PASTOR'S COLUMN:

How wonderful that first celebration must have been in Rome and throughout the Church when Pope Sylvester I dedicated the Basilica of St. John Lateran in 324. Up to 313 AD Christians had been persecuted. But with the Edict of Milan in 313, Christianity was recognized by the Empire. The Emperor Constantine, prompted by his mother, St. Helena, gave part of his residence, the Lateran Palace, to be used by Miltiades, the Bishop of Rome. Only nine years before in what was truly the lowest point of the Roman Empire, little 12 year old St. Agnes had been paraded through Rome on her way to a horrible place that children shouldn't even know exist, and on her way to martyrdom. But in 313 a great change came. A sign of this change was that Christians now had their own churches, places where they could meet to praise God.

Today's celebration of the Dedication of St. John Lateran reminds us that we are the Church. In the second reading, St. Paul tells the people of Corinth that we are the Temple of God, the Spirit of God dwells in us.

We treasure our relationship with Jesus Christ. We each speak to him throughout our day. But we recognize that our individual relationship with the Lord comes from our communal relationship to Him. We are the community of the Lord. We are the Church. I have had the privilege to visit St. Peters and St. John Lateran in Rome. I have attended Mass in Guadalajara, Mexico and Bangkok, Thailand. Most of all, I had the ability to celebrate mass in numerous States in this country, in large and small, old and new buildings. In Papua New Guinea, buildings with cement floors and corrugated iron roofs were far and few between. Most of the churches where I was were bamboo, palm leaves and dirt floors. But the buildings are not "the church". The people are "the church."

St. John Lateran is the Pope's church. It is the Cathedral of Rome. We celebrate that church on this feast. At its heart, this Feast of the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran helps us remember that we don't celebrate buildings; we celebrate Church.

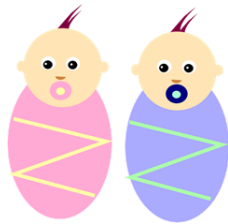

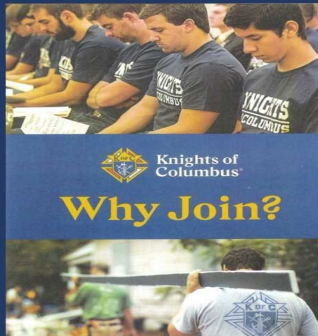

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR :

Qué maravillosa debió ser aquella primera celebración en Roma y en toda la Iglesia cuando el Papa Silvestre I dedicó la Basílica de San Juan de Letrán en el año 324. Hasta el año 313 d. C., los cristianos habían sido perseguidos. Pero con el Edicto de Milán en 313, el cristianismo fue reconocido por el Imperio. El emperador Constantino, a instancias de su madre, Santa Elena, cedió parte de su residencia, el Palacio de Letrán, para que la utilizara Milcíades, obispo de Roma. Tan solo nueve años antes, en lo que fue verdaderamente el punto más bajo del Imperio Romano, la pequeña Santa Inés, de doce años, había sido llevada en procesión por Roma camino a un lugar horrible que ningún niño debería conocer, camino al martirio. Pero en 313 se produjo un gran cambio. Una señal de este cambio fue que los cristianos ahora tenían sus propias iglesias, lugares donde podían reunirse para alabar a Dios.

La celebración de hoy de la Dedicación de San Juan de Letrán nos recuerda que somos la Iglesia. En la segunda lectura, San Pablo les dice a los corintios que somos el templo de Dios y que el Espíritu de Dios habita en nosotros.

Atesoramos nuestra relación con Jesucristo. Cada uno de nosotros le habla a lo largo del día. Pero reconocemos que nuestra relación individual con el Señor proviene de nuestra relación comunitaria con Él. Somos la comunidad del Señor. Somos la Iglesia. He tenido el privilegio de visitar San Pedro y San Juan de Letrán en Roma. He asistido a misa en Guadalajara, México y Bangkok, Tailandia. Sobre todo, he tenido la oportunidad de celebrar misa en numerosos estados de este país, en edificios grandes y pequeños, antiguos y modernos. En Papúa Nueva Guinea, los edificios con pisos de cemento y techos de chapa ondulada eran escasos. La mayoría de las iglesias que visité eran de bambú, hojas de palma y con pisos de tierra. Pero los edificios no son «la iglesia». La gente es «la iglesia».

San Juan de Letrán es la iglesia del Papa. Es la Catedral de Roma. Celebramos esa iglesia en esta fiesta. En esencia, esta Fiesta de la Dedicación de la Basílica de San Juan de Letrán nos ayuda a recordar que no celebramos edificios; celebramos la Iglesia.

