- Providing no-cost sterilization and veterinary care to the impoverished indigenous people in the areas surrounding Cotacachi, Ecuador.
- Creating cultural change regarding animal welfare with education, outreach, and relationship around the responsibility of ownership of animals in Ecuador.

This brings us to looking forward to 2023. Our financial support from 2 major grantors over the last 3 years have informed us that they will be focusing on other countries going forward, not in South America. This, of course, presents a major setback to our operating plans and budget requirements and large-scale sterilization efforts that we had planned in the indigenous villages surrounding Cotacachi as well as maintaining our robust street dog program. We are currently working on international grant funding, creating new donation and support programs, and developing a new fundraising strategy to help us reach our goals and keep our foundation sustainable.





ANNUAL STATISTICS

What an extraordinary year Amici Cannis has had! In 2022 Amici Cannis Animal Hospital, with funding from Amici Cannis USA, attended 4,874 patient visits that came from the town of Cotacachi as well as from 22 outlying villages. Many of these animals belonged to impoverished indigenous families that were unable to pay, and the bulk of the dogs and cats were simply unowned and yet needed medical care. Sterilization is the primary pathway to reducing and maintaining the population of street dogs and cats. Amici Cannis sterilized 1,575 animals in the year of 2022. This amounted to \$70,000 in services, medical products and medicines that was simply given away.

FOUNDING STORY

Ecuador suffers tremendously, throughout the country, from severe pet overpopulation, with a free roaming dog and cat problem, a lack of resources for sterilization campaigns, and a culture that lacks knowledge in the values of animal welfare. Our developing country has a significant need for investment in animal welfare projects that focus on the values of sterilization, vaccination, veterinary care, and the human-animal bond. In 2011 the Ecuadorian-based Fundación Amici Cannis was created and registered for the purpose of funding Trap-Neuter-Release (TNR) campaigns to combat the severe free-roaming dog and cat overpopulation problem.

In 2015, Amici Cannis USA, a 501c3, was formed as an umbrella organization to raise funds for the Fundación Amici Cannis. Amici Cannis ran larger sterilization campaigns in Cotacachi, paying local veterinarians to perform the procedures. In 2016, Amici Cannis opened a brick-and-mortar hospital in Cotacachi, the main town in the predominantly indigenous canton of Cotacachi, Ecuador. Collectively, today, Foundation Amici Cannis, has the goal to fulfill the need of these welfare projects in Cotacachi and the surrounding Indigenous villages.











Income and Expenses 2020-2022

Amici Cannis has been tremendously grateful for the support we have received over the last several years with Dogs Trust Worldwide!

A true partner for Amici Cannis that has allowed us to achieve tremendous impact for our Community Dog Program. In 2022, DTW provided us a grant to sterilize 400 dogs with our TNR program for this suffering, free roaming dog population in the town of Cotacachi. The grant also allow us to treat these community dogs for all their veterinary needs. We successfully provided 373 patient visits with a total of \$25,000 in veterinary services. It was amazing to be able to provide the same level of care to our community dogs that we would provide to any beloved pet with an owner. We successfully stabilized this population of dogs, and our census reflects this.

We are seeking funding to continue to maintain this population of community dogs for excellent quality of life, health and keep our numbers stable. Thank you Dogs Trust Worldwide for your trust in Amici Cannis and such a wonderful partnership over the years!
