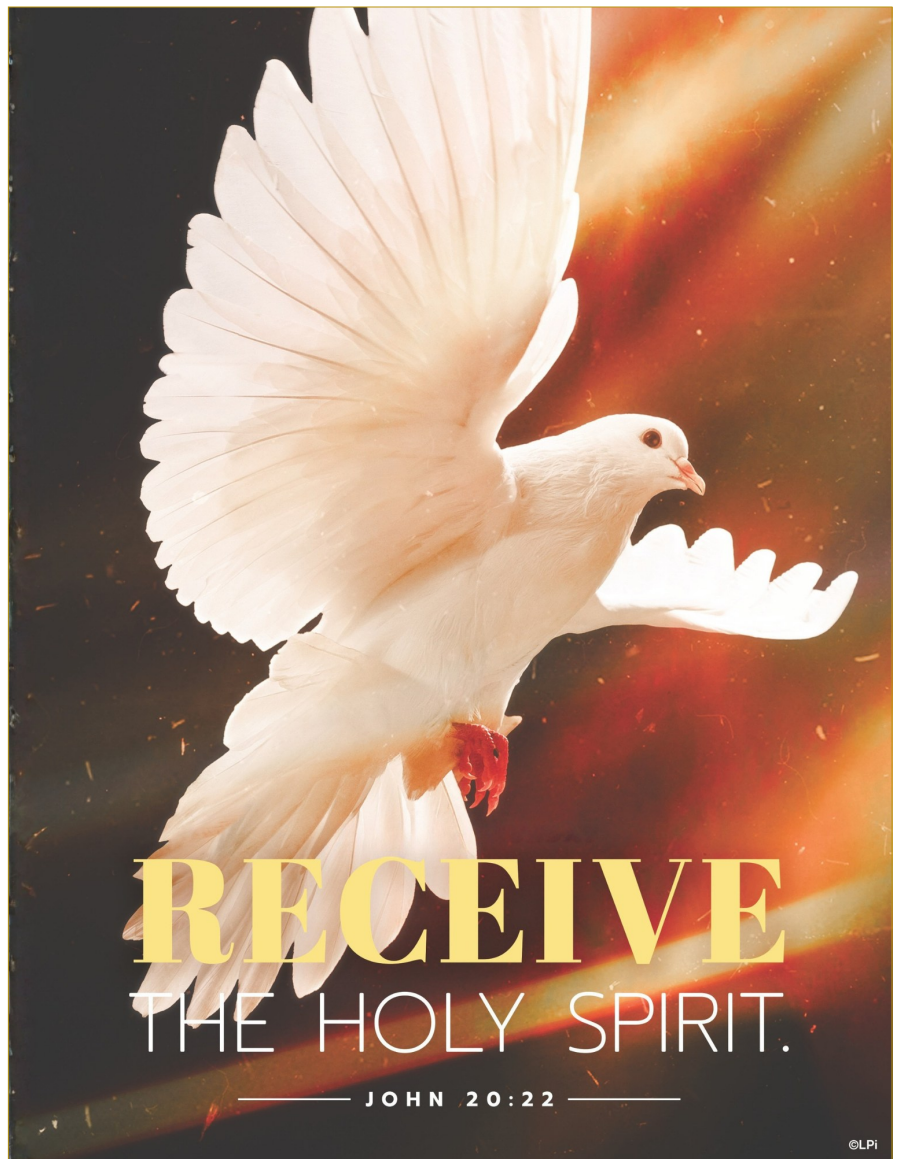

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

We will celebrate Mass on Monday, May 25 at 8:00 AM. All are welcome. May 25, 2026 is my 30th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood, so I wanted to celebrate Mass here that day. I thank God for my call to the priesthood and for the gift of serving as your pastor at St. Pascal Baylon parish.

Memorial Day is Monday, May 25. The primary meaning of Memorial Day is to mourn and honor all American military personnel who have died while serving in the Armed Forces. The day was originally known as "Decoration Day," and the tradition began in the years following the Civil War of decorating fallen soldiers' graves with flowers and wreaths. In addition to honoring our military personnel who have died while serving, many people remember their departed family members and friends on Memorial Day. Here is a prayer for a visit to a loved one's grave. The prayer can also be used whenever you pray for your loved ones.

Prayer When Visiting a Cemetery

Loving God, I pray for my loved ones (mother, father, grandparents, brother, sister, child, friend) who lie here in rest. They have passed from death to life in company with the Lord Jesus. May you welcome them among all the saints of heaven. Jesus said to his disciples, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father's house, there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be. Where I am going you know the way." Thomas said to him, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:1-6)

Our Father... Hail Mary... Glory be to the Father...

Good and gracious God, look kindly on your servants (mention the names of the people for whom you are praying) who have departed this life. Count them among your saints for evermore. Amen.

We Care Campaign

The weekend of June 6 - 7, 2026

St. Pascal's parish will gather the loose change and bills from the collection and donate them to the Social Justice and Caring Committee's next We Care Campaign. The two options chosen by the committee for its summer Campaign are:

Option 1: Accola

Accola grew out of the work of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet. Accola responds to the community's needs by addressing pressing issues with empathy and action. Its work is driven by a quest for justice, with all of its core activities contributing to more equitable communities. Some of its work includes the *Learning in Style School* (providing education for adult immigrants), *Sarah's: An Oasis for Women* (a safe home for immigrant women healing from trauma) and *Wisdom Ways Center for Spirituality* (which explores the intersection of spirituality and the pursuit of social justice).

Option 2: The Free Book Buggie

The Free Book Buggie is a local non-profit organization that donates free books to children to ignite a passion for reading. It works with community partners to deliver books to children where they live. It has provided books to children at several of the parish's National Night Out events. We encourage you to make a personal contribution as well, using the envelope provided in the packet of envelopes sent by the parish, or those found on the tables near the church entrances. If you prefer to give to one or more of these charities, please indicate this on the envelope, and your contributions will be distributed as requested. Any unmarked contributions will be divided equally between the two options.
