

He must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet.

The kings who ruled over Israel and Judah were charged with defending their people from neighboring enemies who wanted to destroy them. Many kings had failed in this regard, which is why the people were waiting for a Messiah-King, a son of David who would again build a great nation as David had. Then along came Jesus, a Messiah who told people to love their enemies and turn the other cheek. What kind of a king was this?

In today's second reading, St. Paul shows us what kind of king Jesus is—One who has conquered our true enemies: Satan, sin, and death. Jesus didn't come to win a battle between nations; instead, he came to win a cosmic battle with everlasting consequences. That's why we celebrate him today as "King of the Universe."

Unlike an earthly king, Jesus did not engage his enemies with armaments of war. No, he defeated them by dying on a cross. Through his death and resurrection, he saved not just Israel but all who believe in him. Now we are forgiven, redeemed, and given the grace to love and forgive others as he has done for us. And though we still see evil in the world, we know that Jesus will destroy "every sovereignty and every authority and power" when he comes again (15:24).

Today at Mass, let's recommit ourselves to living under the reign of this great King. Let's tell him that we are ready to join him in rescuing his creation from the powers of darkness. Our King has already shown us how to do this: by offering ourselves in love to one another. Because without a doubt, love is the most powerful force in the universe!

"Jesus, King of kings, reign in my heart today and always."

Los reyes que gobernaron sobre Israel y Judá se encargaron de defender a su pueblo de los enemigos vecinos que querían destruirlos. Muchos reyes habían fracasado en este sentido, por lo que el pueblo esperaba un Mesías-Rey, un hijo de David que volviera a construir una gran nación como lo había hecho David. Luego llegó Jesús, un Mesías que le dijo a la gente que amara a sus enemigos y pusiera la otra mejilla. ¿Qué clase de rey era este? En la segunda lectura de hoy, San Pablo nos muestra qué clase de rey es Jesús, uno que ha vencido a nuestros verdaderos enemigos: Satanás, el pecado y la muerte. Jesús no vino a ganar una batalla entre naciones; En cambio, vino a ganar una batalla cósmica con consecuencias eternas. Es por eso que hoy lo celebramos como "Rey del Universo".

A diferencia de un rey terrenal, Jesús no se enfrentó a sus enemigos con armamentos de guerra. No, los derrotó muriendo en una cruz. A través de su muerte y resurrección, salvó no solo a Israel, sino a todos los que creen en él. Ahora somos perdonados, redimidos y se nos da la gracia de amar y perdonar a los demás como él lo ha hecho por nosotros. Y aunque todavía vemos el mal en el mundo, sabemos que Jesús destruirá "toda soberanía, toda autoridad y poder" cuando venga de nuevo (15:24).

Hoy, en la Misa, volvamos a comprometernos a vivir bajo el reinado de este gran Rey. Digámosle que estamos listos para unirnos a él para rescatar a su creación de los poderes de las tinieblas. Nuestro Rey ya nos ha mostrado cómo hacerlo: ofreciéndonos en amor los unos a los otros. ¡Porque sin lugar a dudas, el amor es la fuerza más poderosa del universo!

"Jesús, Rey de reyes, reina en mi corazón hoy y siempre".
