

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

A Blessed Christmas and Happy New Year to you from all of us here at St. Pascal Baylon Parish. I pray that the joy of Jesus' birth will fill your heart with peace. Many people around the world continue to suffer the effects of war, violence, homelessness and hunger. We can become overwhelmed by the sad situation of our world and difficulties in our personal lives. In the midst of struggles, we find hope in God's love made visible in the birth of Jesus that we celebrate at Christmas. Jesus came to show us God's love in human form, a visible sign of God's love that embraces all people. You are an amazing parish filled with a strong faith and love for each other and our neighbors, and I pray that during this Christmas Season you will experience once again God's deep love for you.

Thank you to the Women's Club for all their work on the bake sale this weekend, and **thank you to the Men's Club** for all their work on the Christmas Tree sale this season. Also, thank you for hosting Turkey Bingo in November.

At the December 9, 2025 meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council, the following topics were discussed: Merrick Food Distribution: The council discussed ideas for fundraising for our monthly food distribution with Merrick Community Services. Our parish is funding \$1000 each month through June 2026 to provide food for 60 families. The parish finance council will be consulted as this discussion progresses. Lilly Grant: Saint Catherine University received funding through the Lilly Endowment for a 2026-2030 program for parishes and congregations to participate in a partnership for contemplative Christian discipleship. Over the past three years, we have participated in this Lilly Grant program and used grant funds to support our Mardi Gras care card making dinners, the 2025 Growing Through Loss grief speaker series with the Twin Cities East Metro Grief Coalition, a parish Seder Meal in April 2025, the purchase of 100 copies of the book, "Living the Mass" by Fr. Dominic Grassi and Joe Paprocki for our parish small group discussion, and a Celebration of Generosity parish dinner in June 2023. We have an opportunity to renew our participation in this grant program for 2026-30. Parish financials: September collections were above projected income and October collections were below projected income. Parish facilities: the facilities are in good working order; the snow removal season has begun for the parish parking lots and sidewalks. Updates from liaisons to parish groups and committees: Parish Activities Committee: Pumpkin Bingo was well attended in October; the next event is Winter Game Night on Friday, January 23. Liturgy/Choir: the choir and musicians are working on Advent and Christmas music; Adult Faith Formation and Archdiocesan Synod Implementation: a presentation is being planned for February on the topic of liturgical participation; small group discussion materials for Lent are being researched; Social Justice and Caring Committee: parishioners gave a generous response to the parish Donation Closet for November (Joseph's Coat) and December (Giving Tree and Angel Tree); members of our Care for Creation Team toured the Ramsey County Recycling & Energy Center in Newport in November to learn about trash collection, recycling, composting and sustainable waste management practices; parish Beacon Team members participated in the November 25-26 Losing Sleep, Losing Homes all-night vigil at the Basilica of St. Mary in Minneapolis to call attention to the threats to federal funding for supportive housing; Women's Club: the November Craft Exchange went well, and the Christmas Party is December 13; plans are in motion for the Christmas Bake Sale on December 20-21; Men's Club: Christmas Tree sales are off to a good start, and a good crowd attended Turkey Bingo on November 14. The next meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council is January 6, 2026.

Finance Council Meeting—December 5, 2025

- Total Income is higher than last year at this time but Net Income is lower because of one-time expenses paid in October.
- Merrick expenses for the Food Distribution program will continue to be funded by St. Pascal's due to a change from Merrick.
- Part of the cement apron outside the main church door needs to be replaced in the spring. It is currently patched but that won't last.
- A new coffee maker (refurbished) is being purchased and installed in the Brioschi Hall kitchen.
- A temporary electric panel was purchased for the Men's Club Tree Shed. It can also be used for other parish events if needed.
- 2026 Fund A Need ideas were discussed.
- Meeting with Beacon is being scheduled for January to discuss the Aragon project on Ryan Field.
