



"Jesus Calls Us; O'er the Tumult" Restoration (H 550)






Jesus calls us; o'er the tumult Of our life's wild, restless sea, Day by day his clear voice soundeth, Saying, "Christian, follow me;"

"Christian, love me more than these."
















First Reading


Jeremiah 8:18-9:1

Is there no physician there?


Why then has the health of my poor people not been restored?

1 Timothy 2:1-7


First of all, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. This is right and is acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For





there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human, who gave himself a ransom for all -- this was attested at the right time. For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.



Luke 16:1-13

Jesus said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. So he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management, because you cannot be my manager any longer.' Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me?


Luke 16:1-13






The Nicene Creed


As the Celebrant stands, the congregation is invited to stand and say together:





We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.








Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven. by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary and was made man.


He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.










Prayers of The People

Lord, grant your healing grace to all who are sick, injured or disabled, that they may be made whole.






Grant to all who are lonely, anxious, or depressed a knowledge of your will and an awareness of your presence.






Mend broken relationships, and restore to those in distress soundness of mind and serenity of spirit.






Sustain and support those who seek your guidance and lift up all who are brought low by the trials of this life.




CONFESSION OF SIN




Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.






Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.





We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.








The Great Thanksgiving


In fulfillment of his true promise, the Holy Spirit came down from heaven, lighting upon the disciples, to teach them and to lead them into all truth;

Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name.















On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said,






Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.











After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said,

Christ will come again.







The bells are rung three times after the "Great Amen" as a reminder of the importance of the congregation's assent and affirmation of the Eucharistic Prayer.








THE OUR FATHER



And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray:







And lead us not into temptation. But deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.











All are welcome.








