THE HARD FACTS:

Crime:

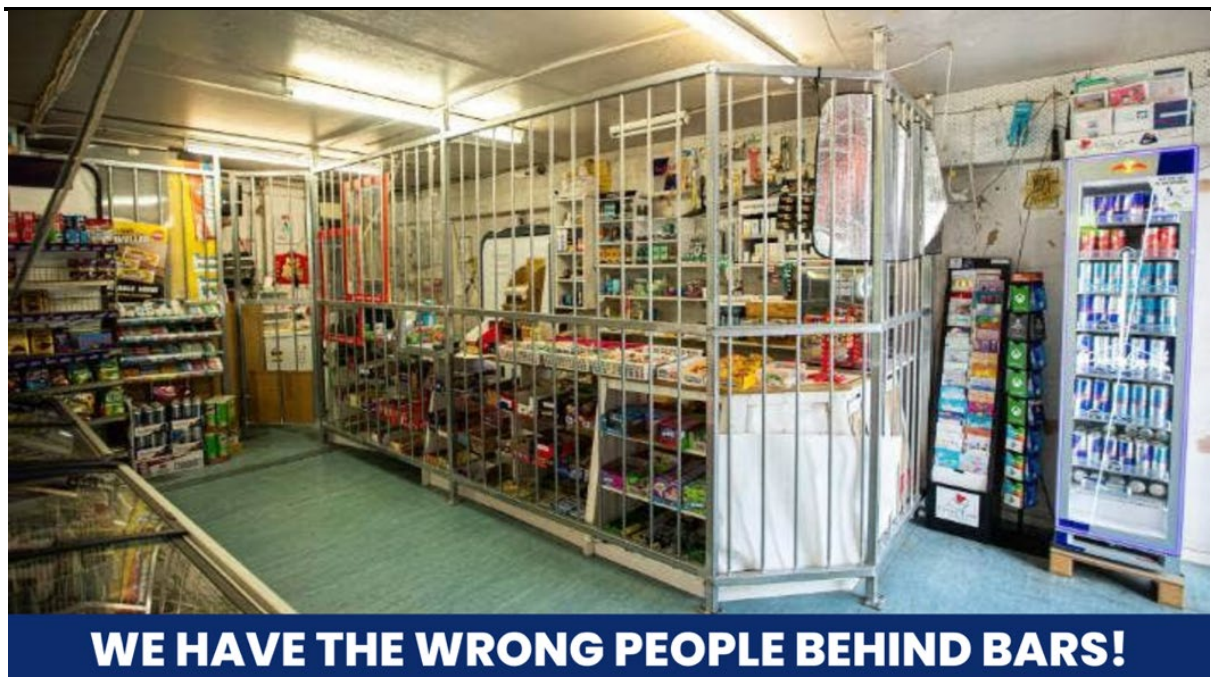
- Ram-raids have risen by 653% (119 in 2017, 896 in 2022).¹
- Homicides have risen by 68%.²
- Domestic Violence has risen by 48%, with a shocking 175,573 cases in 2022.²
- Gang Members have increased by 71%.²
- Police response times have doubled and include wait times of more than 100 minutes to some parts of Auckland – an increase of more than an hour.²

Our justice system has collapsed:

- Wait times for civil cases to be heard in court have doubled
- Wait times for criminal cases to be heard in court have increased by 23%, with an average wait time of 584 days (that's over a year and a half).
- Our legal aid system is collapsing – in 12 months over 20,000 people were turned away from legal aid lawyers.

And let's not get started on our prison system:

- 94% of NZ prisoners are men. We have a man problem!
- Māori are overrepresented in our prisons. They make up 15% of the total population yet 67% of female prisoners and 55% of male prisoners are Māori.
- Prisoners accessing rehabilitation programs has dropped by 44% with only 29% of prisoners in rehab programmes.
- While the prison population has decreased by 24%, violent crime has increased by 21%
- 40% of NZ's male prisoners are back behind bars within just 2 years. They are not being rehabilitated.

National & ACT have failed us too!

National Party holds no promise for the future as they propose more of their reheated boot camps for youth offenders, which have already been proven to fail as 84% of youth who participated, went on to still re-offend.³ National Party also are proponents of deflecting 'The Māori Crime Problem' back to Iwi and wiping their hands of all responsibility. Their policies are out of touch and crafted by ex-boardroom CEOs, academic ideologies and professional politicians who have no idea about the people causing the problem.

