Per Capita is an annual per member apportionment assessed by the General Assembly, our denomination's governing body, which enables all members to share the administrative costs of sharing God's love. The amount each PC(USA) church contributes is based on its membership as reported to the General Assembly. This is not an optional payment for Calvary Presbyterian Church.

Calvary's obligation for 2025 is \$25,960 \$40 for each member

Please mark your check, "per capita." The funds used to pay Calvary's obligation of \$25,960 are taken directly from the church's operating budget.