Noticias de la Escuela Católica St. Theresa

La última semana de octubre brindó a nuestros estudiantes de secundaria dos experiencias de aprendizaje excepcionales. Como parte de la Semana del Listón Rojo, los estudiantes escucharon mensajes poderosos sobre la importancia de tomar buenas decisiones y comprender el impacto del consumo de drogas. Tuvimos el honor de colaborar con *Desert Oasis Health* para presentar un programa atractivo e informativo sobre el uso responsable de los medicamentos, tanto recetados como no recetados. La presentación fue dirigida por la Dra. Lindsey Valenzuela, madre de familia de St. Theresa, junto con dos exalumnas de St. Theresa, Mia Hodgins y Niamh Kennedy, quienes actualmente trabajan en el Departamento de Salud de la Población y Prescripción de *PHARXM*. Los estudiantes participaron en una sesión interactiva que incluyó un video educativo y una actividad tipo juego diseñada para reforzar la importancia de tomar decisiones saludables y responsables.

La segunda experiencia estuvo relacionada con el *Modernismo de Palm Springs*. Los estudiantes vieron un documental producido por David Wexler, hijo del reconocido arquitecto Donald Wexler, titulado *Donald Wexler – Journeyman Architect*. Esta presentación ofreció a los estudiantes una apreciación más profunda de la historia arquitectónica que da forma a nuestra comunidad. En noviembre, nuestros estudiantes de sexto grado participarán en una excursión para visitar varias de las casas icónicas de Donald Wexler en Palm Springs. Esta experiencia práctica los inspirará y apoyará en la creación de sus propios proyectos estructurales, los cuales se exhibirán con orgullo durante la Semana del Modernismo en febrero.

**Saint Theresa Parish
Year to Date Statement of Income and Expenses
For the Three Months Ended September 30, 2025**

The following page is the Statement of Operating Income and Expenses for the first three months of our fiscal year ending on June 30, 2026. We had a one-time income item of \$13,213 which was the Federal Employee Retention Credit payment for the employee positions maintained during the Covid Epidemic. Contributions and donations had an increase of \$25,495 compared to the budget for the three months. The final empty position in the Parish office was filled on October 23. The first three months of this fiscal year were without this expense. We are now once again fully staffed for the upcoming winter season. Beginning in November we will be producing a monthly accounting of the restricted revenue received from the activities of the 135 Ministry and the Columbarium Niche sales. We will also report monthly major repair and replacement expenditures paid for with these restricted revenues. We will also be reporting anticipated future major repairs and replacements. We know that we have over two million dollars in anticipated major repairs and replacements in the next three to ten years. We need the Columbarium to start producing a steady cash flow, augmented by the 135 Ministry's efforts, in order to have the funds to cover these anticipated expenditures. Please refer to these new financial information pages in the weekly Parish Bulletins for monthly updates on this activity.

Qualified Charitable Distributions / IRA Rollover

You can make a donation to the Parish directly from your IRA. This type of donation is known as a "qualified charitable distribution". This allows individuals age 70 and ½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to directly transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRA to the Parish, tax free. If you are age 73 or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. Please contact your income tax professional.

The final week of October provided our middle school students with two outstanding learning experiences.

As part of **Red Ribbon Week**, students heard powerful messages about making good choices and understanding the impact of drug use. We were honored to partner with **Desert Oasis Health** to present an engaging and informative program on the responsible use of drugs—both prescribed and non-prescribed. The presentation was led by **Dr. Lindsey Valenzuela**, a St. Theresa parent, along with two St. Theresa alumni, **Mia Hodgins** and **Niamh Kennedy**, who both work in the Population Health and Prescription Department at **PHARXM**. Students participated in an interactive session that included an educational video and a fun game activity designed to reinforce the importance of making healthy, responsible decisions.

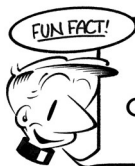
The second experience is connected to **Palm Springs Modernism**. Students viewed a documentary produced by **David Wexler**, son of the renowned architect **Donald Wexler**, titled *Donald Wexler – Journeyman Architect*. This presentation offered students a deeper appreciation of the architectural history that shapes our community. In November, our 6th-grade students will take part in a field trip to visit several of Donald Wexler's iconic homes in Palm Springs. This hands-on experience will inspire and support their own structure projects, which will be proudly displayed during **Modernism Week** in February.
