PASTOR'S COLUMN:

Even though the infancy narratives in Matthew focus on Joseph, Joseph is not quoted. But we still know a great deal about him. We know that he was a righteous man. That meant that he was in the right with God. And we know that Joseph was open to the guidance of God, given to him three different times in dreams. In the first, and most important, he was told not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife. A second dream took place after the birth in Bethlehem. Joseph was told to take the child and his mother and flee to Egypt for the wicked King Herod meant to kill Jesus. After Herod died, and while the Holy Family was in Egypt, Joseph had another dream, this one telling him to return to Palestine, which he did but avoiding Jerusalem.

The most important information we have about Joseph is that Joseph was a righteous man, a just man. A just person puts his or her relationship with God before all else in life and cares for people as God would care for them. In scriptures, someone who is just reflects God's compassion.

The Davidic Messiah, announced to Joseph in his dream, is far more than a liberator from Roman occupation. His name – which means ‘God saves’ – points to his role as the Savior. ‘Saving the people from their sins’, he will fulfil the true destiny of Israel, as the people chosen to bring the whole world to share in God’s final blessings.

Telling of his coming as ‘Emmanuel’ – a name that means ‘God is with us’ – Matthew invites the Jewish people to recognize that the great theme of divine presence, running through the Scriptures, ‘I will be your God; and you will be my people’, has found a realization beyond all their imagining. In fact, Matthew’s gospel will close with the same theme from the mouth of Jesus himself: ‘I am with you always; yes, to the end of time’.

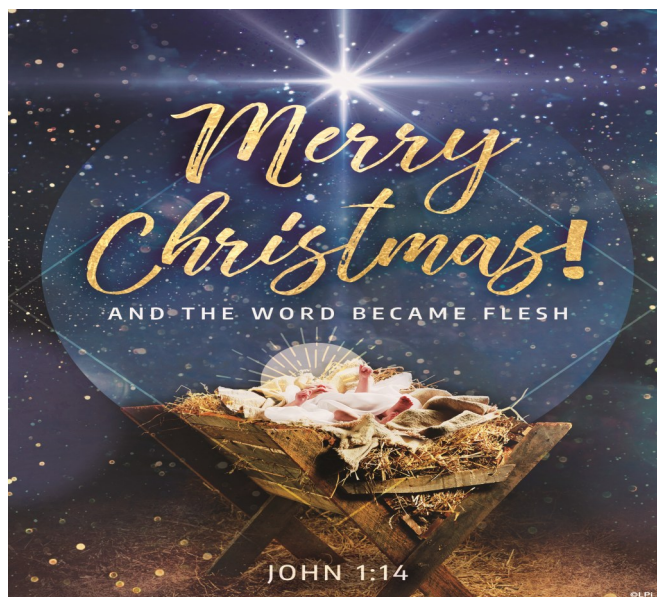

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR :

Aunque los relatos de la infancia en Mateo se centran en José, no se le cita. Aun así, sabemos mucho sobre él. Sabemos que era un hombre justo. Eso significaba que estaba en paz con Dios. Y sabemos que José estaba abierto a la guía de Dios, que le fue dada en tres sueños diferentes. En el primero, y el más importante, se le dijo que no tuviera miedo de tomar a María como su esposa. Un segundo sueño tuvo lugar después del nacimiento en Belén. Se le dijo a José que tomara al niño y a su madre y huyera a Egipto, pues el malvado rey Herodes pretendía matar a Jesús. Tras la muerte de Herodes, y mientras la Sagrada Familia estaba en Egipto, José tuvo otro sueño, este en el que se le indicaba que regresara a Palestina, lo cual hizo, pero evitando Jerusalén.

La información más importante que tenemos sobre José es que era un hombre recto, justo. Una persona justa prioriza su relación con Dios ante todo en la vida y cuida de los demás como Dios lo haría. En las Escrituras, una persona justa refleja la compasión de Dios.

El Mesías davídico, anunciado a José en sueños, es mucho más que un liberador de la ocupación romana. Su nombre, que significa «Dios salva», indica su papel como Salvador. «Salvando al pueblo de sus pecados», cumplirá el verdadero destino de Israel, como el pueblo elegido para que todo el mundo participe de las bendiciones finales de Dios.