The **ACT party's** claims to "smash gangs" seem more like empty rhetoric than concrete action, raising concerns about the potential for street conflicts between police and gangs under their leadership. Youth workers we have spoken to, express their apprehension, noting a lack of street awareness in ACT's policy approach, which appears to be more focused on academics than on-the-ground realities.

BOLD RESOLVE:

CONFRONT 'THE MĀORI

CRIME REALITY' HEAD ON



It's time for everyone to admit that we have a major Māori crime reality in New Zealand. At the outset, it's important to note that the real criminals have been politicians and greedy Māori elites who have not allowed money to get to where it's needed, so Māori could be offered a hand-up, not a handout! It's become almost 'taboo' for the community to talk about and address this issue head-on at the risk of offending Iwi and outspoken Māori elites. Instead, many of the political parties want to just deflect 'The Māori Crime Reality' to Iwi and marae with Kaupapa Māori initiatives.

The Labour Māori Caucus has had billions of taxpayers' money to spend over the past five years, yet it's difficult to track where this money has been spent in meaningful ways that have improved results for Māori. Instead, much of these funds have been funneled to their friends, the greedy Māori elites.

Yet, the facts remain. Māori are disproportionately represented across every negative statistic in society and in relation to law & order. We must boldly confront this reality:

- 80% of Māori women will experience family violence in their lifetime ⁴
- 71% of admissions to Youth Justice residences are Māori ⁵
- 64% of admissions to Care & Protection residences are Māori ⁵
- Māori children have high rates of hospitalisation due to assault, neglect, and maltreatment ⁵
- Māori children are six times more likely to die from child abuse or neglect ⁵
- Māori are twice as likely to be an offender who has committed a serious crime against a family member ⁵
- Māori are over-represented in prison, with Māori representing 55% of men in prison and 67% of women in prison in 2022. ⁶
- 63% of those under 17 coming before the courts in the last year identified as Māori ⁷
- 65% of youth offenders do not live with their fathers. ⁸ Māori children are the most likely to experience fatherlessness. ⁹
- 77% of gang members identify as being Māori ¹⁰

The good news is, leaders like Brian Tamaki have over 40 years of experience in transforming dysfunctional families, particularly Māori, so he knows what it takes to effect real change.

Freedoms NZ will:

1. Introduce new Transformational Family programmes that are mandatory for everyone on a Jobseeker benefit, and for anyone who has committed a crime.

When the family breaks down, society breaks down. It's time to completely overhaul the foundations within struggling Kiwi families, and re-educate men, women and youth on how a healthy, functional family behaves and interacts, and encourage connection to transformative communities with positive families as role models. Furthermore, it's not only about classroom knowledge; more is grasped through experience than taught.

Those on the Jobseekers benefit will be incentivised to complete proven transformational family programmes. Mandatory participation will also be introduced for those who commit a criminal act.

2. Empower proven and experienced Family Mentors in the community to help Māori families, even if they are outside of what is considered 'Kaupapa Māori'.

We will empower mentors (life coaches) who are trusted by Māori, with the ability to reach right into the heart of family homes and effect real change on a day-to-day basis and disrupt inter-generational dysfunction, and role model better, healthier ways of living life.

3. Funding should not be race-based. End exclusive 'Kaupapa Māori' only directives with funding.

We will end directives across all government departments that stipulate 'Kaupapa Māori' organisations should be prioritised with funding, and instead fairly fund successful results-orientated initiatives that provide prevention, intervention and rehabilitation, like ManUp.

We believe Kaupapa Māori programmes fail, as evidenced by the continued bad statistics we are experiencing for Māori.

Kaupapa Māori directives have been driven by greedy Māori elites within politics and the community where billions are circulating in the Māori economy, with little results on the ground as these elites line their own pockets and favour their friends. No longer should Māori Elite individuals in the community be the gatekeepers to where funding is applied.

END LABOUR'S NONSENSE: LET POLICE BE POLICE, NOT POLITICAL PAWNS!



The NZ public should have a healthy respect for the NZ Police. The Police are intended to be a force, not our friends. Yet, in recent times we've seen the Police Force turned into political pawns.

The government's woke 'policing by consent' ideology has caused Police to lose focus on their primary role of law enforcement. Recent years have seen Police taken away from their normal statutory duties, becoming Jacinda's COVID enforcement squad, border patrol operators and social service providers. In the absence of hardnosed police enforcement, dangerous criminals have run amuck in our communities, to the detriment of public safety and produced a climate for gangs to flourish!

