A CLASSIC RED RIVER FIGHT

The Goldeyes return to Newman Outdoor Field, this time for Game 1 of the 2026 West Division Series. A pair of aces open the deck, right-hander Kyle Crigger takes the ball for the RedHawks. Big Fish Landen Bourassa takes the ball for the Goldeyes on the road. Winnipeg won the season series taking 7 of the five games. The Goldeyes dropped the first meeting of the season, then responded by taking the next three series.

A PAIR OF SWINGING SLUGGERS

The Goldeyes will lean on the big bats of Max Murphy, Ray-Patrick Didder, and Adam Hall to ride as run producers. The RedHawks will generate production around Jose Sermo, Dillon Thomas and Trip Clark to get their offense going. Both ballclubs finish 2nd and 3rd in average, 2nd and 4th in runs scored. The big difference, Fargo has the edge in Slug and OPS.

HISTORY IN KANSAS CITY

The Goldeyes swept Kansas City for the first time in over 18 years. Back on June 3-June 5 of 2008, the Goldeyes who were led by manager Rick Forney went into CommunityAmerica Ballpark and swept the Kansas City T-Bones in three games. Back in 2008, those scores were won by the Goldeyes 8-4, 20-11, 12-2. In 2026 18 years later, the Goldeyes swept by a line of 11-9, 3-1, and 2-1. Winning all by a combined total of four runs.

Later in the season, he was traded to Chihuahua and made two starts and pitched in the bullpen for three more.

Along with Max Murphy, Bourassa is the 2nd longest consecutive tenrured Winnipeg Goldeye, joining the team in the middle of the 2021 season.
