FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

On Sunday, March 22, at 3:00 PM, you are invited to the Closing Prayers for the 40 Hours Eucharistic Devotion at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, 840 Sixth Street East, St Paul. The people of Sacred Heart Church invite us to this celebration of their concluding prayers for their 40 Hours Devotion, which will include music, singing, a procession inside the church, Scripture readings, a short homily, and benediction. This liturgy is a good way to meet and encounter our brothers and sisters at Sacred Heart. Over the past two months, you have been generous with your prayers and financial support for food and rental assistance. Their March 22 celebration of 40 Hours Closing Prayers would be a good way for us to celebrate Eucharistic devotion with them and show our support through shared worship. Come and join as you are able.

At the March 3, 2026 meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council, the following topics were discussed:

The 2026 Fund-A-Need project was discussed, and a letter will be sent soon to all parishioners with information about the project.

Sacred Heart Parish is grateful that our parish will send the funds from our We Care collection during March to their parish for rental assistance for their parishioners.

Parish financials: Our projected income for Sunday giving is on budget for the year; the expense for snow plowing is higher than budgeted due to large snowfalls in December and January; work to fix recent leaks from the flat roof over the Gathering Space caused by thawing, melting and draining of snow and rain is being done; the parish budgeting process for fiscal year 2026-27 starts soon.

Updates from liaisons to parish groups and committees:

Parish Activities Committee: The next event to plan is Spring Family Fiesta scheduled for Saturday, April 18.

Liturgy/Choir: The choir and musicians are practicing Lent and Easter music and preparing for the Triduum liturgies on April 2-5.

Adult Faith Formation and Archdiocesan Synod Implementation: The Adult Faith Formation Team is planning the Parish Seder Meal scheduled for March 28.

Social Justice and Caring Committee: Plans to host a Sunday, March 15, Stations of the Cross in Solidarity with Immigrants, Migrants and Refugees are underway; the Care for Creation team is working on plans for Earth Day in April, and the Beacon team is working with the Beacon Collaborative on priorities for the 2026 Minnesota legislative sessions.

Women's Club: The fish fry Bake Sales are going well; many people enjoyed the puzzle and game exchange in February.

Men's Club: At their February meeting, the Men's Club discussed the annual Men's Club financial disbursement requests; preparations are in full swing for the Lent Fish Fry dinners.

The next meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council is April 7, 2026.

Prayer Intention of Pope Leo for March 2026: *For disarmament and peace.* Let us pray that nations move toward effective disarmament, particularly nuclear disarmament, and that world leaders choose the path of dialogue and diplomacy instead of violence.

Donation Closet: Merrick Community Services March Food Drive

Any donations are appreciated, but the top five appropriate items that our community needs are listed below. Most of these items cannot be ordered from the food banks that are the backbone of the food shelf network. Any of these items will be appreciated by those we have the privilege of serving:

1. **Cooking oils and vinegars** (Canola, olive, chili, and sesame oils, rice vinegar, Mirin and any other cooking oils or vinegars).
2. **Spices** (Dried chilies of all varieties, cumin, coriander, curry, garlic, ginger, turmeric, thyme, Cajun seasoning, bay leaves, cloves, nutmeg, cardamom, star anise, all spice, sage, and other spices).
3. **Cooking Sauces** (Tamari, soy sauce, fish sauce, tamarind paste, fermented bean pastes, chili pastes, coconut milk, oyster sauce, garlic chili sauce, Sriracha or other broths and sauces).
4. **Proteins** (Almond butter, cashew butter, Spam, tuna, sardines, smoked eel, canned chicken, smoked salmon, or any other shelf stable proteins).
5. **Grains** (Jasmine rice, basmati rice, Apple Brand sweet rice, Kokuho rice, Nishiki rice, artisan egg noodles, rice noodles, Soba noodles, corn flour, other flours such as almond flour or any other grains).

Items will be collected through March 29.
