PASTOR'S COLUMN:

This is edited from a letter from Bishop Alberto Rojas.

In harmony with GIRM 160 and <u>Redemptionis Sacramentum</u>, the normal posture for reception of communion is standing. Communion may be received on the tongue or in the hand. If an individual wishes to receive on the tongue while kneeling, they are not to be instructed otherwise or denied. The manner of reception is determined by the individual receiving and not by those distributing communion, not even the priest or Bishop. Drinking from the chalice, however, is required to be done while standing.

To be implemented on the first Sunday of Advent, 30 November, 2025...

By the authority granted to me as the Diocesan Bishop in GIRM 43, I issue the following norms for the entire Diocese of San Bernardino.

Norm 1: In harmony with the directions from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal section 43, following the Lamb of God, the people of the Diocese will resume kneeling until they stand for the Communion procession, receiving in the manner of their discretion. After having received Communion, the posture of the faithful should reflect an acknowledgment of the sacred mystery which is in their mouths and bodies.

Norm 2: If an individual is unable to kneel because of age or sickness, they are not obligated. These individuals may stand or sit and offer a bow of the head if appropriate.

At the time of Jesus' ministry, the Jewish nation was full of restless expectations – giving rise at times to uprisings seeking to throw off the yoke of Roman occupation. The Jerusalem Temple not only symbolized the nation's life and hopes; it was one of the wonders of the ancient world, filling God's people with joy and pride each time they saw it. The disciples of Jesus would have been shocked, therefore, when Jesus interrupted their buzz of admiration to foretell the Temple's destruction. This prediction was well known - at the trial of Jesus, outrage was expressed that he had spoken of the destruction of the Temple. Today's scholarship sees his dramatic disrupting of the life of the Temple, at this same time, as an act pointing to the end of the era symbolized by the old Temple.

The first Christians tended to link the new era inaugurated by the death and resurrection of Jesus with the end of the world. Some Thessalonians (second reading) had even given themselves to a 'life of idleness', as they await the end! Luke, however, warns against such an outlook; he does not interpret the prediction of Jesus and what follows as referring to the end of the world. Clearly, in today's passage, he warns against interpreting the disasters of human history as signs of the coming the end.

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR:

Este texto es una adaptación de una carta del Obispo Alberto Rojas.

De conformidad con la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR) 160 y la Redemptionis Sacramentum, la postura habitual para recibir la comunión

es de pie. La comunión puede recibirse en la lengua o en la mano. Si alguien desea recibirla en la lengua de rodillas, no se le debe indicar lo contrario ni negárselo. La forma de recibirla la determina quien la recibe y no lo el ministro que lo distribuye, ni siquiera el sacerdote o el obispo. Sin embargo, beber del cáliz debe hacerse de pie.

Para entrar en vigor el primer domingo de Adviento, 30 de noviembre de 2025...

En virtud de la autoridad que me ha sido conferida como Obispo Diocesano en la IGMR 43, promulgo las siguientes normas para toda la Diócesis de San Bernardino.

Norma 1: En armonía con las indicaciones de la Instrucción General del Misal Romano, sección 43, después del Cordero de Dios, los fieles de la Diócesis volverán a arrodillarse hasta ponerse de pie para la procesión de la Comunión, comulgando según su discreción. Tras comulgar, la postura de los fieles debe reflejar un reconocimiento del sagrado misterio que hay en sus bocas y cuerpos.

Norma 2: Si una persona no puede arrodillarse por edad o enfermedad, no está obligada a hacerlo. Estas personas pueden permanecer de pie o sentadas e inclinar la cabeza si lo consideran apropiado.

En tiempos del ministerio de Jesús, la nación judía estaba llena de inquietud y expectativas, lo que a veces provocaba movemientos que buscaban liberarse del yugo de la ocupación romana. El Templo de Jerusalén no solo simbolizaba la vida y las esperanzas de la nación, sino que era una de las maravillas del mundo antiguo, que llenaba al pueblo de Dios de alegría y orgullo cada vez que lo contemplaban. Por lo tanto, los discípulos de Jesús se habrían sorprendido cuando él interrumpió su admiración para predecir la destrucción del Templo. Esta predicción era bien conocida; durante el proceso de corte contra de Jesús, se expresó indignación porque había hablado de la destrucción del Templo. Los estudios bíblicos actuales interpretan su drástica interrupción de la vida del Templo, en ese mismo momento, como un acto que señalaba el fin de la era simbolizada por el antiguo Templo.

Saint Theresa Parish Year to Date Statement of Income and Expenses For the Three Months Ended September 30, 2025

The following page is the Statement of Operating Income and Expenses for the first three months of our fiscal year ending on June 30, 2026. We had a one-time income item of \$13,213 which was the Federal Employee Retention Credit payment for the employee positions maintained during the Covid Epidemic. Contributions and donations had an increase of \$25,495 compared to the budget for the three months. The final empty position in the Parish office was filled on October 23. The first three months of this fiscal year were without this expense. We are now once again fully staffed for the upcoming winter season. Beginning in November we will be producing a monthly accounting of the restricted revenue received from the activities of the 135 Ministry and the Columbarium Niche sales. We will also report monthly major repair and replacement expenditures paid for with these restricted revenues. We will also be reporting anticipated future major repairs and replacements. We know that we have over two million dollars in anticipated major repairs and replacements in the next three to ten years. We need the Columbarium to start producing a steady cash flow, augmented by the 135 Ministry's efforts, in order to have the funds to cover these anticipated expenditures. Please refer to these new financial information pages in the weekly Parish Bulletins for monthly updates on this activity.

Qualified Charitable Distributions / IRA Rollover

You can make a donation to the Parish directly from your IRA. This type of donation is known as a "qualified charitable distribution". This allows individuals age 70 and ½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to directly transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRA to the Parish, tax free. If you are age 73 or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. Please contact your income tax professional.


STEM Identity Day- Friday, November 7
