

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Did you know? We have two email newsletters to which you may subscribe. To subscribe, call the parish office at 651.774.1585, or subscribe online at stpascals.org/e-newsletter and fill in your contact information.

Pascal's Pulse Weekly E-Newsletter. Get the latest news and event reminders (exclusive content, too!) delivered every Thursday to your inbox. We will also send important announcements such as unexpected building closures and snow emergencies that impact weekend Masses.

Funeral Notifications. When directed by the family of the deceased, we send a notification of the Funeral Mass date and time to those on the subscription list.

Spending time each day listening to Jesus in Scripture. Last weekend in my homily, I suggested a way for you to spend 5-10 minutes each day listening to Jesus speak to you in the Scriptures. The approach is to take each of the Scripture readings for the upcoming Sunday and read them in the days leading up to the weekend:

On Monday, read the First Reading for the upcoming Sunday Mass.

On Tuesday, read the Responsorial Psalm for the upcoming Sunday Mass.

On Wednesday, read the Second Reading for the upcoming Sunday Mass.

On Thursday, read the Gospel Reading for the upcoming Sunday Mass.

On Friday & Saturday, choose one of the Sunday readings to read again, or read another passage from Scripture that you wish to read.

The benefits of this approach to daily Scripture reading are:

- 1. You will be spending time one-on-one with Jesus.
- 2. It makes Sunday Mass more interesting when you have read and prayed with the Sunday Mass readings in the days leading up to the Mass.
- 3. The words sung at Mass for the Responsorial Psalm will be more in your heart and soul because you have read them ahead of time.
- 4. You could make a prediction of what the message of the homily will be.
- 5. A deeper familiarity with the Bible. Just think of all the Scripture passages you will read in the course of a year!
- 6. This approach is doable in 5-10 minutes per day.

Where to find the Scripture readings of the upcoming Sunday: The readings are printed in our bulletin each week for the upcoming weekend. You can also find them online at usccb.org or on other websites by searching for "Sunday Scripture readings Catholic." You can also subscribe to a monthly magazine with the Sunday readings, or else download a free Sunday Catholic Scripture app on your cell phone or tablet. You can also purchase a Sunday Missal, a printed book containing the 3-year Cycle of Sunday readings for Years A, B, and C. Some Bibles also have a list of the Sunday Readings for Years A, B and C in an index in the back of the Bible.

Prayer Intention of Pope Leo XIV for August 2025: For mutual coexistence. Let us pray that societies where coexistence seems more difficult might not succumb to the temptation of confrontation for ethnic, political, religious or ideological reasons.

It's been a busy summer at St. Pascal's.

The second-floor school bathrooms received new commercial toilets and new supply lines. Motion sensor faucets, along with several new sinks, completed the project.

The Conway parking lot surface was repaired and patched.

The brick garbage pen/storage area in the Conway lot has been torn down. It will be replaced with a storage shed. Funds from the Men's Club were used.

Thanks to your wonderful generosity, the Fund A Need Playground project has commenced. Work on the retaining wall is underway. A new fence is scheduled for installation in mid-August, and the project is expected to be completed at the start of the school year.

The school relocated its student office from the parish atrium to a room on the lower level of the school building. They will use Door 1 for their student, parent, and visitor entrance.

Lights in the new school office will be retrofitted with LED bulbs.

Many thanks to Will Senger and his Boy Scout Troop for their improvements to our campus. Will's Eagle Project included repairing and repainting the preschool playground fence. Venting in the area was scraped and repainted, making the area more visually appealing. Will fundraised and paid for materials. We are very grateful for his care and commitment to the parish.
