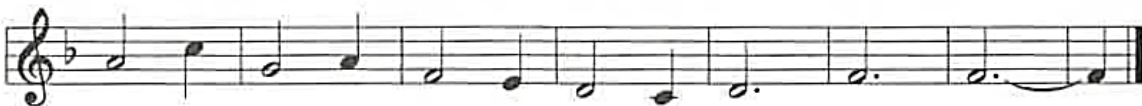

Luke 19:1-10

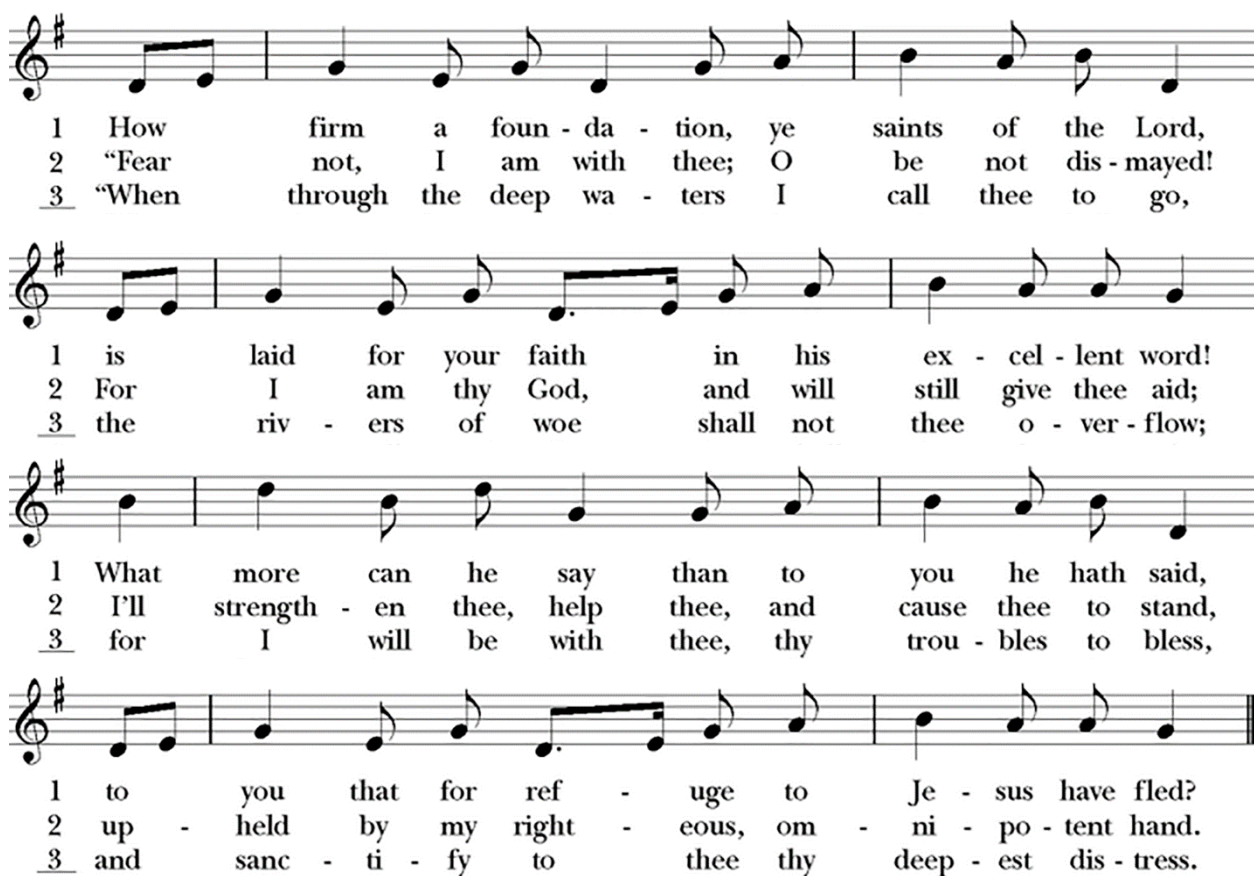
