She said, "We don't go to church on Wednesdays". I said, "We do now", and we have not looked back.

My first building trip was to Africa in February of 2023, specifically Lodwar in Kenya. I helped build a church 1 1/2 hours outside of town and a dormitory for the bible school at the church in town. This trip was such a blessing and solidified that this is the work the Lord was calling us to do. Since then, I have traveled internationally on 6 different projects and to 8 different projects within the United States. My wife has been on 3 Macmed trips and was just recently able to come with me on our most recent project in Mt. Pleasant, TX, with my youngest daughter and son, where we helped



the Macedonian builders with a shop for the REACH trailer.



In Honduras and Thailand, we went to help build churches and dormitories at bible schools. We have also helped the California Chapel Builders in Porterville, Hayward, and Ceres, CA, as well as the Macedonian Missionary Services at Cedar Hills church camp in Binger, OK, Overton, TX, Mt. Pleasant, TX, and Hope, Indiana. In San Fernando, Mexico, we were able to help with electrical and drywall, and in Aguascalientes, we were able to help build a baptistry. Everywhere we have been, we have seen the Lord at work. He never ceases to amaze me with His goodness.

The Lord has been calling us in every direction recently. It has been a blessing but also somewhat exhausting, but we wouldn't have it any other way. 1 Corinthians 15:58 says, "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord." We are always looking for churches and people who would like to help support our ministry,



as well as those who are in need of our services. Most importantly, we ask for your prayers. Prayers for continued guidance and strength for us to follow God's path. Pray that God's light will shine through us, and that the work God leads us to do will assist in the salvation of others and further the Kingdom of God here on Earth. Hello! My name is Dylan Sanchez. I am from Houston, Texas, and a member of First Baptist Church of Cave City, Arkansas. Over the past year, Christ has been leading me on a path I did not expect, but one I am very thankful for.

For most of my life, I knew about Christ but was not really close to Him. My relationship with Him was distant. That started to change when my dad invited me to come with him to Colombia. He mainly asked me to come so I could keep my sister company, since she was moving somewhere unknown and new. Even though that was the reason he invited me, I now know the real reason I am here is to help bring people to Christ. Through this step, He has been drawing me closer and teaching me to follow Him in a deeper way.

When I lived in Houston, I had a steady job where I was earning around 2,500 dollars each month. It was not easy to leave that behind, but I knew God was calling me to something greater. I gave up the security of work and income so that I could come to Colombia and serve. Even though it was a big change, I have learned from my dad and through experience that when God asks us to give something up, He provides something better in return.

Now I am in Montería, Colombia, serving with my family. It is a lively and busy city with a lot of culture, but just like any other place, there are struggles and needs. I have been helping with the church by providing English classes, helping with the sound system, and spending time with the youth. All of these things are part of the bigger purpose of helping bring people to Christ. At the



same time, they are also helping me grow in my own faith and learn what it means to trust Him fully.

One of the biggest blessings for me has been how much I have grown personally. I thought I was coming here only to help others, but Christ has been working in my own heart, too. My connection with Him is stronger now. I have been praying more, and I am starting to notice God's work in ways I never did before. I am also very thankful to have my family here and for the support of people around us who encourage and pray for us.

My hope is that our church in Montería will continue to grow and help reach more people for Christ here. I also want to see our teaching classes grow, and our youth group become even stronger. My prayer is that people here will grow closer to Christ and let that change the lives of others in this city.

Since leaving my job in Houston, my financial situation has changed. Right now, I am receiving about 150 dollars each month from my sending church. My prayer is to be able to raise that to around 1,500 dollars so that I can continue serving here full time and focus on the work God has placed before me. If anyone feels led to pray for me or to come alongside me in support, I would be very grateful.

Serving in Colombia has shown me that God is always working. His plans sometimes take us far from what we know, but He is faithful every step of the way. I am thankful for the chance to serve here, to grow in Him, and to be part of what He is doing. My prayer is that His work will continue to grow here in Montería and beyond.





My name is Brandon Rutherford. I am blessed with my wonderful wife, Diana, and our two boys, Eric and Oliver. Together, we are missionary church planters, answering God's call to one of the world's most strategic and influential mission fields: New York City.



"Missions" has always been a part of my life. I grew up on the mission field in Romania, spending 12 years of my childhood there. It was on that field that I not only witnessed the transforming power of the Gospel firsthand but also met my wife, Diana. Since 2012, we have served together in ministry, always with a heart for reaching the lost. We knew God had called us to church planting, but the exact "when, where, and how" remained unclear for years.

That all began to change in 2018. We took a one-week trip to New York City, and during that time God began powerfully stirring our hearts. As we walked the streets, surrounded by millions of people, we were struck by how few had access to a clear, Bible-preaching witness. We couldn't shake the burden. Over the next several years, we prayed and sought clarity from the Lord. In the summer of 2024, God made His direction undeniable. We publicly surrendered to His call and announced that He was sending us to plant a church in Manhattan.



The specific field God has placed on our hearts is Yorkville, a neighborhood on the Upper East Side of Manhattan. Yorkville is compact, just 320 acres, but home to over 86,000 people. And yet, there is not a single Baptist church of any kind in Yorkville. The spiritual need is staggering. While there are a handful of Catholic, Lutheran, and Methodist churches, there is no Bible-believing, Baptist witness. When you zoom out, the urgency becomes even clearer. Manhattan alone has around 1.7 million residents. Across the five boroughs, New York City has a population of 8.8 million people, representing over 150 different nationalities and speaking more than 800 languages and dialects. The entire world has come to one place. And while NYC influences culture, finance, art, and media globally, its Gospel influence is shockingly small.



In Scripture, we see the Apostle Paul strategically planting churches in the great cities of his day, places that shaped culture and commerce far beyond their walls. We believe New York City is one of those cities in our time. If the Gospel can take root here, it can echo out to the nations. Reaching New York can mean reaching the world.

This is why we are going. But we cannot do this alone. We need prayer partners and people committed to interceding for our family and for Yorkville. We also need financial partners, churches, and individuals who will invest in the work of planting a true Gospel-preaching church where few currently exist.



The need is urgent. The time is now. We invite you to join us, not just as supporters, but as partners, in the mission God has set before us. Together, we can see lives changed and eternity impacted in New York City.
