

**PASTOR'S COLUMN:**

The fact that Jesus takes his more intimate disciples to the top of this nameless mountain alerts us to the deeply personal nature of the episode to follow. When they arrive there, the appearance of Jesus suddenly changes. He is radiant with a light whose source is not identified. When Matthew notes that the face of Jesus "shone like the sun," he wants us to recall how Moses came down from Mt. Sinai with radiant face after having spoken with God (Exodus 34:29). Matthew considers Jesus to be the new Moses who brings a new revelation from God.

It is likely that this illumination derives from within Jesus who, for the first time, comes to a full realization that God wants him to save the world, not by feats of power or by killing Roman soldiers (the human way), but by loving and therefore suffering and dying (the divine way). This would be then an ecstatic moment of discovery as Jesus becomes fully aware of the true nature of his messianic mission.

If that is so, it is entirely appropriate that Moses and Elijah should join him there, for they too had met God on a mountaintop and received a revelation that illumined their futures. The face of Moses glistened from the divine encounter on Mt. Sinai and Elijah outran the chariot of Ahab after meeting God on Mt. Carmel (1 Kings 18:46). Peter knows that he is in the presence of God and makes a generous but unnecessary offer to build tents for the others. Finally, when the voice of God is heard, the baptismal affirmation is repeated and significant new words are added: "Listen to him." This tells us that Jesus is now ready to teach the ultimate divine wisdom of salvation through loving and self-giving.

**COLUMNA DEL PASTOR :**

El hecho de que Jesús lleve a sus discípulos más íntimos a la cima de esta montaña sin nombre nos alerta sobre la profunda naturaleza personal del episodio que sigue. Al llegar allí, la apariencia de Jesús cambia repentinamente. Resplandece con una luz cuya fuente se desconoce. Cuando Mateo señala que el rostro de Jesús «resplandece como el sol», quiere que recordemos cómo Moisés bajó del monte Sinaí con el rostro radiante tras haber hablado con Dios (Éxodo 34:29). Mateo considera a Jesús como el nuevo Moisés que trae una nueva revelación de Dios.

Es probable que esta iluminación provenga del interior de Jesús, quien, por primera vez, llega a comprender plenamente que Dios quiere que salve al mundo, no mediante proezas de poder ni matando soldados romanos (la forma humana), sino amando y, por lo tanto, sufriendo y muriendo (la forma divina). Este sería entonces un momento extático de descubrimiento, pues Jesús adquiere plena conciencia de la verdadera naturaleza de su misión mesiánica.

Si es así, es totalmente apropiado que Moisés y Elías se unieran a él allí, pues ellos también habían puesto a Dios en la cima de una montaña y recibieron una revelación que iluminó su futuro. El rostro de Moisés resplandecía tras el encuentro divino en el monte Sinaí, y el de Elías, más allá del carro de Acab, tras encontrarse con Dios en el monte Carmelo (1 Reyes 18:46). Pedro sabe que está en la presencia de Dios y hace una generosa, pero innecesaria, oferta de construir tiendas para los demás. Finalmente, cuando se escucha la voz de Dios, se repite la afirmación bautismal y se añaden nuevas palabras significativas: «Escúchenlo». Esto nos dice que Jesús ahora está listo para enseñar la sabiduría divina suprema de la salvación a través del amor y la entrega.

**Year to Date Statement of Operating Income and Expenses**  
**For the Seven Months Ended January 31, 2026**

The month of January shows a net operating income of \$5,372. The seven months ended January 31, 2026 of our fiscal year showed a net loss from operations of \$10,977. This was favorable to budget by \$57,039 for two primary reasons. First, we had a one-time income item of \$13,213 which was the Federal Employee Retention Credit payment for the employee positions maintained during the Covid Pandemic. Second, payroll expenses were favorable to budget because we were not fully staffed for July through October. The projected bottom line for the Statement of Operating Income and Expense for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026 is a break even.

By the end of March, we will be producing a monthly report of the restricted revenue received from the activities of the 135 Ministry and the Columbarium Niche sales. We will also report major repair and replacement expenditures paid for with these restricted revenues. We will also be reporting anticipated future major repairs and replacements. We know that we have approximately \$900,000 in anticipated major repairs and replacements in the next five years and approximately \$2,700,000 over the next 12 years. We need the Columbarium to start producing a steady cash flow, augmented by the 135 Ministry's efforts, in order to have the funds available to cover these anticipated expenditures. New reserve studies for the Church and School are currently underway by an independent reserve study preparation firm.

In the first six months of this fiscal year, we have spent \$75,084 on two major repair items. These were reroofing of the Parish Hall and the HVAC units replaced in the youth room of the main church building.

**Qualified Charitable Distributions / IRA Rollover**

You can make a donation to the Parish directly from your IRA. This type of donation is known as a "qualified charitable distribution". This allows individuals age 70 and ½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to directly transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRA to the Parish, tax free. If you are age 73 or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. Please contact your income tax professional.

**Donor Advised Funds**

Donor Advised Funds are the fastest growing giving method and tax efficient way to manage charitable donations. Donor Advised Funds allow donors to make a charitable contribution, receive an immediate income tax deduction, and then recommend grants from the fund over time. Please consult with your attorney or tax advisor and take advantage of this exciting new way to managing your charitable contributions.
