The absolution by the Priest follows:

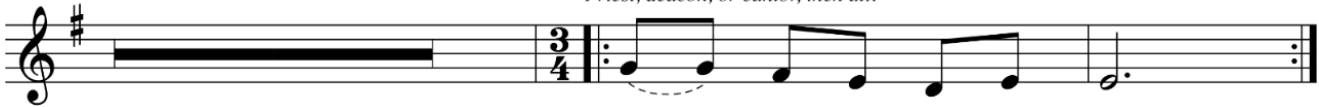

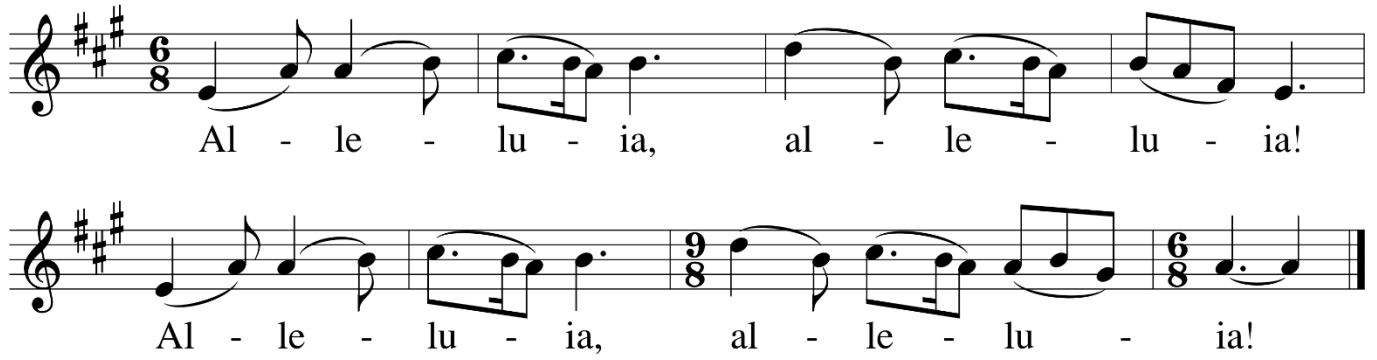

and buy food for themselves.”

and he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass.
Taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven,

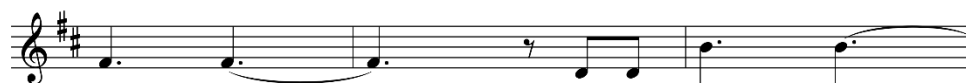

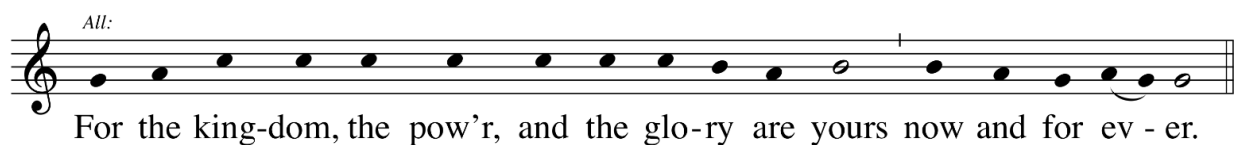

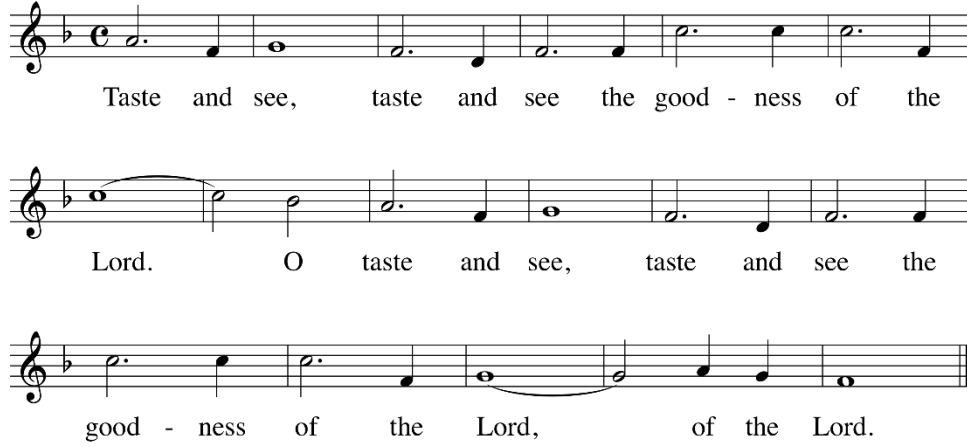
