## After School Club



# A Very Successful School Year

Mrs Masi, Mrs Brown and Mrs Wilson (EYFS Reception Teachers) have been working really hard this year to ensure that the EYFS Reception children have had the very best start to their formal schooling. As a



result of their great teaching, our Good Level of Development (GLD) percentage was 87.5%. This was the joint highest pass mark in the whole of the DEMAT Trust! This is fantastic news, since their great teaching will enable the children to continue to flourish in Year I.

# Phonics

We are delighted to share with you our 2025 Year I Phonics and Year 2 phonics re-sit results.

This academic year, all of our Year I and Year 2 re-take children have achieved 100% pass rate! This is due to the great phonics teaching that the children receive on a daily basis. A huge well done to Mrs Masi (Phonics Lead), Mrs Absolom and Mrs Garwell who teach daily phonics lessons.



Well done to Year 4 who completed their online multiplication tables check. The children had 25 questions to answer under timed conditions. Our average score was 20 and we were in the top performing schools in the DEMAT Trust. Well done to

Mrs Bramley, Mrs Absolom and Mrs Garwell for teaching the children maths and helping them to prepare for the test.



The Year 6 SATS results are still unvalidated until September 2025, but the initial outcomes look as though they will be the following for the children who attend our school daily: Reading: 60% at the expected standard, Writing: 63% at the

expected standard, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling: 60% at the expected standard and Maths: 53% at the expected standard. We also have four children who achieved Greater Depth for reading and one child who achieved Greater Depth for grammar, punctuation and spelling. This is very good progress, since when I joined the school in January 2025, only 20% of children were on track to achieve the expected standard for reading, writing, grammar, punctuation and spelling and no children were on track to get maths. Well done to Miss Roberts (Deputy Head/ Yr5&6 teacher) and all of the Year 6 pupils for their hard work this academic year.

# Sports Day 2025

It was lovely to see so many Farcet family members join us for Sports Day 2025. Thank you for pre-booking your place to attend Sports Day this year, since this meant that we could ensure the safety of all of the children.

We hope that you enjoyed watching your child/children take part in the sporting House activities and the races, plus the family picnic too.

Well done to Willow House who were the overall sports day winners for 2025.

A big thank you to Mrs Masi (EYFS Reception Teacher/PE Lead) who arranged all of the sporting activities, our Premier sports coaches for setting up and leading the penalty shootout activity and Mr Brumby (Premises Manager) for setting up and tidying up on the day.



# Timetables for 2025-2026

This academic year, we have made some positive changes to the school timetable. Firstly, we have ensured that all children across the school are having their English and maths lessons at the same time. This will help Miss Roberts (Deputy Head) and myself monitor standards across the school, since we want to achieve even better outcomes during next academic year.

Secondly, we have added a specific spelling lesson from Year I-Year 6. This lesson will be 15 minutes long and will focus upon specific Sounds Write (our phonics scheme) spellings to be learnt. We want to ensure that our children are super spellers by the time that they leave our school.

During the 2025-26 academic year, our lunchtimes will run from 12.30-1.20pm. We will be gaining children's feedback regarding the changes to lunchtime.

In addition, we are also going to split the English lesson time into daily reading lessons and daily writing lessons. This is so that teachers can focus upon explicitly teaching the knowledge and skills required to teach both subjects. We anticipate that this will continue to improve the children's academic outcomes next year.

# SENCO Changes for 2025-26

I am delighted to inform you that as of September 2025, Miss Roberts (Deputy Head/DSL) will be our new SENCO. Miss Roberts will work alongside Mrs Baig, who is our current SENCO in a joint SENCO role. Miss Roberts has nearly completed her SENCO training and will be supported in her new role by Mrs Baig and the DEMAT SEND team. This will mean that families who have SEN children at our school can have regular communication with our SENCOs, which will aid your child's progress. Miss Roberts and Mrs Baig are also planning monthly SEN parent talks, which I would encourage you to attend. Each monthly talk will have a different focus. Dates and times for the SEN monthly talks will be shared with you in September 2025.

For September 2025, I am pleased to inform you that we will be providing additional clubs after school to support the children's interests and talents outside of the school day. More information will be sent to you in September.


