

I will be on vacation from January 12-22. I will be enjoying some warm weather in Florida. During my vacation, there will be no 8:00 AM weekday Mass from Tuesday, January 13, through Thursday, January 22.

For the weekend Masses on January 17-18, Father Chuck Huck, a retired priest from the Diocese of Crookston, will be here to preside at the Saturday and Sunday Masses. He will speak on behalf of Food for the Poor, which is an ecumenical Christian nonprofit organization that provides food, medicine, shelter and other services to the poor in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Prayers for the people of Venezuela. Many of us are watching the events that are unfolding in Venezuela with the United States' capture of Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro and his wife, Cilia Flores. Reactions from around the world have been mixed. Pope Leo expressed deep concern in his Angelus address on January 4: "the well-being of the beloved Venezuelan people must prevail over all other considerations and lead to overcoming violence and pursuing paths of justice and peace." The Venezuelan Catholic bishops issued a message of accompaniment and closeness with the People of God and urged prayers for the unity of the Venezuelan people. The bishops wrote, "In light of the events that our country is experiencing today, let us ask God to grant all Venezuelans serenity, wisdom, and strength. We express our solidarity with those who were wounded and the families of those who died" (OSV News, January 5, 2026). The Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis has partnered with the Diocese of Guyana in Venezuela since 1970 at the Jesucristo Resucitado parish in Ciudad Guyana. On October 2, 2021, our parish hosted the 50th anniversary celebration of the partnership with a Mass and a dinner program here. The event was attended by many priests and sisters who had served at the Mission, as well as local Venezuelans and Mission donors. The current pastor of Jesucristo Resucitado Parish is Father Greg Schaffer. He is the son of Pat and Rita Schaffer. Father Greg grew up on the East Side of St. Paul and attended St. Pascal's Grade School and St. Bernard's High School. He was ordained a priest in 1994, and his first assignment was Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish in Maplewood. He was then assigned as the pastor of Jesucristo Resucitado in 2000. Let us keep the people of Venezuela in our prayers.
