PASTOR'S COLUMN:

A few weeks ago, I came across a statement that stopped me in my tracks. It read: ***"When God put a calling on your life, He already factored in your stupidity."*** I burst out laughing, but then I felt strangely comforted. There was something freeing about the honesty of it. God's call, apparently, does not depend on my competence, clarity, or flawless judgment. I realized I've also been carrying another phrase with me, one I return to when life feels especially hard: ***"I wish God didn't have so much confidence in me."*** I don't say it out of disbelief or resentment. I say it when things feel heavy, when the effort of simply showing up takes more than I expected.

I've learned that humor, especially self-deprecating humor, helps me keep my balance. It doesn't make light of the call, but it keeps me from being overwhelmed by it. It gives me just enough space to ask a more honest question: Where might God be inviting me to grow, not by doing more, but by seeing things differently?

That question brings me to today's reading from Isaiah, where God says, "It is too little..." Too little to stay within what is familiar or manageable. Too little to measure life only by what we can see or control. God's vision is wider than that.

I don't hear this as God demanding more effort or higher achievement. I hear it as God seeing more possibility than we often allow ourselves to see. The invitation is not to strive harder, but to ***trust that God's imagination for our lives exceeds our own.***

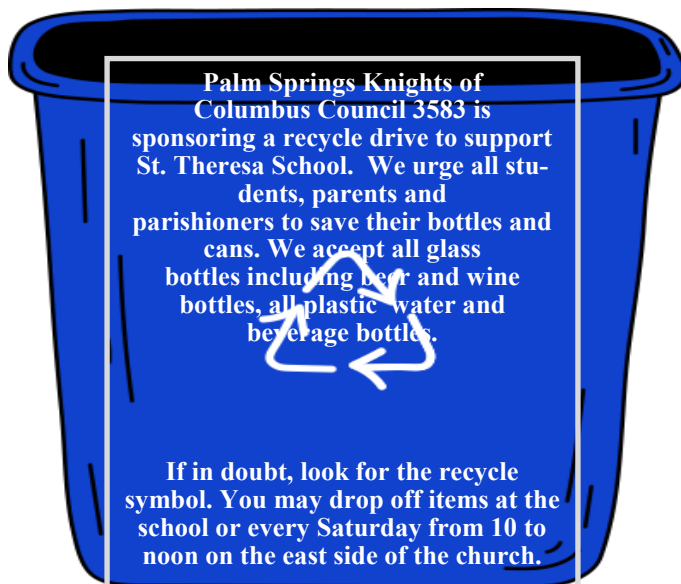

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR :

Hace unas semanas, me topé con una frase que me dejó perpleja. Decía: "Cuando Dios te encomendó una misión, ya tuvo en cuenta tu estupidez". Me eché a reír, pero luego sentí un extraño consuelo. Había algo liberador en su honestidad. La llamada de Dios, al parecer, no depende de mi competencia, mi lucidez ni mi juicio impecable.

Me di cuenta de que también he estado llevando conmigo otra frase, a la que recurro cuando la vida se pone especialmente difícil: "Ojalá Dios no tuviera tanta confianza en mí". No lo digo por incredulidad ni resentimiento. Lo digo cuando las cosas se ponen difíciles, cuando el simple hecho de estar presente requiere más esfuerzo del que esperaba.

He aprendido que el humor, especialmente el humor autocrítico, me ayuda a mantener el equilibrio. No minimiza la situación, pero evita que me abrume. Me da el espacio suficiente para hacerme una pregunta más sincera: ¿A dónde me está invitando Dios a crecer, no haciendo más, sino viendo las cosas de manera diferente?

Esa pregunta me lleva a la lectura de hoy del libro de Isaías, donde Dios dice: «Es demasiado poco...» Demasiado poco para limitarse a lo familiar o a lo que está a nuestro alcance.

Demasiado poco para medir la vida solo por lo que podemos ver o controlar. La visión de Dios es mucho más amplia que eso.

No interpreto esto como una exigencia de Dios para que nos esforcemos más o alcancemos mayores logros. Lo interpreto como que Dios ve en nosotros más potencial del que solemos reconocer. La invitación no es a esforzarnos más, sino a confiar en que la visión que Dios tiene para nuestras vidas supera la nuestra.

