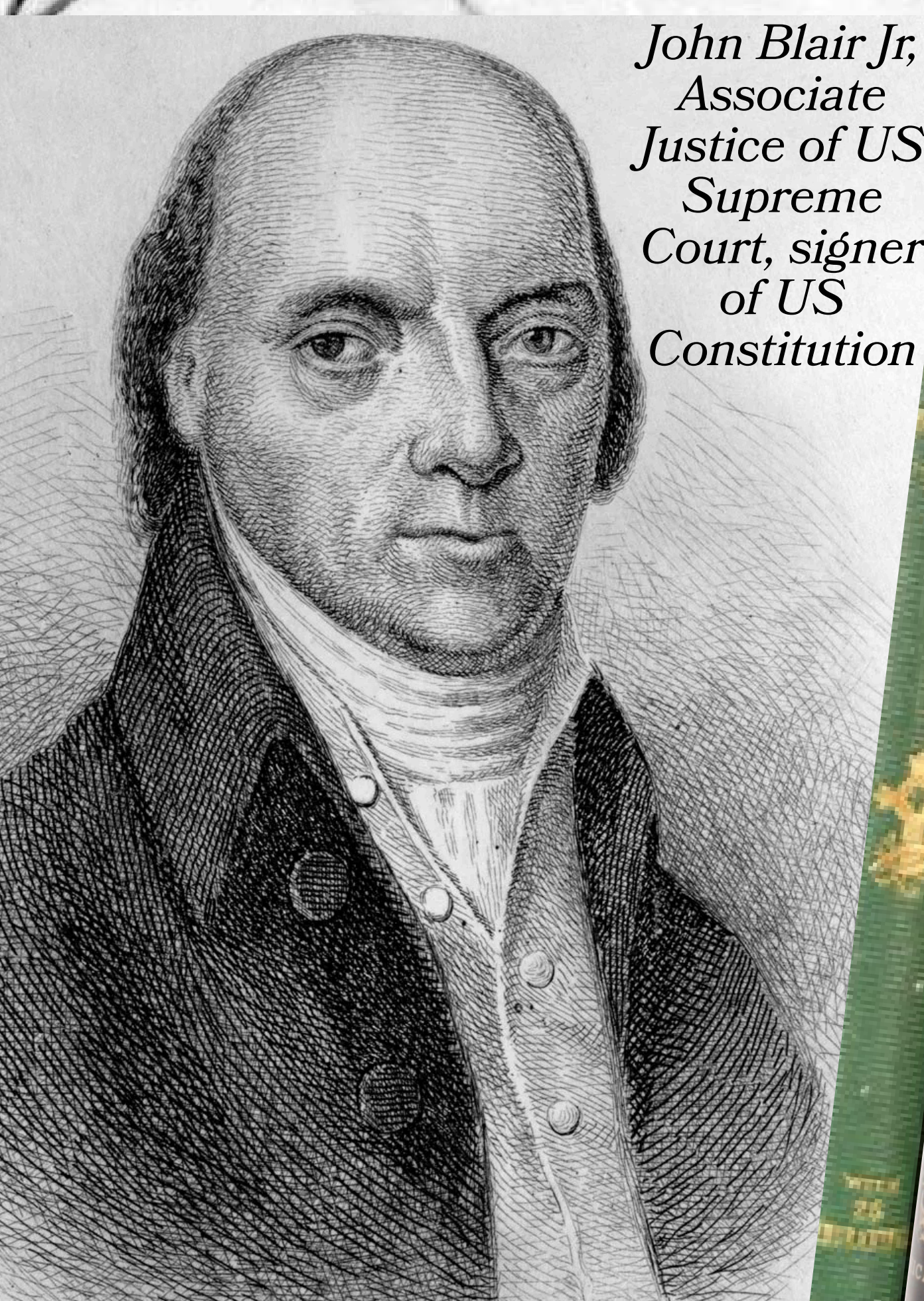
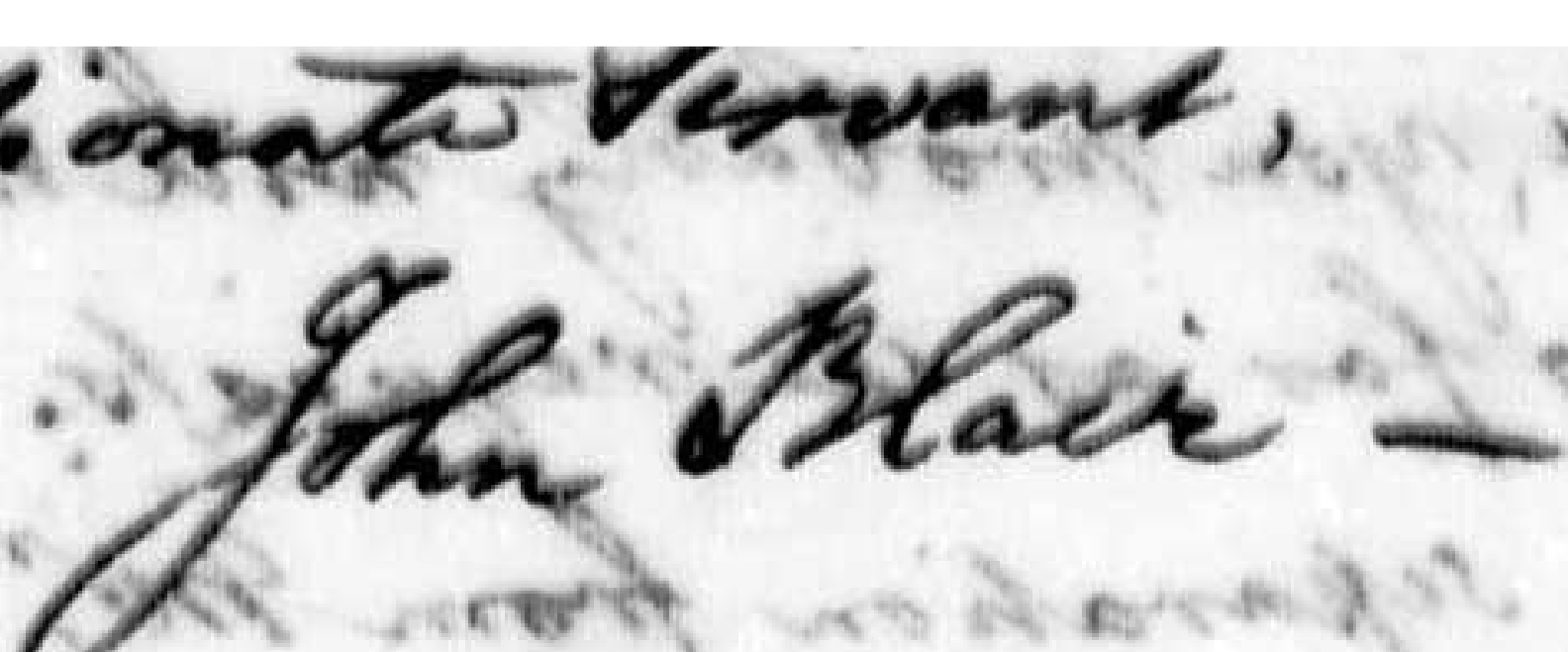

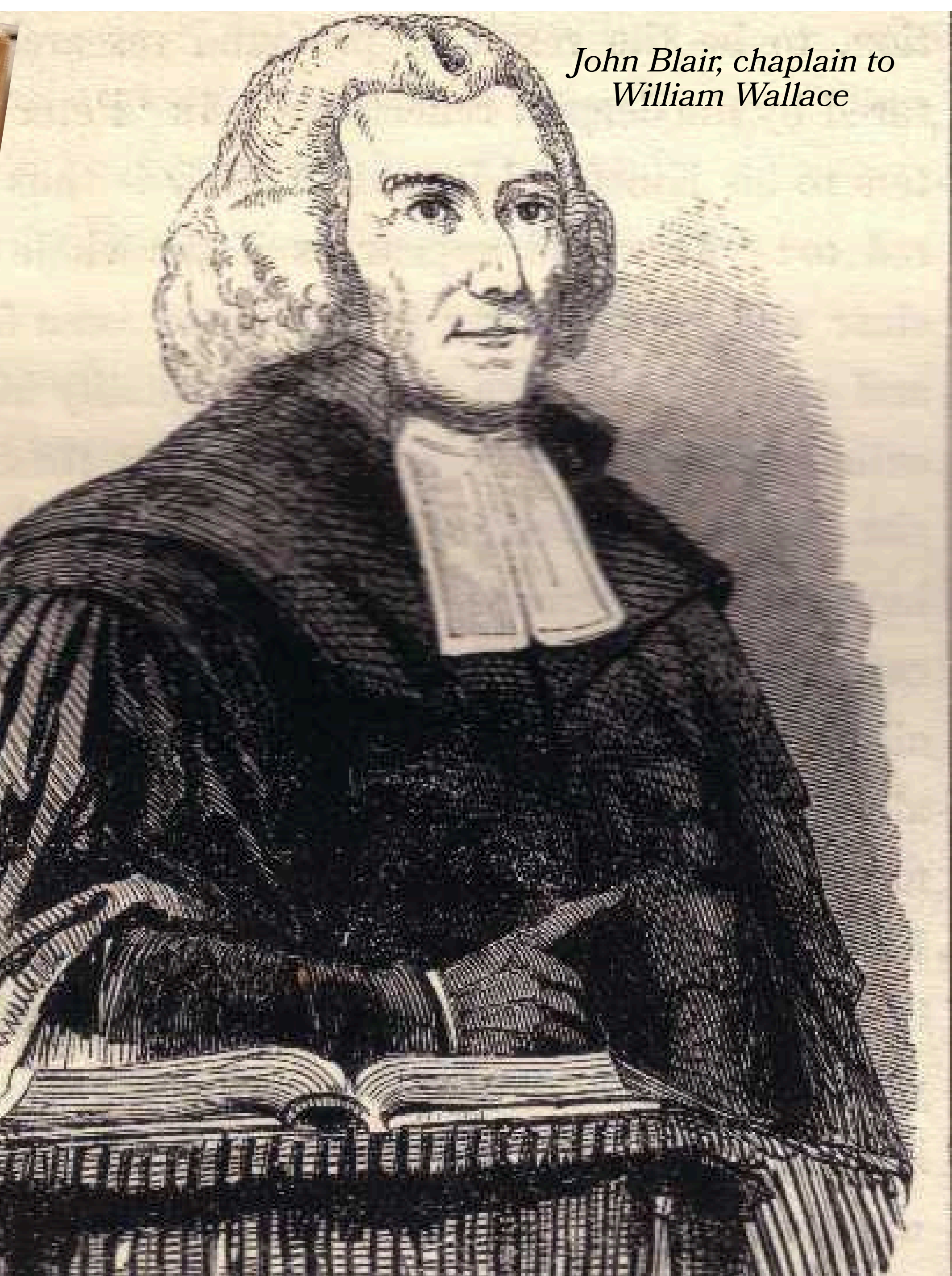

- John Blair, a Benedictine monk, served as William Wallace's chaplain and was also a comrade-in-arms, providing personal and intellectual support.
- James Blair, founder College William & Mary
- Emily Newell Blair, American writer, suffragette, and founder of League of Women Voters
- Robert Blair, the Rev., author of 'The Grave,' a poem, eldest son of the Rev. David Blair, one of the ministers of Edinburgh, chaplain to the king, and grandson of the eminent minister of St. Andrews of the same name.
- Patrick Blair, Scottish surgeon, anatomist, botanist, and fellow of the Royal Society.
- Henry Blair, US Representative
