	for each break and the adults on duty encourage the children to use the resources and the larger equipment, including the gym, trim-trail, climbing wall and pirate ship. Adults on duty to lead an active 5 minutes at the start of play time. This could be accessing the equipment, initiating a game or a jog around the playground. Sports and activity leaders have responsibility for gathering opinion and suggestions, assisting the PE leader with organisation and equipment, keeping the equipment tidy and helping with Sports Day and other events such as our Comic Relief fund raising activities. Crew leaders from year 5 will lead a different activity each day during lunch break for children to participate in, on a rota basis. Equipment Maintenance of the fitness equipment for children to use at playtimes daily. Including the trim trail, the playground markings, the climbing wall and the fitness gym. Break time supervisors report a high level of engagement in physical activity during break times. The pirate ship, outside gym, trim trail and climbing wall are well used during each session. Equipment in the activity boxes is also used with enthusiasm during break times.
