Greater Greenville Scottish Games & Highland Festival 2014, May 23rd & 24th

A Joint Military Salute To The American & Scottish Military

On Friday night the 23rd, the Great Scot Parade and the Ceilidh was held in downtown Greenville at Peace Centers Amphitheater, with *Cleghorn* and *Seven Nations* performing. In the afternoon, we went to Furman University and put up our flags and banner.

Friday night, the Clan Reception was held at the Crown Plaza Hotel. Wyomia and Dale attended. There was plenty of good food and drinks. The colors were presented, and then the Haggis was presented.. Archibald Angus Charles Kennedy, The 8th Marquis of Ailsa, 19th Earl of Cassillis, Chief of Clan Kennedy, spoke to the group. He was the Honored Guest and Chief of the Games. Clan Kennedy was the Honored Clan of the Games. Everybody had a good time.

The Distinguished Guests on Saturday were Senator Lindsey Graham, who was Honorary Chairman, and Butch Kirven Jr., who is a retired Brigadier General, Army National Guard. He is current chairman of the National Guard Association of the United States' Special Building Committee overseeing the National Guard Memorial Building in Washington, D.C. He is also a council member of the Greenville county council.

Military Guests on Saturday were Major General

Robert E. Livingston, Jr., the Adjutant General, South Carolina; Major General Thomas S. James, Jr., Director, Mission Command Center of Excellence, Fort Leavenworth, KS; Warrant Officer Class 2 Gerry McQuade from Glasgow. (McQuade recently returned from another tour of duty in Afghanistan); seven other members of the 2 SCOTS Battalion of the Royal Highland Fusiliers, all of whom had been wounded in combat in Afghanistan; and four units of the state's National Guard. Three of these state units recently completed service in Afghanistan, and one is currently protecting the skies over our Nation's Capital.

On Saturday, we arrived at 6:30 to set up. The Games opened at 8:30 am. There were 46 Clans and Societies present this year. The Heavy Athletic events started on the main field at 8 am. The opening ceremonies were at 10:15. The order of marching began with the Royal Highland Fusiliers, then the Color Guard, The Chief of the Games, The Chief of Clan Kennedy, The South Carolina National Guard Band, members of the South Carolina Army National Guard's Bravo Company, 198th Expeditionary Signal Battalion, followed by the 122nd En Battalion, The Agri-Business Development Team, The 263rd Army Air and Missile Defense Command, members of the 2 SCOTS Battalion of the Royal Highland Fusiliers, the Massed Bands, and the Parade of Tartans. There were many more bands than we'd had in eight years, with 20 participating.



Our tent was close to the vendors. We had several people stop by, talk, and say how good our tent looked. Dianne Lawton, Pat Dacus, Sylvia Adams, Toni Reeves, Blair Kennedy, Michelle Rogers, Maggie Blair, John Blair, Kimberly Blair Wills, and Phillip Campbell, who

is one of our cousins. His grandfather was Wyomia's uncle and Dale's great-uncle. He was a member of the Greenville City Police. A plain-clothes detective, he was shot and killed in the line of duty in October, 1919.



The Great Scot British Car Show was on the grounds, and there was a competition of the EUSPBA Pipe & Drums. We saw the Border Collie Invitational, and Highland Dancing Competition, and the Heavy Athletic Competition. The entertainment tent had music going on all day.

People enjoyed demonstrations in Axe Throwing, Long Bow, Scottish Country Dancing, Scottish Spinning and Weaving, Celtic Harpists, Scottish Fiddlers, Weaponry Re-enactors, and the Wee Scotland area for children. In addition, there was a living history encampment area with Scottish military re-enactor units

of the 1750s.

The closing ceremonies were at 5:00 pm. After, there was a Celtic Jam concert with *Seven Nations*, *Cu Dubh*, *Cu Ruadh-Fire Sword* entertainment, and *Cleghorn* from 6:30 until 10 pm.

Getting Started with Your Family History

Before you can actually start researching your ancestors, you have to determine what information you already have. This includes documents, newspaper clippings, cards, and letters as well as memories of past generations. Many people are surprised when they see how much information concerning their ancestors they already have; I know I was. First a word of caution; take all verbal accounts with a grain of salt. Anything that the older members of the family “remember” may or may not bear any relation to the truth. Your job will be to prove the memories.

1. Gather all of the documents you can find as well as the various kinds of cards and letters people sent each other. Include any newspaper clippings you discover. Make copies of all documents for your own records.
2. Add to your collection copies of pictures of the people who are a part of your family history.
3. Write letters to all of the Parents, Grandparents, Aunts, Uncles, Cousins, etc., that you know, requesting all “factual” information that is available.

Don’t stress the “factual” thing too hard or you might make someone mad who might be the only person who knows a great-grandmother’s maiden name.

