
YEAR 4 MULTIPLICATION TIMES TABLE CHECK

Goodall Class


This week, Year 1 have been learning to partition two digit numbers.






Luther-King Class


Year 3 have been looking at multiples of 4. Using this knowledge to learn their 4x table, and related divisions.




Year 4 have revisited their formal multiplication method when multiplying a 2 digit by a 1 digit number. They then used this knowledge to multiply a 3 digit number by 1 and 2 digits.

Year 5 have been exploring multiplication and division. They have been exploring different ways to help us solve division problems. One was is using multiples of a given number e.g. times tables list. another is using factors of the number we are dividing by and finally our favourite...short division!

Year 6 have been have been exploring Algebra! At first, they were unsure, but now they are smashing it! They are able to do 1-step and 2-step function machines and they are exploring substitution and solv-5 ing problems using formulas.