Freedoms NZ will get police back to their key statutory duties and give them the power to enforce the law.

Freedoms NZ will:

1. Reduce Crime levels to pre-Labour government (2017) in our first 180 days!

We will reduce crime levels back to where they were in 2017 before Labour, NZ First and Greens took over the government.

- We will reduce ram-raids by 653%
- We will reduce domestic violence by 48%
- We will reduce homicides by 68%
- We will reduce gang members by 71%

2. Appoint a Minister of Law & Order: with oversight across the Ministers of Police, Justice & Corrections, to improve collaboration, communication and accountability

Our current Police department, Ministry of Justice and Corrections department are in desperate need of a major overhaul and a collaborative approach is urgently required in this next term of government and a new Minister needs to be appointed to ensure the process is smooth with good communication and accountability.

3. Get sworn Police back to **frontline work, and away from social work.**

We will put an end to sworn Police as engagement officers and get sworn Police back to frontline work exercising statutory powers relating to law enforcement.

During the pandemic, 70% of police callouts were related to domestic violence or mental health issues, where they are often required to function as social workers.

Non-statutory work will be passed on to newly appointed Community Safety Units.

Police should also not have to be concerned with ideological agendas in their workplace roles like the transgender agenda or pride activities. Individuals should only engage in these activities in their personal time, not work time.

4. Incentivise Police to have **zero tolerance towards petty crime.**

Petty crime leads to more serious crimes. If our Police stomp out minor crimes like shoplifting, vandalism, graffiti, broken curfews, breaches of liquor bans, disorderly behaviour and more, we will significantly reduce more serious crimes.

No longer should first-time offenders be let off so easily with just a warning. This breeds contempt and a lack of respect towards the Police.

5. Rebuild public trust in the Police Force and **introduce body cams on all frontline Police**

Events over the past few years have eroded public trust in the Police Force. No event more so than the brutal treatment of protestors by Police at the Wellington Parliament occupation.

We will ensure that body cams are introduced and worn by Police so there is an accurate account of Police actions when they engage with the public, and provide the public with trust that Police brutality will not be tolerated. This will create greater transparency and accountability.

6. Initiate an enquiry into **Political Interference with NZ Police affairs during the last two political terms.**

Government officials persist in evading OIA requests and inquiries pertaining to political interference with Police affairs during the last two political terms.

We will launch a comprehensive investigation into this issue, ensuring that the results are publicly disclosed in their entirety, to uphold transparency and accountability to the public.

CRACKDOWN ON CRIME: MAKE OUR STREETS SAFE AGAIN!



As a part of our crime reset, we will make our streets safe again!

It is time to localise what successive governments have centralised when it comes to community safety.

Freedoms NZ will:

1. Protect targeted Community Crime Hotspots: train and fund Community Safety Units (CSU) to enforce curfews, ensure public safety, and provide intervention.

As we refocus the Police Force back to their core statutory work, we will introduce Community Safety Units (CSU) in cities that are crime hotspots throughout New Zealand, Auckland, Hamilton, Christchurch, Rotorua and more.

These CSU will feature strong, robust Kiwi men that will instil a healthy no-nonsense message to any prospective criminal, purely by the stature and presence of the CSU officers.

The CSU will be professionally trained by the Police in matters of negotiation, de-escalation, crisis intervention, social services and more.

These units will undertake the following non-statutory work:

- Local presence as a crime deterrent in the streets of our neighbourhood, school communities, and retail areas.
- These units will patrol in numbers, not as isolated individuals.
- Community engagement, gleaning on-the-ground knowledge from locals.
- Enforcing curfews for roaming youth.
- First responders to domestic violence cases providing immediate de-escalation and social service skills.
- Escalate any statutory duties immediately to Police, ie. arrests.
- Reduce the number of car thefts and burglaries occurring within local neighbourhoods.
- Locals will come to personally know the local CSU in their neighbourhoods and build positive relationships built on trust.

6-MONTH BLITZ: WIPING OUT RAM-RAIDS!



It's time to reset youth crime in our neighbourhoods, that escalated under this Labour government.

Freedoms NZ will:

1. Enforce Youth Curfews: Crime Hotspot Restrictions for those under 16 yrs old from 10pm to 5am for the First 180 Days of our term!

It is essential to prioritize the safety and well-being of youth under 16 years old by enforcing appropriate curfew measures. Being out at night between 10pm to 5am, unless accompanied by their official legal guardians, can put them at risk and potentially expose them to dangerous situations.

