Speaking of Dubuque, here are some interesting facts regarding the Archdiocese of Dubuque and our Archdiocese:

- In 1837, the Vatican established the Diocese of Dubuque, which held jurisdiction over the Wisconsin Territory, including what would become Minnesota.
- In 1850, Pope Pius IX established the Diocese of Saint Paul, separating the Minnesota Territory from the Diocese of Dubuque. The new diocese encompassed Minnesota and parts of what would become the Dakotas.
- In 1888, Pope Leo XIII elevated the Diocese of Saint Paul to an Archdiocese.
- In 1966, the name of the Archdiocese of St. Paul was changed to the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, recognizing the equal standing of both cities and designating the Basilica of Saint Mary in Minneapolis as a co-cathedral.