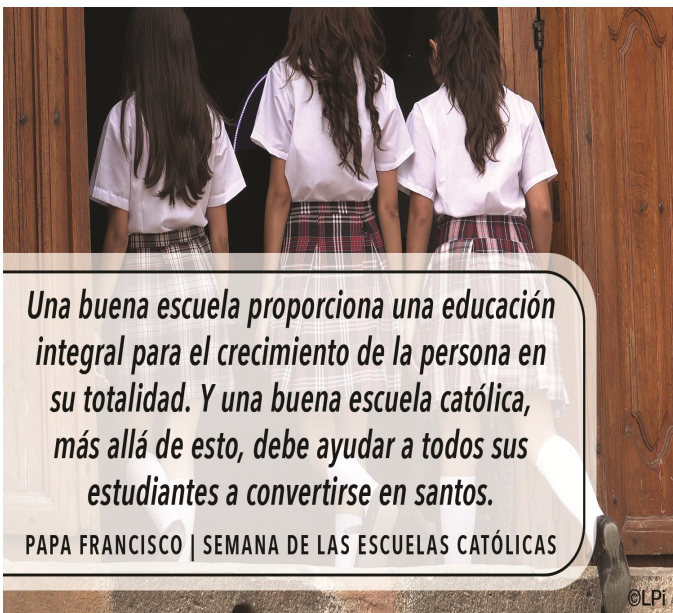

**Saint Theresa Parish
Year to Date Statement of Income and Expenses
For the Five Months Ended November 30, 2025**

The first five months of our fiscal year showed a net loss from operations of \$22,963. This was favorable to budget by \$47,008 for two primary reasons. First, we had a one-time income item of \$13,213 which was the Federal Employee Retention Credit payment for the employee positions maintained during the Covid Epidemic. Second, payroll expenses were favorable to budget because we were not fully staffed for July through October. The remaining seven months of December through June are projected to produce an approximate total operating net income of \$33,000. We expect to have an operating net income for the twelve months of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026 of approximately \$10,000 primarily because of the two one-time items listed above.

By the end of January, we will be producing a monthly accounting of the restricted revenue received from the activities of the 135 Ministry and the Columbarium Niche sales. We will report major repair and replacement expenditures paid for with these restricted revenues. We will also be reporting anticipated future major repairs and replacements. We know that we have over \$2,700,000 in anticipated major repairs and replacements in the next fifteen years. We need the Columbarium to start producing a steady cash flow, augmented by the 135 Ministry's efforts, in order to have the funds available to cover these anticipated expenditures.

In the first five months of this fiscal year, we have spent \$75,084 on two major repair items. These were reroofing of the Parish Hall and the HVAC units in the youth room of the main church building. Before the end of the current fiscal year we expect to have repaired the exposed wood beams, originally estimated at \$150,000 but perhaps costing more.

Qualified Charitable Distributions / IRA Rollover

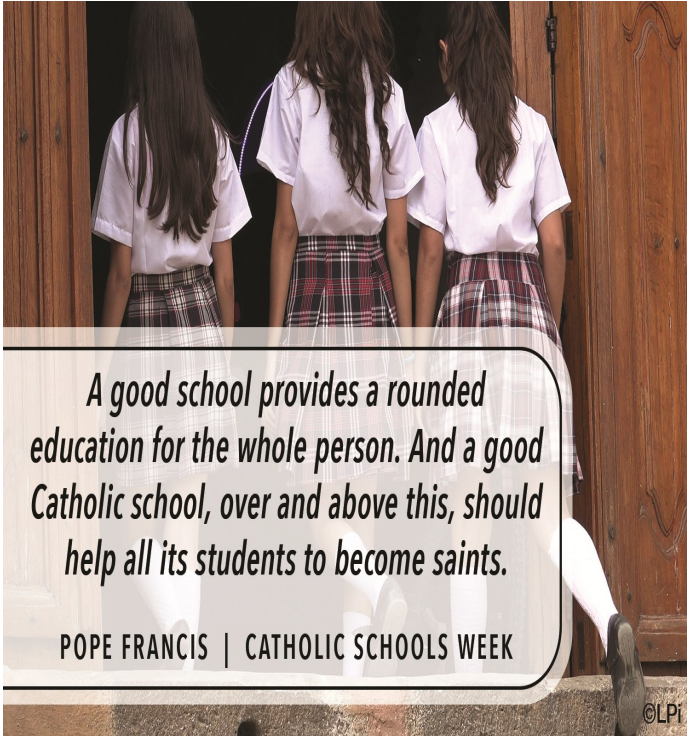
You can make a donation to the Parish directly from your IRA. This type of donation is known as a "qualified charitable distribution". This allows individuals age 70 and ½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to directly transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRA to the Parish, tax free. If you are age 73 or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. Please contact your income tax professional.

TIME FOR YEAR- END TAX PLANNING

In December 2015, Congress passed a law Permitting individuals to give stock out of their Individual Retirement Accounts, (IRA) directly to a charity. Gifts of this types are called Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). You may instruct your IRA custodian to transfer stock directly to a Charity like St. Theresa, however you must be 70 1/2 years of age or older to do so. By making this type of distribution, you avoid paying capital gains taxes on the sale of stock, if the stock is directly transferred. You get a deduction for your distribution. For additional information, you should speak with your accountant, attorney, or Financial Advisor.

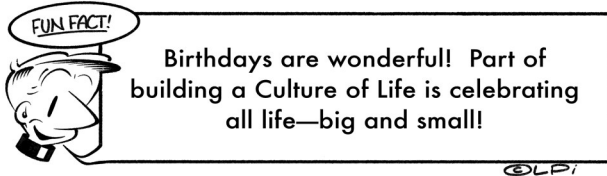
