

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

We tracked our weekend Mass attendance during October for statistical reports sent annually to the Holy See (Vatican) and the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. Here are the results:

The following topics were discussed at the October 21, 2025, meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council: Merrick Food Distribution: Merrick Community Services requested additional funds from our parish to support our monthly food distribution. Currently, our parish contributes \$400, and Merrick contributes \$600, for a total monthly cost of \$1000. The parish council recommended that we fund the additional \$600 per month for the remainder of this fiscal year from the Family Emergency Reserve Fund. Ideas for future funding include food distribution donations and fundraising. Parish Financials: The Parish Fall Festival on September 28 was a success. The initial estimate of financial profit is \$24,650. Sunday collections in September were below budgeted income, and October collections were above projected income. Parish Facilities: the boiler was recently turned on and the heating season has begun. New parishioner orientation and welcome will take place on Sunday, May 17 and October 18, 2026. Updates from liaisons to parish groups and committees: Parish Activities Committee: Pumpkin Bingo will be on October 24. Liturgy/Choir: the choir season began September 10, and new liturgical ministers are coming forth and will be trained. Archdiocesan Synod Implementation: Small groups are up and running, and the Reclaiming Sunday as a Day for the Lord and Family guide with monthly ideas are included as a bulletin insert and in the Gathering Space kiosk. Social Justice and Caring Committee: The We Care campaign in June collected \$4000+ to benefit Second Harvest, Bridging and Youthprise nutrition program. Women's Club: 55 people attended the wine and cheese event on October 14 for all parishioners in an informal atmosphere for adults and children with conversation, games and prizes. Men's Club: The Booya Sale went well on October 12. The next meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council is December 9, 2025.

Vatican Unveiled

In celebration of the 175th anniversary of the Catholic Church in Minnesota, the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis is hosting Vatican Unveiled, an exhibit of the largest collection of papal artifacts outside of Rome. This unique, historical collection will be hosted daily at Mall of America from January 10 - February 1, 2026. Some of the items will include a document with the second oldest papal signature outside of the Vatican and a Swiss Guard uniform from the time of Pius X so rare that the Swiss Guard asked to borrow it for their own exhibit. The 19,000 square foot exhibit is open and welcoming to all, as people will experience interesting historical perspectives, artistic items with old-world craftsmanship, and papal artifacts that show the humanity behind the leaders.
