

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

For people wishing to attend the School Mass on Wednesdays at 9:30 AM, the following procedures are effective as of September 2, 2025:

- 1. All visitors to our building (parishioners, parents, family) need to check in at the school office to receive a visitor badge. Press the intercom button at Door 1 off Conway Street to be admitted into the building by school office staff. Please walk down the hallway to the school office on the 1st floor of the school. Check in to receive a visitor badge, then proceed to the church for Mass. Please check out at the school office before you leave the building.
- 2. Parish weekday Masses are 8:00 AM, Tuesday-Friday, all year round.
- 3. There will be two Masses on Wednesday mornings during the school year: the 8:00 AM Parish Mass and the 9:30 AM School Mass.
- 4. For all Parish Masses, please enter the building through Door 3 as you currently do for weekday and weekend Masses. (Dated: September 7, 2025)

The Parish Pastoral Council discussed the following topics at the September 2, 2025 meeting:

**Building Security:** Father John discussed the new procedures for visitors to School Mass. Visitors to the School Mass will check in at the school office and then proceed to the church for the Mass. There will be two Masses on Wednesday mornings: an 8:00 AM Parish Mass and a 9:30 AM School Mass.

Parish Financials: Financial support of our parish was strong in July and August.

## Parish Facilities (summer projects):

- Eight new toilets and seven new motion-activated faucets on the second floor of the School were installed.
- The new fence and retaining wall for the parish playground were completed.
- The rain garden wall on Third Street, damaged by an auto accident, was repaired; the driver's auto insurance covered the repairs.
- The Women's Club plaques were installed in Brioschi Hall.

## Updates from liaisons to parish groups and committees:

**Parish Activities Committee:** National Night Out in August went well, the weather was fantastic, and a large crowd attended.

Liturgy/Choir: Choir rehearsals start the week of September 7.

**Archdiocesan Synod Implementation:** Small groups will be starting in October; information on Reclaiming Sundays is available in a booklet in the kiosk with monthly themes and practical suggestions for families and people in all walks of life to build lasting habits and anchor their week in a joyful, prayerful and restful observance of Sunday, and inserts on the monthly themes will be included in the bulletin throughout the year.

Social Justice and Caring Committee: Our parish hosted the East Metro "Defend Federal Funding for Housing" meeting on June 18, and the event was organized and promoted by Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative, a postcard campaign for defending federal funding for housing was conducted at our church in early August, and the Care for Creation team is planning a visit to the Ramsey County recycling center on September 24.

**Women's Club:** The bi-annual book and media sale was held August 15-17, and the jewelry pre-sale was last weekend.

The next meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council is October 21, 2025.

## An Ignatian Approach to Restoring the Humanity of Migrants

How does our faith call us to accompany migrants, who face kidnapping, exploitation, and criminalization? Fr. Brian Strassburger, SJ, Director of the Del Camino Jesuit Border Ministries based in Brownsville, Texas, will talk about the dynamic of migration on the U.S. - Mexico border and in cities throughout the country. Fr. Brian will also offer practical suggestions for stopping the dehumanization of migrants. The talk will be livestreamed or you may come in person. ## **Protection of Children, Youth and Vulnerable Adults**

St. Pascal's is committed to protecting children, youth and vulnerable adults in all parish activities and sponsored ministries. All clergy, and parish, school and archdiocesan employees, as well as all volunteers who have either regular or unsupervised interaction with minors (or with vulnerable adults) must complete the Essential 3 (E3) requirements:

- Background Check
- Code of Conduct
- Safe Environment Training

Once completed, these are recredentialed every three years for those still in active ministry. If you plan to volunteer with youth or vulnerable adults and need to complete the E3, contact Kim Roering, Safe Environment Coordinator, at kim.roering@stpascals.org (651.432.4958).
