Reclaiming Sundays: Recover Sunday as a Day for the Lord and Family. During Year 3 of the Archdiocesan Synod implementation for 2025-26, each parish in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis is asked to help families reclaim Sundays. Whatever type of family we have, there are ways each of us can recover Sunday as a day for the Lord and our family. The booklet features monthly themes and practical suggestions for families and individuals in all walks of life to build lasting habits and anchor their week in a joyful, prayerful and restful observance of Sunday. We will continue to offer Small Groups beginning this fall through the spring of 2026 for the implementation of the Archdiocesan Synod. Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). From the time of the apostles, becoming a Christian has been accomplished by a journey and initiation process in several stages. This journey culminates in full union with the Mystical Body of Christ with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist) at Easter. Today, the process is known as the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It takes place within the entire community of the faithful. The OCIA process is intended for people seeking to be baptized or to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. Are you someone, or do you know someone, who...

- Has expressed an interest in becoming Catholic?
- Has a child over the age of seven who has not been baptized?
- Was baptized Catholic as a child, but has not celebrated the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist?

We offer an opportunity to come together in a small group to learn more about our faith. Sessions focus on the teachings and experience of the Church and prepare individuals to celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. There are separate sessions for children or youth. You are welcome to participate in the process with your questions, your insights and your faith story in a warm, accepting setting.
