
FARCET COFE PRIMARY SCHOOL MATHS LEADER

TERM 3 CURRICULUM FOCUS: MATHS




Every half term, the Newsletter will have a different curriculum focus. During Term 3, we will be focussing upon maths.









Year 3 have been learning multiples, recapping 2, 5 and 10 times tables .



Year 4 have been learning about factors, factor pairs and product.





Hawking Class
