

Rev. Marcella Auld Glass: Light of the World Matthew 5:14-16 Toward the end of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells his disciples to be the 'salt of the earth' and 'light of the world.' How is God calling Calvary to be light for the world? Are we being called to illumine dark paths to make people's journeys easier to navigate? Or to shed light in dark corners where hope is hard to find? What might God be dreaming for us, from our perch in the city on the hill?

The flowers this morning celebrate the birth of Thomas Charles VandenBerg, born October 15 in Denver, Colorado, the fifth grandchild of Rae and Charles Hagner.



Gradually increasing tempo can heighten the sense of joy and power in this psalm.

This engaging paraphrase of Psalm 24 gains much of its energy from the Israeli folk song for which it was written. This territorial connection adds another dimension to a many-layered text that speaks both to the themes of Advent and to those of Christ's entry into Jerusalem.



Long before Isaac Watts began to Christianize the Psalms, Martin Luther had already done so when he created the text and tune for this, his most famous hymn, which is based on Psalm 46. Luther encouraged metrical versions of psalms as well as chanted psalms and new hymns.

WHAT IS PER CAPITA GIVING?

Per Capita is an annual per member apportionment assessed by the General Assembly, our denomination's governing body, which enables all members to share the administrative costs of sharing God's love. The amount each PC(USA) church contributes is based on its membership as reported to the General Assembly. This is not an optional payment for Calvary Presbyterian Church.