4. Interview all members of the family that might remember any information that will support your search for family history. RECORD your interviews. As your research progresses you will find that you have to evaluate the information received in your interviews as well as any information you might have remembered yourself. Memories can mislead us.
5. Start putting your information into a data management system. Some examples are ‘Personal Ancestral File (PAF),’ ‘GRAMPS,’ ‘Legacy Standard,’ ‘Family Tree Legends,’ ‘Myheritage Family Tree Builder,’ ‘Rootsmagic Essential,’ ‘ScionPC,’ & ‘Brother’s Keeper.’ Each of these is free and they all differ in what you can or cannot do with them.
6. Now start your research to fill in the gaps of your documented family. Look first for Primary Sources; these would be original records such as deeds, birth and death certificates, wills, and marriage records. Only after you have exhausted the possibilities of finding what you need in primary records should you go to secondary records; these would be Oral Tradition, published family histories, compiled lists, local and regional histories, and other such items that represent an individual’s compilation of facts in any form.
7. Now share your information with others. Do keep looking. Remember that much of what one finds on the internet is secondary information. That said, there are a number of sites that contain extracted records and if they were done accurately are almost as good as looking at the original paper records.

A Fun Letter from Scotland

(In March, we ran the following photo and an article from Bill Blair of Oregon, and this email came in reply):



Greetings from Scotland,

I trust that this finds you well and that you are indeed the correct person to whom I should write regarding the Blair magazine, which I always read with interest and enjoyment.

I'm not sure if we have ever met on a previous Blair Bash, but in case I need to introduce myself, you can see me on page 2 of the latest edition. I'm the one WITHOUT the haircut!

My reason for contacting you is to suggest two possible Blairs for inclusion in the 'famous' list. They are:-

1. Thomas Blair, whose dates I do not know exactly but he was in Orleans in October 1428 with a company of 20 men at arms and 29 archers. This was the body who were companion of arms to Joan of Arc and he took part

in some sort of ceremony involving Charles VII at Reims. I was present a few years ago at Orleans when a street was renamed after him. (I would suggest that it would do no harm to possibly research him more closely in case I have completely misrepresented him, or left out something important!) [see following story]

2. Isla Blair. A popular actress in UK. [see following story.]

UK Actress, Isla Blair



Isla Blair was born in Bangalore, India, on 29 September 1944. Her father, Ian Baxter Blair-Hill, was a tea planter of British descent. Blair's interest in performing arts first became apparent when, at the age of two, she gave an impromptu singing performance on the boat ride from India to England. She went on to attend the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art to prepare for a career in acting. She is married to fellow actor Julian Glover, known for his role as Walter Donovan in *Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade*, with whom she has a son Jamie. Along with Prunella Scales, Blair and Glover were involved with the expansion of the Salisbury Playhouse.

Thomas Blair in 1428: The Scots at the Siege of Orléans 1428-1429



The friendship between France and Scotland was well known; indeed there had long been an alliance between them more popularly known as the Auld Alliance (Website in French : *Vieille Alliance*). This friendship was forged because the two countries were at

war with England though for different reasons. Charles V was the first king to employ Scotsmen in his bodyguard, but it is principally with Charles VII that the alliance was properly employed by the creation of the first elements of Scot Guards who were maintained by tradition in the King's Household until the 18th century and again under the Restoration.

In 1420, a contingent of 6,000 Scotsmen had disembarked at La Rochelle to assist the Dauphin. John Stewart, Earl of Buchan, the son of the Duke of Albany, regent of Scotland, commanded this contingent. John Stewart was made Constable of France in 1423, after his victory at *Baugé* (1421). He was killed at Verneuil in 1424. He should not be confused with a homonym, John Stuart of Darnley (*see below*).

At the beginning of the siege, in October 1428, Orleans sheltered a strong Scottish contingent appointed by the king, since the accounts of the Treasurer for War, master Raguier, noted the presence of companies commanded by three Scottish knights: William Hamilton, Thomas Houston, John Wischard – alias Oulchard –, and five squires: Thomas Blair, Henry Galoys (Galloway), Edward Lennox, David Melvill and Alexander Norwill.

8th February 1429: important reinforcements led by William d'Albret arrived, with a strong contingent of 1,000 Scots commanded by the brothers John Stewart of Darnley and William Stewart of Castelmilk. Alas, a few days later there occurred the disaster of Rouvray-Saint-Denis, in the open country of Beauce.

9th February 1429: an English supply convoy was sent from Paris towards Orleans under the protection of John Fastolf. A messenger from the Orleans garrison informed Charles de Bourbon, Count of Clermont, who commanded French troops in the region. It was decided that French troops should be assembled to intercept the convoy. The principle commander, Charles de Bourbon ordered that the French captains leaving Orleans should not take independent action without his support. The Bastard of Orleans, Xaintrailles and La Hire, but especially John Stuart, impatient to cross swords, did not wait and hurled themselves on the "goddamns". Behind the improvised defences of wagons and barrels full of fish, the English bowmen awaited the enemy. Demoralized, Charles de Bourbon retreated and resumed his responsibility in this battle. Once more, the impetuous attack of the cavalry cut deeply into the Franco-Scottish Army. The outcome of this fatal day, left among scattered fish on the battlefield, the bodies of

250 soldiers of the French army, including the Stuart brothers. 12th February 1429 is remembered in history under the name of *Battle of the Herrings*.

Nevertheless the renown of the Scottish bowmen was such that they were charged with protecting the relief column from Blois to Orleans accompanied by Joan of Arc, and under the command of Patrick Ogilvy of Auchterhouse, Sheriff of Angus, who held the title of Constable of the Scottish Army in France.
