

**PASTOR'S COLUMN:**

Matthew's gospel was written for a community of Jewish converts, it is not surprising that this gospel includes teaching concerning the attitude of Jesus to the traditions of old Israel. Understanding this teaching is important for Christians of later generations if we are to understand how we, as the new people of God, are related to the old Israel, and how we should understand the scriptures of the Old Testament. During his earthly life, Jesus was a faithful observer of Old Testament customs – though he was critical of the narrow interpretation given them by the leaders of the Jewish people.

Clearly, the challenge he brought to the scribes and Pharisees led to confrontations in which he made it clear that he did not seek an abolition of the traditions of old Israel: his words, 'not one dot, one little stroke, shall disappear from the Law' were spoken, no doubt, in such a debate. But the words which follow – 'until its purpose is achieved' – help us to understand what he meant when he declared, 'I have not come to abolish the Law and the prophets (i.e. the Old Testament scriptures and the traditions they fostered), but to complete them'.

The Old Testament gave witness to the eternal truth of God and God's designs for humanity, but it was only a witness in hints and shadows, giving rise to boundless expectations concerning the future. These expectations were fulfilled in Jesus Christ; but as Paul tells us in the second reading, this fulfilment was to be a stumbling block to those whose hopes were shaped by expectations of an earthly triumph of God's people. The New Law, that 'completes' and 'achieves the purpose' of the Old Testament's hints and shadows, must, of course, be promulgated by the divine Lawgiver himself. Jesus intimates this in the remarkable series of instructions he gives to his followers. Referring to the divine commands of the Old Law ('you have learnt how it was said to our ancestors') he goes on to declare, as a Lawgiver of the same authority, 'But I say this to you'. The first Christians loved the Old Testament – its hints and shadows gave them a fuller understanding of what God did for the world in Christ.

**COLUMNA DEL PASTOR:**

El Evangelio de Mateo fue escrito para una comunidad de judíos conversos, por lo que no sorprende que incluya enseñanzas sobre la actitud de Jesús hacia las tradiciones del antiguo Israel. Comprender esta enseñanza es importante para los cristianos de generaciones posteriores si queremos comprender cómo nosotros, como el nuevo pueblo de Dios, nos relacionamos con el antiguo Israel y cómo debemos entender las Escrituras del Antiguo Testamento. Durante su vida terrenal, Jesús fue un fiel observador de las costumbres del Antiguo Testamento, aunque criticó la interpretación limitada que les daban los líderes del pueblo judío.

Claramente, el desafío que planteó a los escribas y fariseos condujo a enfrentamientos en los que dejó claro que no buscaba la abolición de las tradiciones del antiguo Israel: sus palabras, «ni una tilde, ni una pincelada, desaparecerá de la Ley», fueron pronunciadas, sin duda, en dicho debate. Pero las palabras que siguen —«hasta que se cumpla su propósito»— nos ayudan a comprender lo que quiso decir cuando declaró: «No he venido a abolir la Ley ni a los profetas (es decir, las Escrituras del Antiguo Testamento y las tradiciones que fomentaron), sino a completarlos».

El Antiguo Testamento dio testimonio de la verdad eterna de Dios y de sus designios para la humanidad, pero fue solo un testimonio en indicios y sombras, dando lugar a expectativas ilimitadas sobre el futuro. Estas expectativas se cumplieron en Jesucristo; pero como nos dice Pablo en la segunda lectura, este cumplimiento sería un obstáculo para aquellos cuyas esperanzas se basaban en la expectativa de un triunfo terrenal del pueblo de Dios.

La Nueva Ley, que «completa» y «alcanza el propósito» de los indicios y sombras del Antiguo Testamento, debe, por supuesto, ser promulgada por el mismo Legislador divino. Jesús lo insinúa en la notable serie de instrucciones que da a sus seguidores. Refiriéndose a los mandatos divinos de la Antigua Ley («habéis aprendido cómo se dijo a nuestros antepasados»), continúa declarando, como Legislador con la misma autoridad: «Pero yo os digo esto». Los primeros cristianos amaban el Antiguo Testamento; sus indicios y sombras les dieron una comprensión más completa de lo que Dios hizo por el mundo en Cristo.

Year to Date Statement of Operating Income and Expenses  
For the Six Months Ended December 31, 2025**

The month of December shows a net operating income of \$6,614. The first six months ended December 31, 2025 of our fiscal year showed a net loss from operations of \$16,349. This was favorable to budget by \$69,601 for two primary reasons. First, we had a one-time income item of \$13,213 which was the Federal Employee Retention Credit payment for the employee positions maintained during the Covid Pandemic. Second, payroll expenses were favorable to budget because we were not fully staffed for July through October. The remaining six months of January through June are projected to produce an approximate total operating net income of \$27,000. We expect to have an operating net income for the twelve months of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026 of approximately \$10,000.

By the end of February, we will be producing a monthly report of the restricted revenue received from the activities of the 135 Ministry and the Columbarium Niche sales. We will also report major repair and replacement expenditures paid for with these restricted revenues. We will also be reporting anticipated future major repairs and replacements. We know that we have over \$1,000,000 in anticipated major repairs and replacements in the next five years and approximately \$2,700,000 over the next 12 years. We need the Columbarium to start producing a steady cash flow, augmented by the 135 Ministry's efforts, in order to have the funds available to cover these anticipated expenditures.

In the first six months of this fiscal year, we have spent \$75,084 on two major repair items. These were reroofing of the Parish Hall and the HVAC units replaced in the youth room of the main church building. Before the end of the current fiscal year we expect to have repaired the exposed wood beams, originally estimated at \$150,000 but perhaps costing more.

**Qualified Charitable Distributions / IRA Rollover**

You can make a donation to the Parish directly from your IRA. This type of donation is known as a "qualified charitable distribution". This allows individuals age 70 and ½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to directly transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRA to the Parish, tax free. If you are age 73 or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. Please contact your income tax professional.

**Donor Advised Funds**

Donor Advised Funds are the fastest growing giving method and tax efficient way to manage charitable donations. Donor Advised Funds allow donors to make a charitable contribution, receive an immediate income tax deduction, and then recommend grants from the fund over time. 