By implementing curfew restrictions, we can provide better protection for our young population and reduce the likelihood of them engaging in risky behaviours or falling victim to crime. Curfews also help foster responsible parenting and encourage parents or legal guardians to take an active role in supervising and ensuring the welfare of their children during these vulnerable hours.

Let's work together to create a safer environment for our youth, ensuring they have the opportunity to grow and thrive in a secure community.

In cities where youth crime is an issue, curfews will be implemented for 180 days to see an immediate reduction in youth crime, providing a crime reset.

2. Track Recidivist Youth: Utilise Electronic Monitoring Bracelets for Better Oversight.

Any recidivist youth, regardless of age, will be fitted with an electronic monitoring bracelet for an appropriately determined period of time once they have committed two offences so their movements can be tracked at all times using GPS technology.

Age will not be a barrier to these devices...if they are old enough to do the crime, they are old enough to suffer the consequences.

3. Address the ‘Man Problem in New Zealand’: Introduce a Minister for Men to reclaim masculinity, restore fatherhood and a man’s responsibility for his family!

Fatherlessness and a lack of healthy male role models is a key contributor to youth crime:

- Nearly a third of all Kiwi children grow up in fatherless homes ¹¹
- 65% of youth offenders do not live with their fathers ¹²

Society has downgraded the roles of healthy fathers over the years and the essential role they play in helping young people develop a healthy identity and confidence. You can not arrest or jail away the problem that fatherlessness is causing in society.

We currently have a Minister for Children, a Minister for Women, a Minister for Youth...yet there is no Minister for Men.

It is time to appoint a Minister for Men to ensure we prioritise fatherhood again, restore masculinity to men, and celebrate and empower their valuable roles within the family, encouraging them to step up, not step away from their responsibility when it comes to parenting.

4. Guardian Accountability: When Youth Offend, Legal Guardians Answer in Court!

Parents and legal guardians need to be held more accountable for their supervision of youth under their care. Responsible legal guardians know where their youth are at all times.

There are already legal provisions within our current laws to hold legal guardians accountable through fines, community work and mandatory programmes, but we have developed a culture whereby courts do not enforce these provisions until youth have committed an excessive amount of crimes before supervision orders are issued.

We will ensure that legal guardians are answerable in court at the first offence, not the last possible offence of any youth under 18 years old.

Mandatory participation in proven programmes like ManUp will be actioned.

Community service work will be encouraged for youth and legal guardians working shoulder to shoulder, undertaking work like pothole repairs, roadside clean-ups, and disaster relief work in regions like Hawkes Bay where silt still needs to be removed.

GAME CHANGER: FLIPPING THE GANG SCRIPT IN PRISONS + COMMUNITY!



Gang membership has increased by 71% under this Labour government as they have cosied up to gang leaders, even funding prominent gang leaders.

- In 2018 the Economist reported that New Zealand had one of the world's highest gang membership rates ¹³

Corrections have also lost control of our prisons, they are now run by gangs.

- There are 78 gangs within NZ prisons ¹⁴
- Gangs are currently using our prisons as their recruitment centres, with prisoners fearful they need to be associated with a gang as an insurance policy to safeguard them from harm

Freedoms NZ will:

1. Repurpose the prisons to facilitate our gang exit plans.

Our approach is that we are going to flip the script on what gangs are doing. We will now be the ones to incentivise, recruit and redirect gang members into our highly successful gang exit programs, rather than gangs using our prisons as their recruitment centres. We will starve the gangs of new recruits.

2. Introduce gang exit plans: turn prisons into launchpads for positive endeavours, no longer recruitment centres for criminal activity.

We will turn the prisons into a huge gang exit plan! We will equip ex-gang members towards legitimate prosperity, away from illegal prosperity.

Those not in the gangs will be completely segregated away from gang members. We want to ensure prisoners do not have to be in a gang as an insurance policy.

All prisoners will be confidentially questioned about their gang affiliations as they enter prison, and provided with the option if they choose the gang exit plan pathway, then they will go into a new transformative community within the prison, separated away from gang intimidation.

3. Revamp Prison Rehab: embrace proven programmes like ManUp and other credible organisations!

Under Labour, Prisoners accessing rehabilitation programs has dropped by 44% with only 29% of prisoners currently in rehab programmes.

