PASTOR'S COLUMN:

St. Luke, in the opening passage of the Acts of the Apostles, is the work of a skillful teacher - concerned to help his readers understand the mystery of the Lord's new manner of presence. Luke alone in the New Testament speaks of the Lord's dealing with his disciples as lasting 'forty days' - a round number frequently used in the scriptures; though it may be linked with the fifty days between Passover and the Pentecost celebration of old Israel. It is made clear that this period is a time of preparation and anticipation - the disciples can look forward to 'what the Father promised'; not many days hence they 'will be baptized with the Holy Spirit'. Luke's account is centered in Jerusalem.

Though the divine plan that shaped the Old Testament is being fulfilled, a new era is beginning - shaped, not by false messianic hopes of 'the restoration of the kingdom of Israel', but by the Father's mysterious authority. It is the era of the Church's earthly pilgrimage. The Acts of the Apostles (like a second volume of Luke's gospel) will present the Church as carrying out its mission through the blessings of the Holy Spirit - 'You will be my witnesses to the ends of the earth'.

Luke sketches a graphic word picture for his readers: The Lord is 'lifted up', and a 'cloud' (Old Testament sign of God's presence) takes him from their sight. Perhaps the mystery of the Savior's heavenly exaltation has given rise to this kind of description in some circles. But Luke subtly modifies the crudeness of such a presentation. The two heavenly messengers make it clear that what is taking place is not an event of this world. Their advice to the disciples is not to stare into the sky, but to give themselves to the Church's earthly mission until the Lord returns.

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR:

San Lucas, en el pasaje inicial de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, se revela como la obra de un maestro hábil, preocupado por ayudar a sus lectores a comprender el misterio de la nueva forma de presencia del Señor. Lucas es el único en el Nuevo Testamento que describe la relación del Señor con sus discípulos como un periodo de «cuarenta días» —una cifra redonda utilizada con frecuencia en las Escrituras—, si bien esta podría vincularse con los cincuenta días que transcurrían entre la Pascua y la celebración de Pentecostés en el antiguo Israel. Queda claro que este periodo constituye un tiempo de preparación y expectación: los discípulos pueden aguardar con esperanza «lo que el Padre prometió», pues, dentro de no muchos días, «serán bautizados con el Espíritu Santo». El relato de Lucas se centra en Jerusalén.

Aunque el plan divino que dio forma al Antiguo Testamento se está cumpliendo, comienza una nueva era, modelada no por las falsas esperanzas mesiánicas de «la restauración del reino de Israel», sino por la misteriosa autoridad del Padre. Es la era de la peregrinación terrena de la Iglesia. Los Hechos de los Apóstoles (a modo de segundo volumen del Evangelio de Lucas) presentarán a la Iglesia llevando a cabo su misión mediante las bendiciones del Espíritu Santo: «Seréis mis testigos hasta los confines de la tierra».

Lucas traza un vívido cuadro verbal para sus lectores: el Señor es «elevado», y una «nube» (signo de la presencia de Dios en el Antiguo Testamento) lo sustrae de su vista. Quizás el misterio de la exaltación celestial del Salvador haya dado origen a este tipo de descripción en algunos círculos. Sin embargo, Lucas matiza sutilmente la crudeza de tal representación. Los dos mensajeros celestiales dejan claro que lo que está aconteciendo no es un suceso de este mundo. Su exhortación a los discípulos no consiste en quedarse mirando al cielo, sino en entregarse a la misión terrenal de la Iglesia hasta que el Señor regrese.

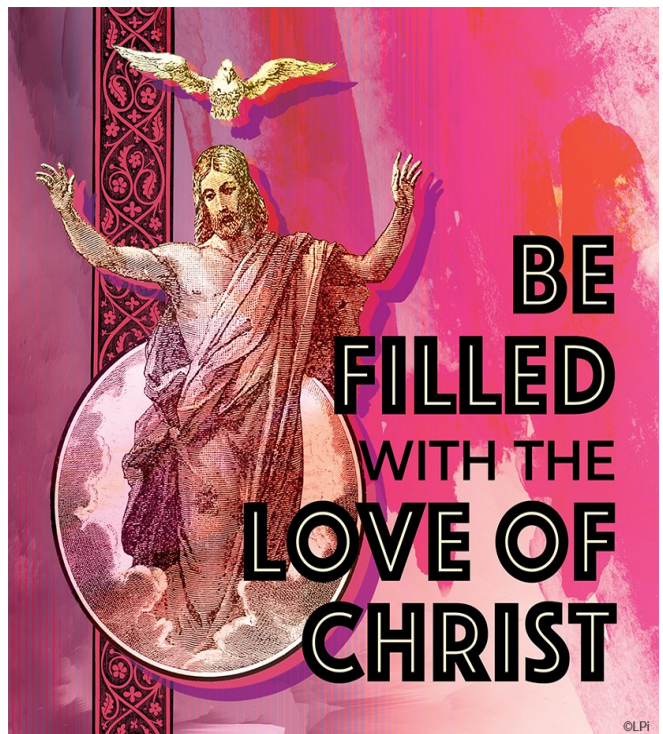
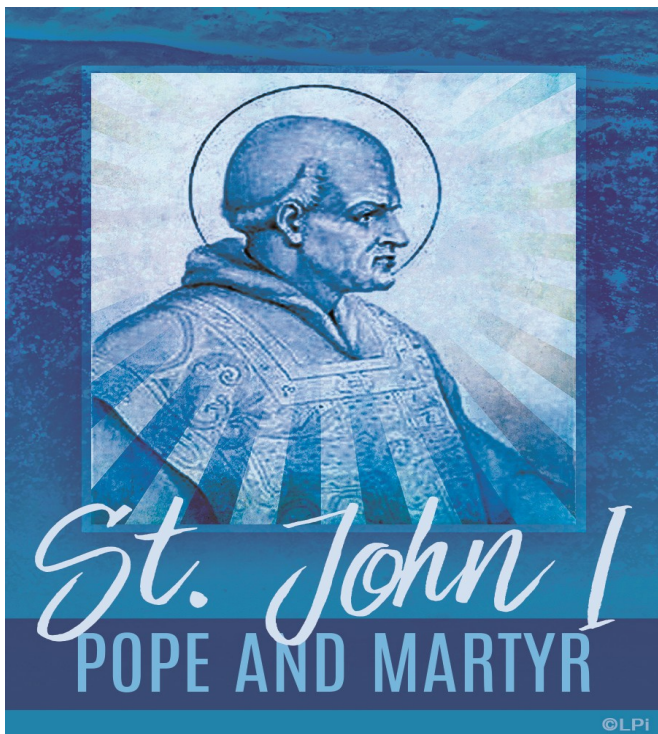

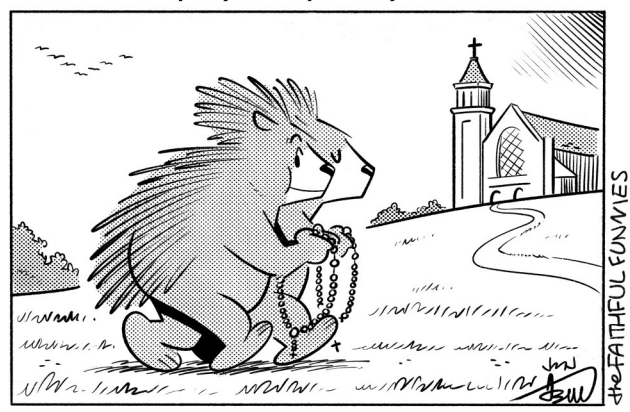
