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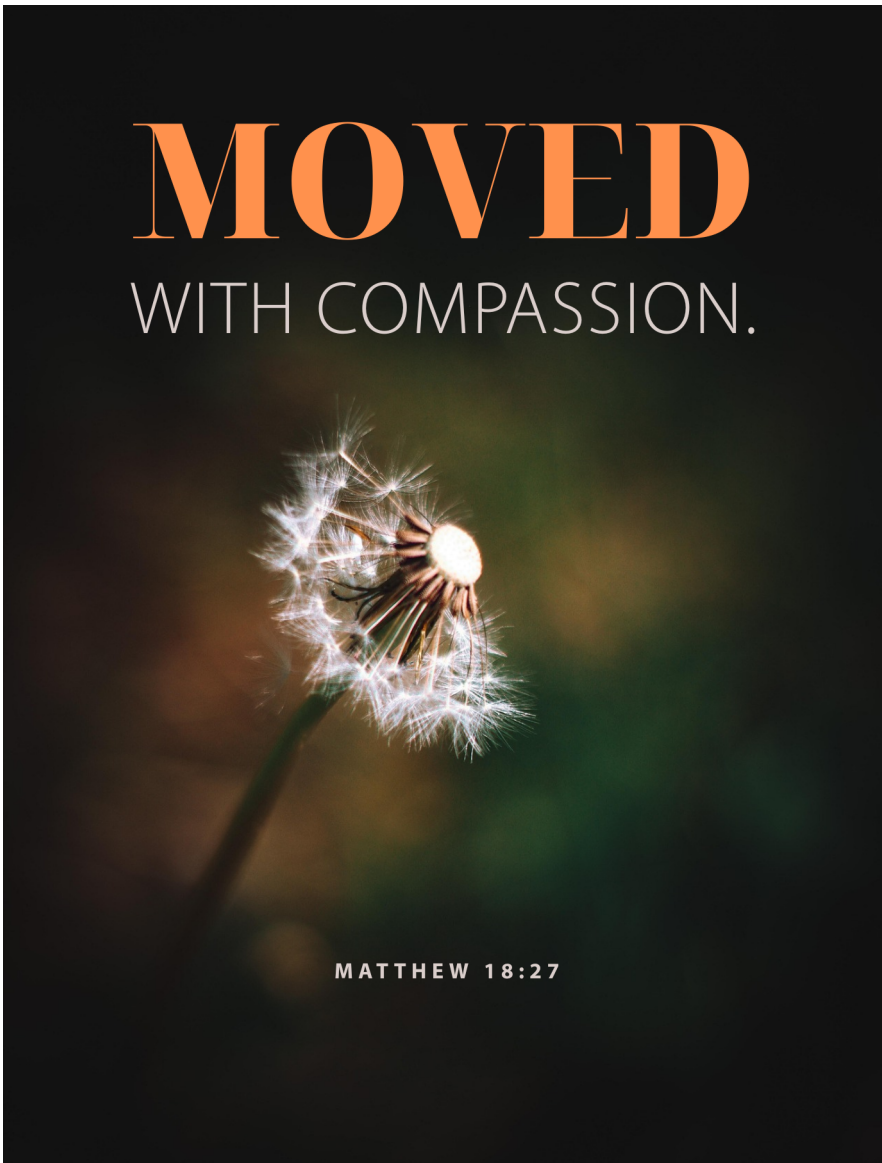

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Archbishop Fabre Encourages All To Be 'Builders of Communion' and Ensure That Innovation and Development Benefit All. This Labor Day, "let us foster an economy that values the God given dignity of each person," said Archbishop Fabre, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, in a statement released ahead of Labor Day. Echoing Pope Leo XIV in *Magnifica Humanitas*, Archbishop Fabre offers the Catholic Church's fundamental commitment to sacred human dignity as a hopeful vision amidst a challenging economy, further threatened by artificial intelligence which is already impacting the job market. We must build a just economy for all and "listen to the experiences of workers, families, young people and communities of color as they struggle to find stability," he says. He offers encouragement saying, "As new technology reshapes our economy and our work, let us be 'builders of communion,' ensuring that innovation and development is for the benefit of all, not just a few, and that each person can contribute to the Kingdom of God through their work."