This is despite massive taxpayer payouts into rehabilitation, like the \$98 million Kelvin Davis announced in May 2019 to tackle Māori incarceration, at a time when he arrogantly declined the free rehabilitation services offered by ManUp and banned ManUp facilitators from NZ prisons.¹⁵ He promised that his \$98m fund would reduce Māori incarceration and recidivism. That was an epic failure and questions are asked as to what this money has been spent on with so few rehabilitation programmes currently offered in our prisons.

The current rehabilitation programmes provided in our prisons have also proven to not be effective, with 40% of NZ's male prisoners back behind bars within just 2 years of leaving prison.

Prisoners are repeatedly contacting service providers like ManUp, desperate for help to change their lives while in prison. These proven programmes should no longer be withheld from prisoners who want to make genuine changes.

4. Tougher sentences for those involved in gang crimes.

Those who are known gang affiliates should do prison time.

As at 31 May 2022, there were 2,686 gang-affiliated people in prison and 4,451 gang-affiliated people on community-based sentences or orders.¹⁶ There should not be so many gang-affiliated people serving community-based sentences or orders, they should be incarcerated.

We will change our laws to ensure gang affiliation = prison time, when it comes to sentencing.

We will ensure there is an increase in immediate arrests for all organised gang crime, including minor offences like illegal motorbike riding, and the immediate dispersion of any large gang gatherings in public spaces.

5. Remove private companies from running our Kiwi prisons

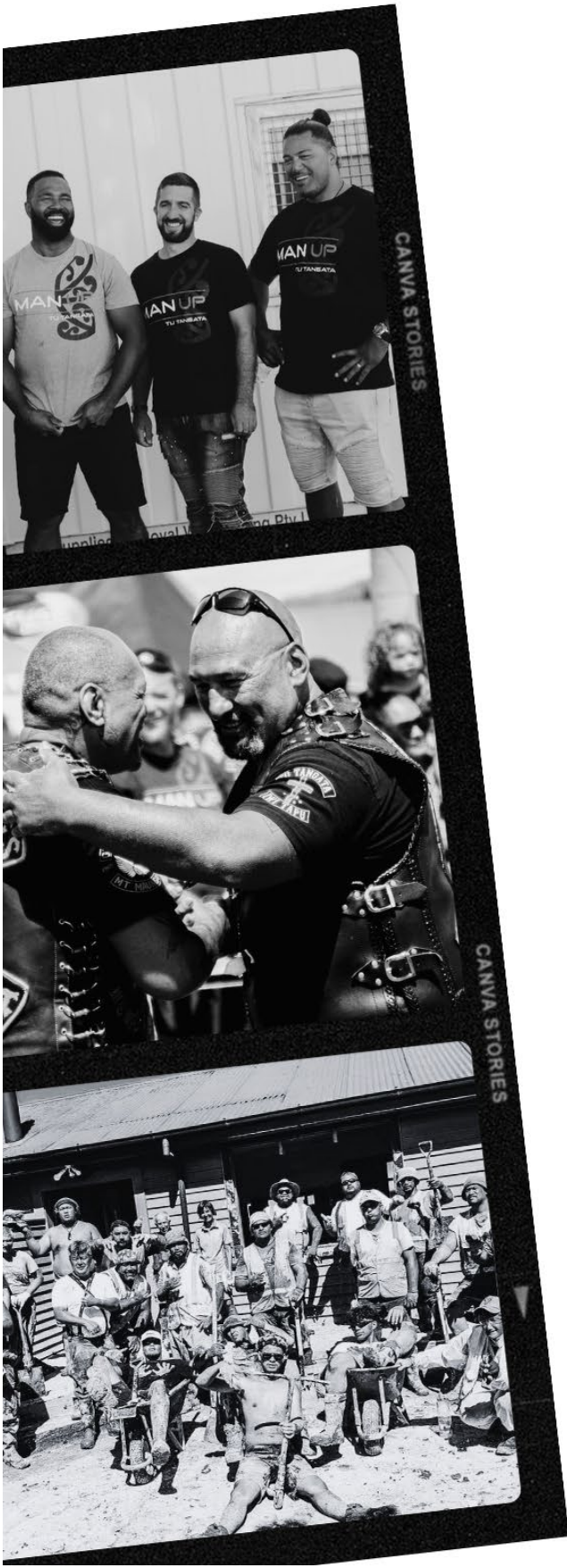
We will end the era of privatized and overseas ownership of our prisons, including companies like Serco. Their commercial interests do not prioritize prisoner rehabilitation, and we firmly believe that rehabilitation and community safety should always be the driving force behind our correctional system.
