PASTOR'S COLUMN:

On Sunday, October 19, Pope Leo XIV declared Peter To Rot to be a saint during the Sunday Mass at St. Peter Basilica in Rome. In his ministry he worked closely with the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart.

The martyr, Peter To Rot, born in Papua New Guinea,1912, and at the age of 18 trained to be a catechist and later married. After the Japanese army occupied the country in 1942, they imprisoned the European missionaries and prohibited the evangelizing mission in 1944. When the army legalized polygamy, he quietly but courageously continued to teach catechism, organize prayer, and defend the dignity of marriage, which led to his martyrdom through execution by Japanese soldiers in 1945 during World War II.

"He was not a priest, or a bishop," Archbishop Rochus Tatamai, MSC, articulates. "He was a layman, a father, a husband. That is why his life resonates so deeply. People see in him the possibility of holiness in everyday life."


Pope Francis' said, "this is the saint the Church needs in these times." Peter To Rots' life bridges local culture and universal faith as a catechist.

Peter To Rot's faith was closely linked to his sincere friendship with the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart. This relationship was based on missionary work that today is described as a "shared mission." It was a collaborative effort between religious men and women and the laity of Christian communities.

"The event of canonization will be far more than a Church celebration," Archbishop Tatamai, M.S.C. said. "It will be a blessing for the whole country, reminding us that society itself depends on the strength of families, it's a gift to our country as a national revolutionary that calls us to holiness that begins in the family and extends to the whole society."

"He was known for humility, service to the poor, devotion to prayer, and respect for elders. He challenges every one of us to live lives of service and generosity, To Rot's story offers practical guidance," he explained.

"His canonization is a symbol of hope and resilience for Papua New Guinea."



COLUMNA DEL PASTOR:

El domingo 19 de octubre, el Papa León XIV declaró santo a Pedro To Rot durante la misa dominical en la Basílica de San Pedro en Roma. En su ministerio, colaboró estrechamente con los Misioneros del Sagrado Corazón. El mártir, Pedro To Rot, nació en Papúa Nueva Guinea en 1912, y a los 18 años se formó como catequista y posteriormente se casó. Tras la ocupación del país por el ejército japonés en 1942, encarcelaron a los misioneros europeos y prohibieron la misión evangelizadora en 1944. Cuando el ejército legalizó la poligamia, continuó, discreta pero valientemente, enseñando catecismo, organizando oraciones y defendiendo la dignidad del matrimonio, lo que lo llevó al martirio tras ser ejecutado por soldados japoneses en 1945 durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial. «No era sacerdote ni obispo», afirma el arzobispo Rochus Tatamai, MSC. Era laico, padre y esposo. Por eso su vida resuena tan profundamente. La gente ve en él la posibilidad de la santidad en la vida cotidiana.

El Papa Francisco dijo: «Este es el santo que la Iglesia necesita en estos tiempos». La vida de Peter To Rots conecta la cultura local con la fe universal como categuista.

La fe de Peter To Rot estaba estrechamente ligada a su sincera amistad con los Misioneros del Sagrado Corazón. Esta relación se basaba en una labor misionera que hoy se describe como una «misión compartida». Fue un esfuerzo colaborativo entre religiosos y religiosas y los laicos de las comunidades cristianas.

"El evento de canonización será mucho más que una celebración eclesial", dijo el Arzobispo Tatamai, M.S.C. "Será una bendición para todo el país, recordándonos que la sociedad misma depende de la fuerza de las familias; es un regalo para nuestro país como revolucionario nacional que nos llama a la santidad que comienza en la familia y se extiende a toda la sociedad".

Era conocido por su humildad, su servicio a los pobres, su devoción a la oración y su respeto por los mayores. Nos reta a todos a vivir vidas de servicio y generosidad. La historia de To Rot ofrece una guía práctica, explicó.

"Su canonización es un símbolo de esperanza y resiliencia para Papúa Nueva Guinea".



Saint Theresa Parish Financial Comments – October 1, 2025

The annual Statements of Operating Income and Expenses for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2023, 2024 and 2025 are summarized on the following page. Restricted income received for major repairs and replacement of components of the Parish property is not included in the Operating Revenue. Expenditures for major repairs and replacements of Parish property is not included in the expenses. This is in order to separately track the ongoing daily income and expenses of the Parish. The Parish had operating net income for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023 of \$14,697. The Parish had net operating losses of \$10,659 and \$14,349 respectively, for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2024 and June 30, 2025. Contributions and Donations for the fiscal year ended June 30,205 decreased by \$48,485 (5.8 percent) compared to the prior fiscal year. This is a trend that needs to be addressed this fiscal year.

Also on the following page is a Comparative Statement of Financial Position for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2024 and June 30, 2025. Monthly updates for the current fiscal year will be included in this section of the newly expanded bulletin by the end of October.

The final empty position in the Parish office will be filled before the end of October. We will once again be fully staffed for the upcoming winter season. Bingo on Fridays is anticipated to begin again in November. Proceeds from the Bingo sessions will be donated to Saint Theresa School.

By the end of this month we will be producing a monthly accounting of the restricted revenue received from the activities of the 135 Ministry and the Columbarium Niche sales. We will also report monthly major repair and replacement expenditures paid for with these restricted revenues. We will also be reporting anticipated future major repairs and replacements. We know that we have over two million dollars in anticipated major repairs and replacements in the next three to ten years. We need the Columbarium to start producing a steady cash flow, augmented by the 135 Ministry's efforts, in order to have the funds to cover these anticipated expenditures. Please refer to the new financial information pages in the weekly Parish Bulletins for monthly updates on this activity. We want all Parishioners to be as fully financial informed as possible.

Qualified Charitable Distributions / IRA Rollover

You can make a donation to the Parish directly from your IRA. This type of donation is known as a "qualified charitable distribution". This allows individuals age 70 and ½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to directly transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRA to the Parish, tax free. If you are age 73 or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. Please contact your income tax professional.
