


# *I tell you, ask . . . (Luke 11:9)*

you were being too demanding!

true in so many situations. For example, you might never know if your boss will give you a raise unless you ask. Or you might never know what your ailing friend needs unless you ask how you can help him. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about a man who hoped that his neighbor would give him some bread to feed his guest. It was late at night, so he wasn't sure. But he would never know unless he asked! So he knocked on his neighbor's door—and persisted until his neighbor finally got out of bed and gave him what he needed (Luke 11:5-8). Jesus told this parable to encourage us to ask our heavenly Father for whatever we need. Have you ever hesitated in asking God for something? Perhaps you thought you didn't deserve what you were asking for. Or maybe you suspected that God wouldn't answer you—so you didn't bother trying. Maybe you even feared that he would think

Have you ever heard the phrase "You never know unless you ask"? It's



But that's not how Jesus wants us to relate to our Father. He knows that God provides everything that we need, so he wants us to approach him with confidence and make our requests. That's why he taught his disciples to ask for their "daily bread" when they prayed (Luke 11:3). Jesus also knows that by coming to God with our needs, we not only acknowledge our dependence on him, but we also come to know him and trust him more deeply.

Is there something you've been hesitant to ask God for? Or is there something you've asked for in the past and haven't received? Then be like this persistent man who wasn't shy about knocking at his neighbor's door at midnight. Keep knockin g at God's door, and trust that he will give you the bread that you need (Luke 11:9)!

"Father, you are the giver of all good gifts. Help me to be bold and ask for what I need."
