 to pray for me to the Lord our God.

The absolution by the Priest follows:

and bring us to everlasting life.

Exodus 17: 8-13

In those days, Amalek came and waged war against Israel.

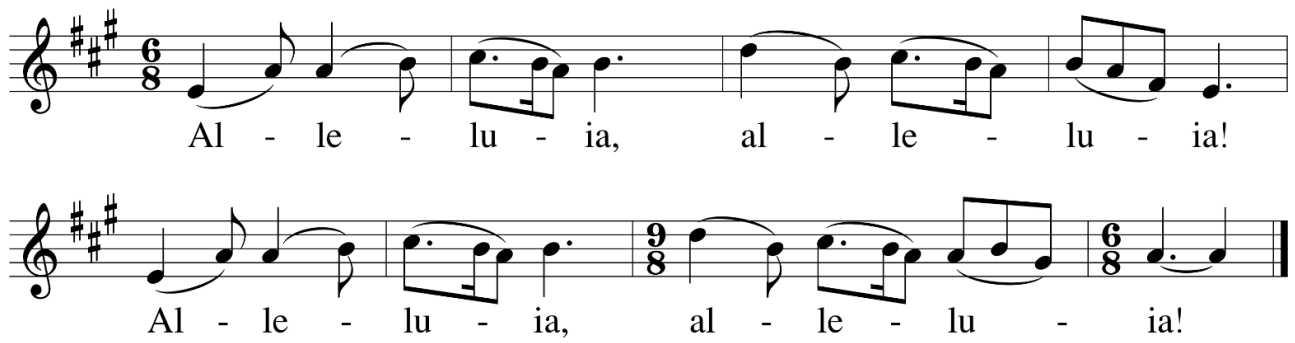
All Scripture is inspired by God

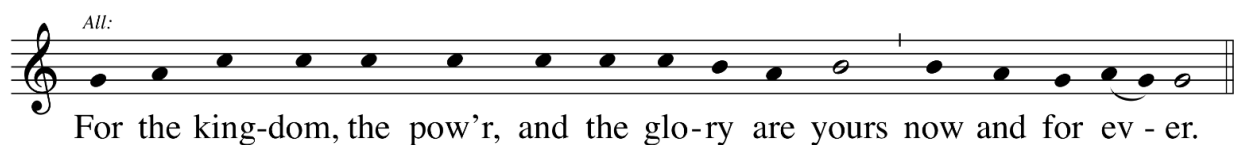

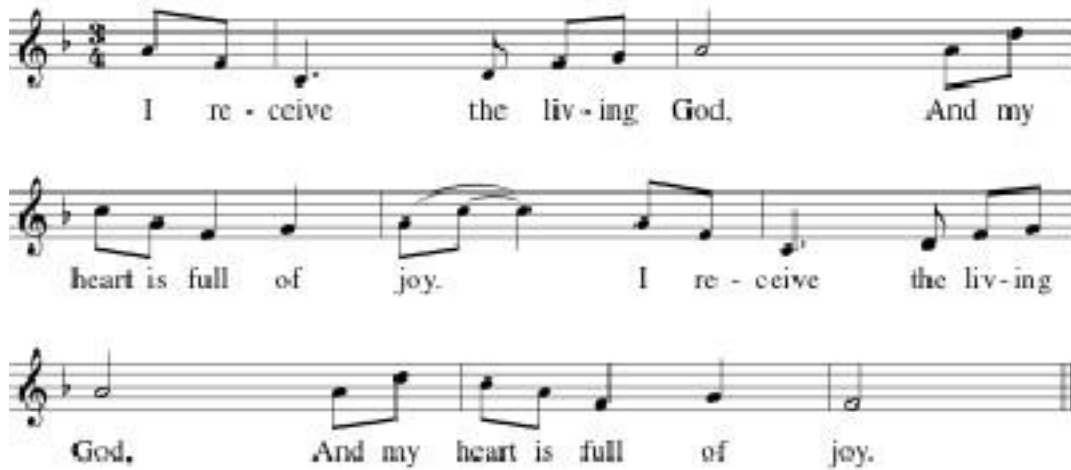

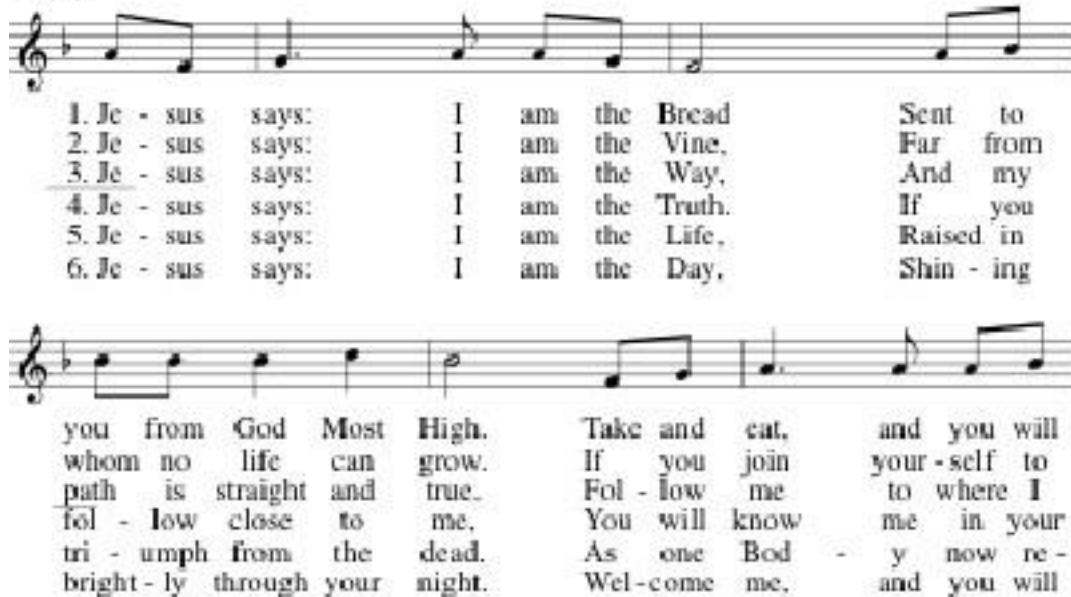
