Some individuals proudly served in the United States Armed Forces. While many veterans choose burial in private cemeteries, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts offers three Veterans' Cemeteries — one National and two State facilities — including the Massachusetts Veterans' Memorial Cemetery in Winchendon.

Interment in a Massachusetts Veterans' Cemetery requires prior approval. If approval has not yet been obtained, the documentation outlined below will be necessary to begin the eligibility process.

In general, a veteran must have served on active duty (other than for basic training only) or completed at least 20 years of service in the National Guard or Reserves. Please note that meeting minimum service requirements does not automatically guarantee approval, as final eligibility is determined by the cemetery administration.

If documentation is not available at the time arrangements are being made, burial may be delayed. Additionally, for military honors at a private cemetery or to apply for a government-issued military grave marker, a DD-214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty), or an equivalent separation document, is required.

Possession of a DD-214 alone does not guarantee eligibility for military honors or a military marker. Final determination is made by the Department of Veterans Affairs based on service history and discharge status.
