

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

January 25-31, 2026, is National Catholic Schools Week, which is an annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States.

St. Pascal Baylon Parish School closed on June 30, 2019, and St. Pascal Regional Catholic School opened on July 1, 2019. The Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis asked our parish to host St. Pascal Regional Catholic School on our parish campus. In 2022, St. Pascal Regional Catholic School joined Ascension Catholic Academy, which is a consortium of four Catholic schools. Ascension Catholic Academy provides centralized leadership, governance and financial sustainability for the four schools.

In 2024-25 at St. Pascal Regional Catholic School, 113 students were enrolled in Kindergarten - 8th grade. 80% were students of color (Latino, African Immigrant, African American, Asian), 20% were English language learners, 69% met the federal criteria for free or reduced lunch, and 72% were Catholic.

St. Pascal Baylon Church provides the following financial support to the school:

- a) Our parish does not charge a rental fee to the school for the use of the school building;
- b) Our parish provides ongoing maintenance and repair of the school building. In 2024-25, this cost was \$26,543.00.
- c) Our parish pays the school's portion of our building mortgage. In 2024-25, the school's portion of the mortgage was \$91,031.00.
- d) Some parish staff time involves support of the school. Portions of clergy and maintenance salaries are estimated at \$43,717.00.
- e) The parish and school each pay 50% of the utility costs of the building electricity, natural gas, water, garbage, composting, lawn care, snow removal, and HVAC (heating, ventilation and air conditioning) maintenance.

Catholic schools share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with children throughout the entire school day. Catholic schools give students a chance to incorporate their faith into all facets of their studies, social interactions, recreation, and daily activities. Children bring home the faith practices, lessons and prayers they learned during the school day. I believe a strong Catholic school and a strong Catholic parish enhance one another. FAITH FORMATION**Order of Christian Initiation of Adults****Baptisms taking place at Easter Vigil 2026**

This year there are a few young people who are preparing to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation) at the Easter Vigil. Two have participated in our faith formation process on Wednesdays, and two others attend St. Pascal Regional Catholic School.

Parishioners may recall that in past years when we have had adult catechumens and candidates, special rites have taken place at weekend Masses, including the Rite of Entrance into the Catechumenate, the Rite of Election or Enrollment of Names, and Scrutinies (Penitential Rites). As we only have young people of catechetical age involved this year, adaptations have been made in accord with the OCIA. The Rite of Entrance is taking place within smaller groups of faith formation and school peers. The Rite of Election is optional for this group so we will not be celebrating that. The penitential rite will also happen in smaller groups.

These young people will be celebrating the sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Please hold them in prayer as they continue their journey of study and prayer.

Protection of Children, Youth and Vulnerable Adults

St. Pascal's is committed to protecting children, youth and vulnerable adults in all parish activities and sponsored ministries. All clergy and parish, school and archdiocesan employees, as well as all volunteers who have either regular or unsupervised interaction with minors, (or with vulnerable adults) must complete the Essential 3 (E3) requirements:

- Background Check
- Code of Conduct
- Safe Environment Training

Once completed, these are recertified every three years for those still in active ministry.

No/Low-Tech Sundays and Prayer

“Sometimes we prove hard of heart and mind; we are forgetful, distracted and carried away by the limitless possibilities for consumption and distraction offered by contemporary society.”

The endless distraction of smart phones is well known. A device marketed to unite and connect has in many instances had an alternative impact. Create space in the interior of your heart to receive the blessing of God by turning off the distractions.

SAMPLE ACTIVITIES FOR FEBRUARY:

- Turn off phones during dinner or all day.
- Stow devices or commit to not responding to emails, or engage in social media-free Sundays.
- If you choose to lessen media, try replacing that time with playing family games or reading books aloud together.
- Ash Wednesday is February 18, 2026. Incorporate some kind of technology fast in your family's Lenten plan. Adults — lead by example!
- **Liturgical Living:** Attend Stations of the Cross at your parish or pray a family-friendly version at home. (Start with 14 lit candles and extinguish one after each station.)
- Recommended resource to assist in building habits of prayer is the Hallow App.