Al relatar su venida como «Emmanuel» —nombre que significa «Dios con nosotros»—, Mateo invita al pueblo judío a reconocer que el gran tema de la presencia divina, presente en las Escrituras: «Yo seré vuestro Dios y vosotros seréis mi pueblo», ha encontrado una realización inimaginable. De hecho, el evangelio de Mateo concluye con el mismo tema, pronunciado por el propio Jesús: «Yo estoy con vosotros siempre; sí, hasta el fin del mundo».

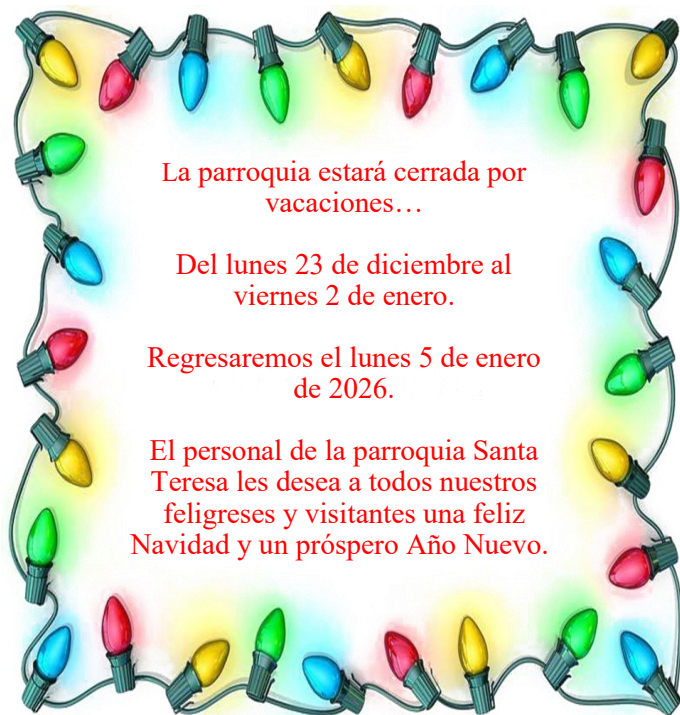

**Saint Theresa Parish
Year to Date Statement of Income and Expenses
For the Four Months Ended October 31, 2025**

The first four months of our fiscal year showed a net loss from operations of \$29,576. This was favorable to budget by \$35,310 for two primary reasons. First, we had a one-time income item of \$13,213 which was the Federal Employee Retention Credit payment for the employee positions maintained during the Covid Epidemic. Second, payroll expenses were favorable to budget by \$43,341 because we were not fully staffed for almost all of these first four months. The remaining eight months of November through June generally produce an approximate total operating net income of \$40,000. We expect to have an operating net income for the twelve months of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026 of approximately \$10,000 because of the two one-time items listed above.

By the end of December, we will be producing an accounting of the restricted revenue received from the activities of the 135 Ministry and the Columbarium Niche sales. We will also report major repair and replacement expenditures paid for with these restricted revenues. We will also be reporting anticipated future major repairs and replacements. We know that we have well over two million dollars in anticipated major repairs and replacements in the next fifteen years. We need the Columbarium to start producing a steady cash flow, augmented by the 135 Ministry's efforts, in order to have the funds available to cover these anticipated expenditures.

In the first four months of this fiscal year, we have spent \$75,084 on two major repair items. These were reroofing of the Parish Hall and the HVAC units in the youth room of the main church building. Before the end of the current fiscal year we expect to have repaired the exposed wood beams, originally estimated at \$150,000 but perhaps costing more.

Qualified Charitable Distributions / IRA Rollover

You can make a donation to the Parish directly from your IRA. This type of donation is known as a "qualified charitable distribution". This allows individuals age 70 and ½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to directly transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRA to the Parish, tax free. If you are age 73 or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. Please contact your income tax professional.

Gifts in a Will or Trust

Making a legacy gift in your will or trust is one of the easiest ways to make a lasting impact for the Parish. Once you have provided for your loved ones, we hope you will consider making a gift to the Parish. Please contact your attorney concerning this in your will or trust.

On the morning of the event, parents took charge of the kitchen while Council members cheerfully served breakfast (and plenty of smiles!) to our delighted students.

Our entire school community came together for a memorable morning that culminated in Christmas karaoke and a lively dance-off. It was a joyful start to the season—and it's sure to become a beloved new school tradition!
